The sayings of Mrs Nagle

FEW people have achieved more success in breeding livestock than Florence Nagle who died last year in her 90s. Not only in dogs (the outstanding strain of Wolfhounds and a great line of field trial Irish Setters), but in racehorses and other animals too. She was always prepared to pass on her experience to those willing to listen. ZENA THORN-ANDREWS, much of whose success as a Wolfhound breeder is based on Mrs Nagle's advice and bloodlines, collected some of her 'gems' which we are pleased to feature here and in future issues.



- Determine for yourself what is right.
- Judges care more for future judging appointments than for doing what is right.
- *There is no law and order solely because there is no discipline.*
- An honest scrubberwoman is better than a lazy Cambridge graduate.
- Always breed for what you think is proper, ignoring bad advice.
- *You must sometimes take chances in order to move forward.*
- No one wants to work anymore.
- **My dogs eat whatever they are given.**
- *I never feed additives to my dogs.*
- I never measure how much my dogs eat.
- **I never measure my dogs.**
- *The only cup I never won and never want to is the Irish Wolfhound height cup.*
- People turn potty when their bitch is whelping.
- **Let nature take its course in breeding and rearing puppies.**
- *Don't worry if your bitch is plain as long as she is sound.*
- Look at the whole dog. Don't nit-pick.
- **Quality is a good thing to have but not to excess.**
- *Everytime you outcross to get a good point, you bring in something bad.*
- I can get a head in one mating but hindquarters and fronts take generations — guard them with your life once you have them.
- **People have no understanding of the importance of hindquarters.**
- *Most people do not know Wolfhounds have to have a second thigh.*
- Without correct hindquarters a dog will not have power.
- **Conforming to the breed Standard is everything.**
- *Breeding is an art, not a science.*
- You either have an eye for a dog or not.
- **I am a stockwoman and proud of it.**
- *Good movement in a dog is a gift.*
- I have only bred five or six great hounds in 60-odd years.
- **Some hounds are what I call "steamroller" dogs, they look great from the side but have two legs coming out of one hole in front and back.**
- *They have put us all in battery boxes today.*
- I breed for myself, not the pet market.
- **People who write good books often breed terrible Wolfhounds.**
- *People who write well, very often are terrible judges.*
- Knowing statistics and the names of the bones does not make a dog breeder.
- **Computers can't make a good dog.**
- *Inbreeding is good, when done properly.*
- Most people who inbreed haven't a clue what they are up to.
