

## The readings for today

#### Eothinon 2, Mk 16:1-8

When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James and Salome, bought spices, so that they might go and anoint Jesus. And very early on the first day of the week they went to the tomb when the sun had risen. And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the door of the tomb?" And looking up, they saw that the stone was rolled back—it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe; and they were amazed. And he said to them, "Do not be amazed; you seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen, He is not here; see the place where they laid Him. But go, tell His disciples and Peter that He is going before you to Galilee; there you will see Him, as He told you." And they went out and fled from the tomb, for trembling and astonishment had come upon them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

## Epistle reading from Paul's Letter to the Galatians Gal. 2:16-20

Brethren, you know that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no one be justified. But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again those things which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the law died to the law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

### The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Mark Mk 8:34-38, 9:1

The Lord said: "If anyone wishes to come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? For what can a man give in return for his soul? For whoever is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels." And he said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God come with power."

## FROM FATHER'S SERMON

What is the greatest example of God's love for us? The Cross of our Lord! It is the sign of His perfect, unconditional love towards mankind. In today's reading from the Gospel, He invites us to follow this example of His. He calls us to immitate God's love up to the point of self-sacrifice for the salvation of the world! How can we achieve that? We need to sacrifice our ego! That is the meaning of the Lord's words when he says: *"If anyone wishes to come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me."* (Mk 8:34). When the ego gets in the way of love, it breaks it and when love is broken, sin and lust for all earthly things take place in one's soul. Those earthly wants and needs, drive people with egos to antagonise each other up to the point of elimination. And then what? Then, when one has eliminated his fellow men to satisfy the ego, he gains the whole world. The whole world,, with its earthly pleasures, will be his, but at a highly cost. His immortal soul! Keep this question our Lord poses to all of us, my beloved Christians. Answer it if you can! But above all, ask it yourselves each time you feel your ego gets in the way of your love: *"For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? For what can a man give in return for his soul?* (Mk 8:36).

# **DID YOU KNOW**


that when we Orthodox Christians do the sign of the cross we proclaim in a precise way our faith



in the Holy Trinity and Jesus Christ? The proper singing is made by holding the thumb and first two fingers of the right hand together and pressing the remaining two fingers on the palm. The three fingers together represent the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and the remaining two fingers the dual nature of Christ as God and human. The gesture is done by placing the hand sequentially to the forehead, belly button, and both shoulders from right to left! The forhead symbolises heaven; the belly button, earth; the the two sides, God's justice for those who do good (right) and those

who do evil (left). The symbolism is beautifully explained by st. Kosmas Aitolos in his 3<sup>rd</sup> Teaching:

"Listen, my Brethren, how the sign of the Cross is made and what it means. First, just as the Holy Trinity is glorified in heaven by the angels, so should you join your three fingers of your right hand. And being unable to ascend into heaven to worship, raise your hand to your head (because the head means heaven) and say: "Just as the angels glorify the Holy Trinity in heaven, so do I, as a servant, glorify and worship the Holy Trinity. And as the fingers are three and separate, and are together, so is the Holv Trinity three persons but one God." Lowering your hand to your belly, say: "I worship you and adore you, my Lord, because you condescended and took on flesh in the womb of the Theotokos for my sins." Place [your hand] on your right shoulder and say: "I beg you, my God, to forgive me and to put me on your right with the just." Placing [your hand] again on your left shoulder, say: "I beg you, my Lord, don't put me on the left with the sinners." Then bending down to the ground [say] : "I glorify you, my God; I worship and adore you, for just as you were put into the grave, may I also be." And when you stand up straight, you reveal the resurrection and say: I glorify and worship you, my Lord, for you rose from the dead to grant us eternal life." This is what the Cross means." (Nomikos M. Vaporis, Father Kosmas The Apostle of the Poor, Holy Cross Orthodox Press, Brookline, Massachusetts).


## **PARISH NEWS & ANNOUNCEMENTS**
