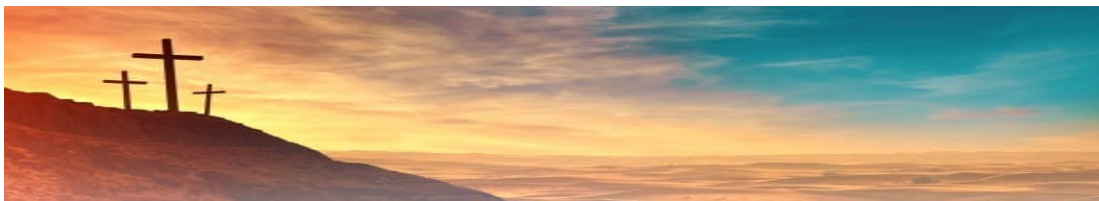

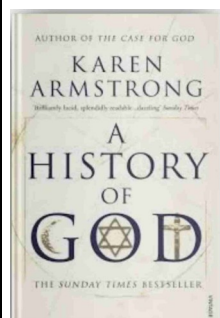

“COULD YOU NOT STAY AWAKE WITH ME ONE HOUR?”



The tradition of a **Vigil** on Maundy Thursday comes from Jesus' question "Could you not keep awake one hour?" to his disciples, who fell asleep as he prayed in the Garden at Gethsemane before his arrest, trial, and crucifixion.

During the Thursday evening service, **6pm on April 2nd** the "reserve sacrament" will be taken into the chapel and placed on the Altar of Repose. You are invited to sign up for an hour to “keep watch” over the Host from 7:00 pm until 11:00pm. We will bring the sacrament back into the church on Good Friday for the noon service. The sign-up sheet for our overnight vigil is available in the Narthex.

CLASSIC DEVEILED EGGS

Ingredients

12 large eggs
½ cup mayonnaise
2 tablespoons dill pickle relish
1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper, *to taste*
2 tablespoons chopped fresh chives
¼ teaspoon paprika



Instructions

Place eggs in a large saucepan and cover with cold water by 1 inch. Bring to a boil and cook for 1 minute. Cover eggs with a tight-fitting lid and remove from heat; set aside for 8-10 minutes.

Cool eggs in a bowl of ice water for 2-5 minutes. Drain well and peel; cut the eggs in half lengthwise, reserving the yolks.

In a small bowl, mash the yolks with a fork until chunky. Stir in mayonnaise, relish and Dijon; season with salt and pepper, to taste.

Use a pastry bag to pipe into the eggs, garnished with chives and paprika, if desired.

OPTIONAL DEVEILED EGGS GARNISHES

paprika + chives
bacon + lettuce + cherry tomato + black pepper
smoked salmon + capers + dill
prosciutto + parmesan
ham + shredded cheddar cheese



TOP USES FOR EGGSHELLS IN THE GARDEN:

Eggshells in the garden provide a slow-release source of calcium, which helps prevent blossom end rot in tomatoes and strengthens plant cells. To use them, rinse and dry shells (baking at 400°F for 10 minutes ensures they are dry and pathogen-free), then crush them into a fine powder or small pieces for soil amendment, compost, or to deter pests like slugs. Finer particles break down faster and provide nutrients to plants more quickly.

Soil Amendment (Calcium Boost): Grind dried eggshells into a fine powder and mix into the soil, especially when planting tomatoes, peppers, and eggplants, to prevent blossom end rot.

Pest Deterrent: Sprinkle crushed eggshells around the base of plants to discourage soft-bodied pests like slugs and snails, which dislike crawling over sharp edges.

Compost Booster: Add crushed shells to your compost pile to increase calcium content, helping to create nutrient-rich compost.

Seed Starters: Use empty, rinsed half-shells as biodegradable planters for starting seeds. Poke a small hole in the bottom for drainage, and plant the whole shell directly into the ground later.

Liquid Fertilizer: Soak crushed eggshells in water (sometimes with vinegar) for several days to create a liquid fertilizer rich in calcium.

Worm Bin Addition: Finely crushed eggshells can be added to worm compost bins to provide grit for better digestion.



Environmental Committee



Holy Innocents' Environmental Committee has been meeting and planning upcoming events highlighting the Church's commitment to Creation Care.

First, I wanted to note that we have streamlined our name - so keep an eye out for announcements from the Environmental Committee, or EC!

Also, **Earth Day is Wednesday, April 22**. We will be celebrating Earth Week with several events. On Sunday, April 19, our 9:30am service will highlight the beauty of God's Creation. We will have specially-chosen music, and before the service at 9:20am, we will bless the Baldwin Garden. By coincidence, this year Earth Day falls in conjunction with Rogation Day, which is a special day of thanksgiving to God for the harvest. It is a longstanding Christian tradition to bless the fields on this day, and we will use the Rogation Day prayers adapted from the Prayer Book for our blessings on the garden and its upcoming harvest. We also know that the Baldwin Garden is a special community asset, and benefits the St. Francis Food Pantry, so I have invited our ecumenical and interfaith colleagues from around the Island to bless the garden with me. I have also invited the people who have plots in the Baldwin Garden. I hope you are able to attend this special service!

We will also be celebrating Earth Week with a special Prayer Hike on **Tuesday, April 21, at 11am**, at the trail on Cedar Bonnet Island. Parking is somewhat limited in the lot there. so if you would like to carpool from the church, please let me know. I will be leading the hike and have already checked out the route. The trail is a wide, gravel, and relatively flat 1.5 mile loop, and so the walk is suitable for people of various walking abilities. Also, note that dogs are welcome on the trail, so please feel free to bring your furry companion for the walk! If you would like to sign up, or have questions, please email me at rector@hiecbh.com.

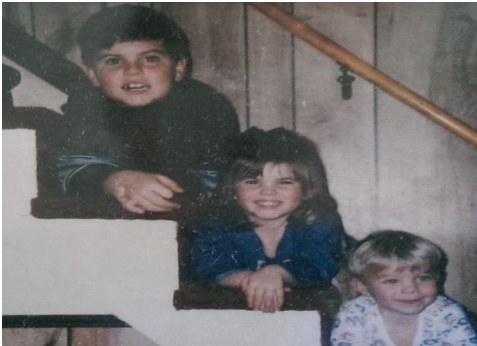
April Parishioner Spotlight ~ Chloe Dondero

Hi all! It's me, Ellen's daughter from upstairs in the choir loft. In full disclosure, I checked, and Barbara Wheeler first (though not last) reached out to me for a spotlight submission in August of 2024. As I'm writing this it's January of 2026, and that info probably tells you more about me than I'd prefer. Nonetheless, here we are, and happily so.

I'm an LBI south end native--a year rounder raised in Holgate and at Holy Innocents'. Among my first acts as a member of the church are processing with the choir (in the Mary Biddle days) on my mom's hip, keeping busy with toys and treats from Aunt Maggie Aftanis's magic bag, and launching a pacifier from the choir loft directly into Jack Crewdson's pew below. My longest friendship grew, in part, in this place, and my tiny handprint is on the wall in Martin Hall. I have no shortage of memories here, and I consider myself quite lucky to still be making them. It's a wonderful thing to grow up Episcopalian, because beyond scripture, our church's priorities, as I see them, come down to hospitality, community, and care. It's a gift to grow up in a church that welcomes people in, remembers their faces and names, and feeds them well and



often. I've learned to spot an Episcopalian in the wild by noticing who is putting the coffee on before the guests even arrive (I'm looking at you, Jean Nelson), and who is taking up tablecloths and putting away chairs when the meal is done (I'm still looking at you, Jean Nelson).



While we speak of luck and thanks, I'd like to share a little about my family. I'm the middle child of Ellen and John, the sister between my big brother, Johnny, and my baby brother, Noah. The five of us are all musicians, as seers foretold. While some people may imagine us gathered 'round a piano playing and singing together as much as we could, usually we were trying to see how far away we could physically get from each other in our little Holgate home so we could pretend to practice unobserved. It can be challenging to begin a new instrument or work through a tough piece when you know there are eight ears within range that can hear exactly what you're doing wrong. I don't know that



you really grow out of it either, but somehow all three of us survived this trying time and came out the other end as pretty skilled musicians. Thanks Mom and Dad!

There are a few exceptions to the pretend-you-can't-hear-me rule, and they come mostly at holiday time. Here at Holy Innocents' you can witness the product of these times at Lessons and Carols, on Christmas Eve, and during Holy Week, when the Dondero gang (occasionally even my sister-in-law Linda, also a professional

musician) is up in the loft playing and singing together. What you don't witness is the lead-up to these. Yes, we're all gathered 'round the piano. Yes, we're all making music together. We're also constantly catching each other making little (or not so little) mistakes, and we're **never** letting each other get away with them. If you're estimating times for a Dondero rehearsal, you have to add 20% for teasing and jokes.



Other Holy Innocents' celebrities from my family include my uncle, Rob Meyer, and his crew. You'd recognize Uncle Rob from everywhere doing everything, Aunt Ellen from everywhere else doing everything else, and my cousin-turned-little-sister Libby from the 1997 Beach Haven Times front page adoption announcement, among other places. It's a small town, after all. The Donderos and Dondero-Meyers have been around a long time, and it's done a lot to define my sense of community.



Growing up Beach Haven means hearing "How's your mom?" and "Tell your brother he's doing a great job with that marching band" and "Where on earth is your little brother" and "Your dad is THE Twelve Days?????" as I'm tidying displays at work. It means hearing what a meaningful impact my grandfather, Bill, and my grandmother, Olly, made on the people who knew them. It means starting a new job on the mainland and hearing "I'm so glad you found this path" from customers who followed me place to place. It's building a fort in the marsh, playing manhunt in the off-season, and throwing recycled 2-liter bottles from the roof of the Peacock's house to see how far we can shoot a bottle cap (sorry Pat!). Were I to stand on the corner of Center Street, I couldn't throw a seashell without hitting someone I know, and I don't even have very good aim.



After studying music at Lebanon Valley College in rural Pennsylvania, I came back to the water, and these days I'm in a little polly pocket apartment on a lagoon in Beach Haven West. I'm still a regularly performing musician, and for my day job I work as a florist at Reynolds just over the bridge. My favorite designs are often bridal bouquets, for a few reasons. I love the challenge that comes with making something so personal look and feel just

right. It feels good to have the skill and control in my two hands to take a pile of things that came out of the ground and turn them into something that makes a person feel so beautiful and special and loved. If I'm beng honest, I also just love a puzzle. There's no greater puzzle to me than to take an abstract



concept and turn it into a physical reality. Making something from nothing is one of the truest joys in my life. I do it when I knit and crochet, cook for my friends, make dessert for family holidays, rearrange all my furniture (and occasionally my friends') on a whim, and make music with people I love. Some of my most meaningful musical experiences, which I treasure, have been with the Capital Singers of Trenton. If I could encourage our church family to do one thing, it would be to do the same in whatever way makes sense for you. Make something beautiful from nothing, and do it with someone you love. Your something can be a craft, a story, a meal, an act of service, the list is unending. Anything can be something if we are willing to show up and make it so. Mr. Rogers taught me that in a scary time we are always to "look for the helpers," and it's this community that taught me to **be** a helper. Love thy neighbors, welcome them in, remember their names and faces, and feed them well and often--with your attention, your care, and your time. We keep each other safe, we help each other grow, and I couldn't be more thankful for that.

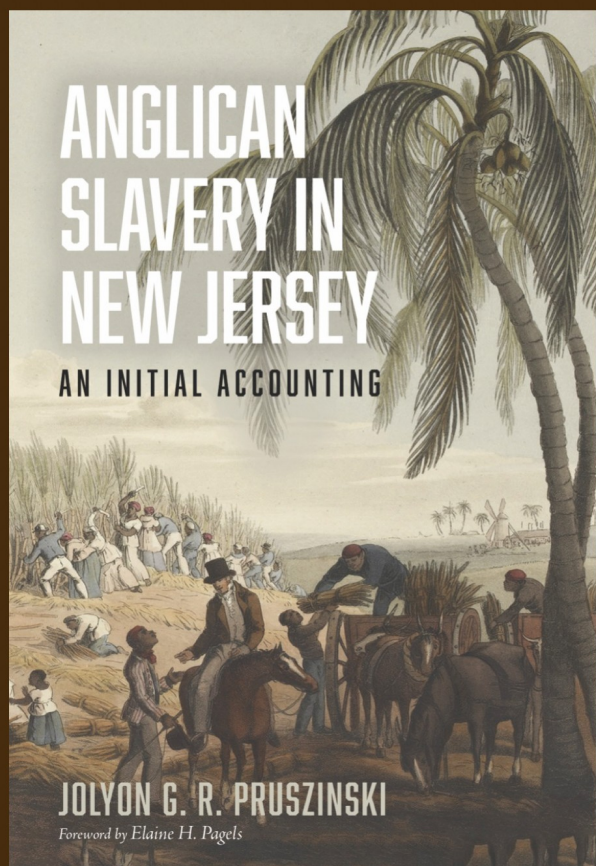
