* From the current club rules:

"Approved and Revised: March 2018 CKC Standing Rules.

- 5. Only Active members are eligible for the following:
 - A. A plaque awarded by the club at the Awards dinner commemorating the first title won by the owner's dog. (Multiple plaques can be won by an owner, but only one is awarded per dog.)
 - Subsequent titles/accomplishments for that dog(s) will be recognized by plates that are meant to be attached to the original plaque.
 - 2). Note: "non-active" members will receive recognition for their dogs' titles/accomplishments in the form of a Certificate awarded by CKC.
- 4. Members will be considered "Active" members if they meet the following criteria:
 - A. They must be considered a "member in good standing" (i.e., dues are up-to-date and no additional money owed to the club)
 - B. A minimum of 5 meetings must have been attended during the calendar year unless they have an "excused" absence, such as work, out of town, weather or illness. Notify Recording Secretary of excused absences.
 - C. They must have actively served on at least one committee during the year. "

Kids' Corner

Be sure to review the content of the books before purchase and use.

<u>A Solstice Tail</u> by Jean P. Lehmann and Natalie Selden Barnes (Colorado Authors) 2020, I got mine at the Clothes Pony in Ft. Collins. Older children or parents can read the book aloud to the younger ones. Be sure to discuss the content of the book and the breeds/characteristics of the dogs.

<u>Simple Map Activity:</u> (employing the map at the front of the book which appears to be a representation of a neighborhood in Ft, Collins)

Make two sets of cards numbered 1-8.

Two players or teams may play.

Shuffle the cards and place in a draw pile.

Players or teams take turns drawing a card and identifying the animal's home on the map.

If the answer is correct, the card is kept.

To keep a card players must also tell something the animal did in story.

If the number has already been drawn, it is placed on the bottom of the deck.

The cards are reshuffled as needed.

First to get all eight cards and put them in numerical order wins the game.

<u>The Shortest Day</u> by Susan Cooper (Newberry Medal Winner) 2019. This book was also illustrated by Caldecott Honor Winner Carson Ellis. I got mine at Barnes and Noble. This book is a simple poetic explanation of the winter solstice for younger children, again older children or parents can read the book out loud. Be sure to discuss the content of what the ancient people were doing, how is the way these people were feeling similar to the dogs in solstice tail.

Solstice Calendar Activity: Make a calendar to count down the days to the winter solstice (this year December 21st)

Use the last page of a wall calendar or a wipe off magnetic board calendar.

To honor Nyxi and Loki's valiant effort to save the sun, use dog stickers or magnets to mark the days. (stickers can be used on the last page of the paper calendar, and magnets for the wipe off calendar can be made by applying stickers to magnetic sheets and cutting around them. Stickers that can be reapplied such as the Paw Patrol stickers at Cohls or Walmart can be used on the wipe off calendar as well. You can also purchase dog and or paw print magnets online).

Younger children can place the stickers or magnets.

Older children can supervise and write the time of the sunset on each day.

This can also be used as an advent calendar simply by extending it to Christmas day.
