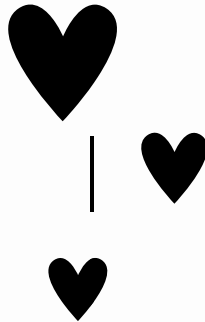


DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

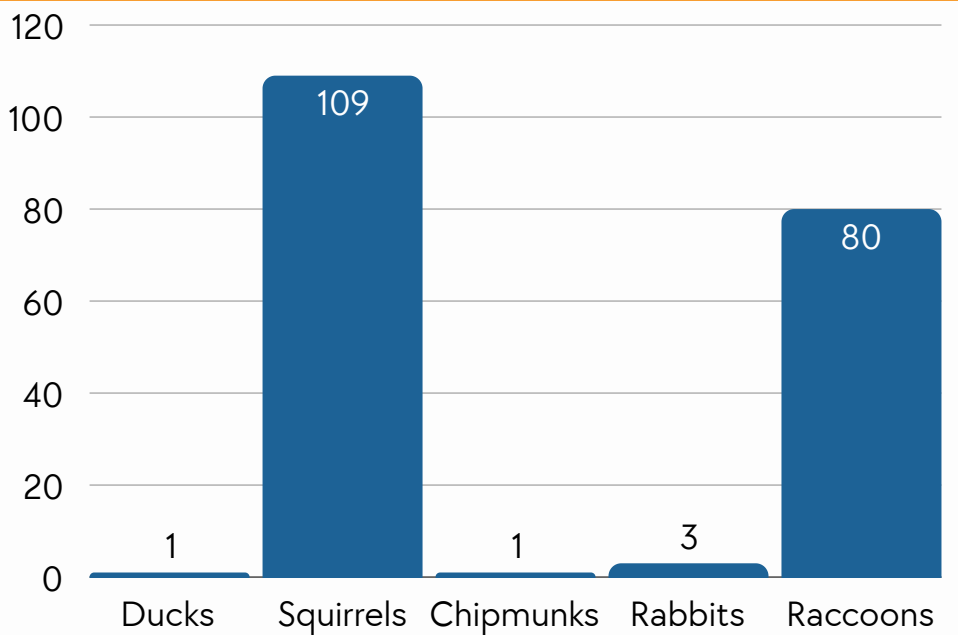

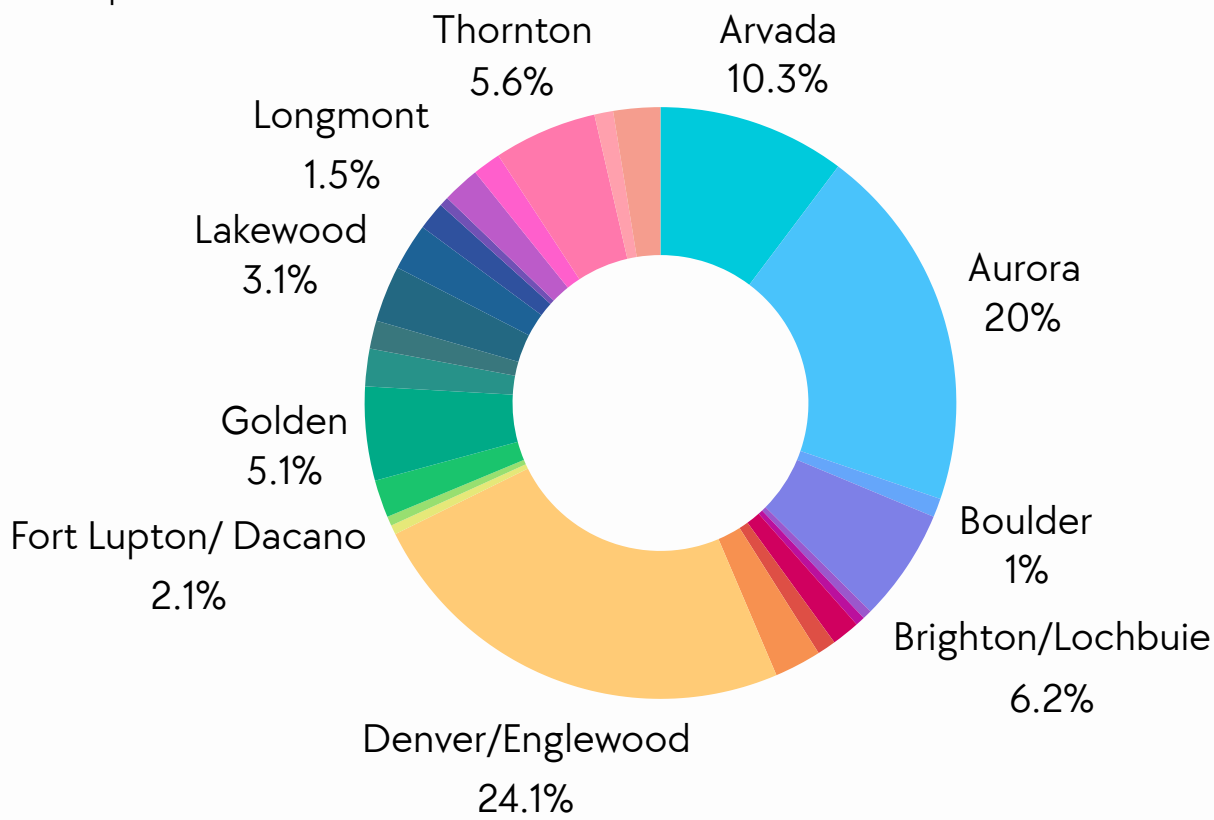
