As you are aware we are in a temporary classroom at the rear of the school, we have had some major renovation work carried out over the summer holidays including new windows, heaters and internal lights, cladding on the exterior of the building and are hoping to renovate the outside area over the coming months.

In setting we follow the curiosity approach; we are passionate about children learning through play and providing lifelong learning skills and opportunities that will stay with our children as they develop and grow.
