

Pandemic Puppies

What a really great time to raise a puppy! If we have to stay home or we are working from home, a puppy keeps us company, gives us something to do during our long days and they bring us such joy and comfort.

I just raised a litter born in February 2020 and you may be questioning how we socialize our new puppies when we are "social distancing" ourselves.

Here are some things your puppy will experience at your breeders home the first 8-10 weeks:

Birth to 2 weeks: As soon as the dam is comfortable with the immediate family handling the puppies, we will all do cuddle sessions. I begin Early Neurological Stimulation as soon as the pups are no longer stressed after any vet visits.

- 2 3 weeks: Eyes and ears have opened but we avoid any bright light at this time. I begin touching, stroking and having individual cuddle sessions daily with the pups. We introduce tactile items and/or new experiences everyday. We had close non-family members who we knew were not sick, come to the house to begin in home socialization. We were lucky to have close friends with very small children to introduce to the pups at this time. During this time frame we also begin to work on on sudden sounds and startle recovery.
- 3 4 weeks: This is the week we begin to introduce small, soft treats, tiny soft toys, and obstacles. I will also set up a Bluetooth speaker in the room for some music, we will vacuum and add a blow dryer to begin to get them used to noises. I am still having a few close friends come by to play with the pups.

4 weeks until they go home: Every day now, we are challenging the pups; barrier challenge, teaching puppy call, climbing over low obstacles, outdoor time, teaching the clicker AND beginning to put the pups in a crate (with raw meaty bones) in the car. I would always wear a mask and I took the pups to feed stores, Lowe's, Home Depot, the park. I would ask that people not touch the pups and would steer away from people not wearing masks.

I was lucky enough to have friends with litters or singleton pups who would bring their pups over to play. We could stay outside and practice social distancing. It takes a little more time and effort to set up proper scenarios for socializing during this pandemic, but is well worth the effort.

Once you have your puppy at home, try to set up play dates using "social distancing" with other new puppy owners. Classes are starting back up in some states, so look for puppy classes with instructors who will be following the Covid-19 guidelines for gatherings as set up by the state's governor.
