The readings for today

Eothinon 3, Mk 16:9-20

When Jesus rose early on the first day of the week, He appeared first to Mary Magdalene, from whom He had cast out seven demons. She went and told those who had been with Him, as they mourned and wept. But when they heard that He was alive and had been seen by her, they would not believe it. After this He appeared in another form to two of them, as they were walking into the country. And they went back and told the rest, but they did not believe them. After this He appeared to the eleven themselves as they sat at table and He upbraided them for their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they had not believed those who saw Him after He had risen. And He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to the whole creation. He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned. And these signs will accompany those who believe: in My name they will cast out demons; they will speak in new tongues; they will pick up serpents, and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not hurt them; they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will recover." So then the Lord Jesus, after He had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God. And they went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the message by the signs that attended it. Amen.

Epistle reading from John's First Universal Letter 1Jn. 4:12-19

No man has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and His love is perfected in us. By this we know that we abide in Him and He in us, because He has given us of His own Spirit. And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world. Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God. So we know and believe the love God has for us. God is love, and he who abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him. In this is love perfected with us, that we may have confidence for the day of judgment, because as He is so are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and he who fears is not perfected in love. We love, because He first loved us.

When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom He loved standing near, He said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" Then He said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home. This is the disciple who is bearing witness to these things, and who has written these things; and we know that his testimony is true. But there are also many other things which Jesus did; were every one of them to be written, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written. Amen.

FROM FATHER'S SERMON

Today our church commemorates the translation of st. John the Evangelist, the beloved disciple of Christ. It was he, who during the Last Supper leaned back on our Lord's chest and asked Him who was to betray Him. Saint John is also called the disciple of love and for a good reason. He was the only one who followed Christ until the very end. While the other disciples fled or denied Him out of fear, saint John the Theologian kept following Christ until His death upon the Cross. That much was his love for Him! An example to all of us who are called to love one another with unconditional love! True love, is a reflection of God's love towards mankind. That is why in today's Epistle reading, which comes from saint John's Universal Letters, it's written: "God is love, and he who abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him". But this kind of love has nothing to do with earthly pleasures. It is a piece of the Divine that has been imparted to all mankind and is perfected when one confesses that "that Jesus is the Son of God". Then "God abides in him, and he in God" and so all of us who confess with a pure heart, abide with one another in the love of God, which is no other than the Chalice of the Holy Communion, given in the Church.

DID YOU KNOW

that the Holy Gospels are four (and not twelve)? Saints Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, each wrote an "Εὐαγγέλιον" (Gospel). The four "εὐαγγέλια" are divided into readings for use in the church services according to the feast or occasion. In additon, every day of the ecclesiastical year has a different reading from the Gospel (and from the Epistles).

What we call "τὰ δώδεκα εὐαγγέλια" (the twelve gospels) for Holy Thursday night, are twelve readings from the four Holy Gospels: five from st. John, four from st. Matthew, two from st. Mark and one from st. Luke.

The greek word "εὐαγγέλιον" means "glad tidings" and refers to the good news of the coming of Christ and the Kingdom of God.
