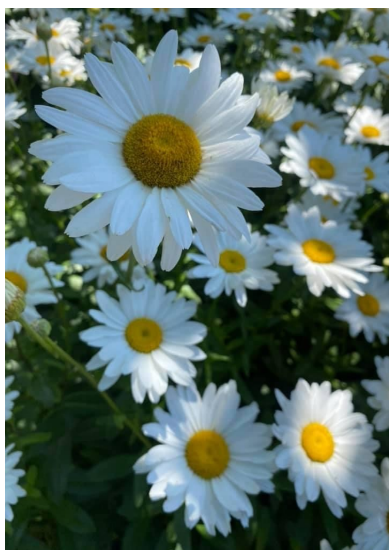

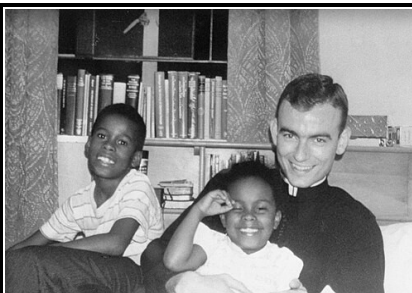

A Moment with Mother Erin



On August 14, the Episcopal Church commemorates the memory of Jonathan Myrick Daniels, a saint I deeply admire. As you may know, my parents and sister live in Knoxville, Tennessee. In past years, I have worked to explore U.S. Civil Rights Trail sites when I visit them. I was very grateful to have the opportunity

to visit Birmingham, Selma, and Montgomery in Alabama. As part of that pilgrimage, I visited the site where Daniels died (and the picture of the monument here is my own).

Daniels was born in New Hampshire in 1939. He was an excellent student, who graduated as valedictorian from Virginia Military Institute, and enrolled in Harvard. He felt called to ordained ministry from an early age, and left Harvard to attend seminary in 1963.



In 1965, Daniels answered a call by the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., for students to travel to Selma to march to Montgomery for voting rights. In August of that year, he participated in protests with SNCC, the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, at whites-only stores. He was arrested on August 14, and released on August 20, along with Richard Morrisroe, a white Roman Catholic priest; and Joyce Bailey and Ruby Sales, two Black teenage students. When the group attempted to buy sodas at a convenience store, they were ambushed. Tom Coleman, a sheriff's deputy, shot Morrisroe in the back as he fled protecting Bailey. When Coleman attempted to shoot Sales, Daniels pushed her out of the way, and was shot instead. He died instantly. Coleman was later acquitted of manslaughter.

As you may know, the feast days appointed for saints in our tradition are typically the day that person died. However, because August 20th was already the feast day of St. Bernard of Clairvaux, August 14th, the date of Daniels's arrest, was appointed as his feast day. And I find that fact very meaningful. It speaks to the importance of all the work of God's kingdom we do in this world, and not simply its most dramatic moments.

There are many more Civil Rights Trail sites I hope to visit, and look forward to continuing this ongoing pilgrimage in the future. I am grateful I had the opportunity to visit this site, and especially for the compassionate, courageous witness of Jonathan Myrick Daniels. If you would ever like to talk more about this history, please let me know!

July 8th was our monthly lunch packing ministry for the Nook food pantry at Bright Harbor Healthcare in Toms River. And it was a special event!

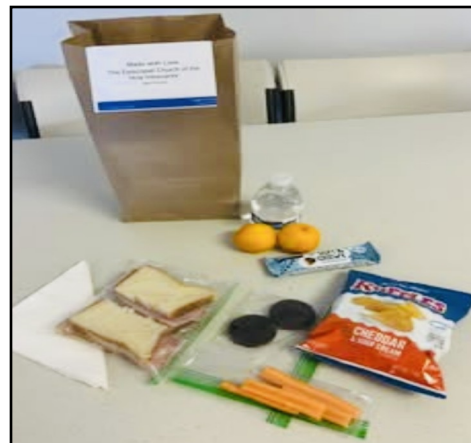
You may have heard that our lunch packing ministry recently received a Community Harvest microgrant of **\$651** from Episcopal Community Services of the Diocese of New Jersey to expand our program by 25%. This was our first day packing our new target of 100 bagged lunches, and our fantastic volunteers made sure everything went smoothly!

We are also working on building our relationship with Bright Harbor Healthcare.

That organization provides a full continuum of behavioral health, substance use, and supportive services for individuals and families of all ages, including the Nook food pantry. This summer, the Nook will also be starting a new program to provide backpacks and school supplies for children, and Holy Innocents' will be partnering with them on this project. So - here's how YOU can help!

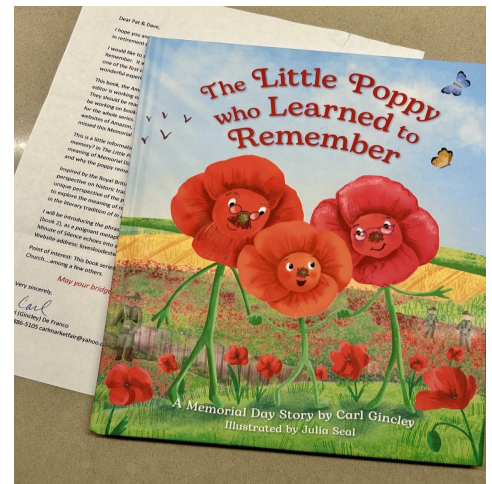


Backpacks needed!

Hurricane Season has begun, with our most likely months starting in August through November Are you ready? Bags packed and gas in your car?



Then you'll be ready when we are notified of a potential storm or hurricane.



Here's what FEMA and NOAA tell us:

It only takes one storm hitting an area to cause a disaster, regardless of the overall activity for the season. Therefore, residents, businesses, and government agencies of coastal and near-coastal regions are urged to prepare every hurricane season regardless of this, or any other, seasonal outlook. That said, we've heard NOAA's updated outlook for the 2026 Atlantic Hurricane Season. The agency predicts 8-14 named storms, and most of the predicted activity is likely to occur during the peak months (August-October) of the hurricane season.

So let's pack a "Ready-to-Go" bag this week!

Here's a guide from FEMA to begin your hurricane and storm preparation.

A basic emergency supply kit could include the following recommended items:

Water (one gallon per person per day for several days, for drinking and sanitation)

Food (at least a several-day supply of non-perishable food)

- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert
- Flashlight
- First aid kit
- Extra batteries
- Whistle (to signal for help)
- Dust mask (to help filter contaminated air)
Plastic sheeting, scissors and duct tape (to shelter in place)
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties (for personal sanitation)

Wrench or pliers (to turn off utilities)

- Manual can opener (for food)
- Local maps

Cell phone with chargers for car and electrical outlets, with cords, and a backup battery

Consider adding the following items to your emergency supply kit based on your individual needs:

Soap, hand sanitizer and disinfecting wipes to disinfect surfaces.

Prescription medications. About half of all Americans take a prescription medicine every day. An emergency can make it difficult for them to refill their prescription or to find an open pharmacy. Organize and protect your prescriptions, over-the-counter drugs, and vitamins to prepare for an emergency. Non-prescription medications such as pain relievers, anti-diarrhea medication, antacids or laxatives. Prescription eyeglasses and contact lens solution. Infant formula, bottles, diapers, wipes and diaper rash cream. Pet food and extra water for your pet. Cash or traveler's checks. Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records saved electronically or in a waterproof, portable container.

Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person.

- Complete change of clothing appropriate for your climate and sturdy shoes
- Fire extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates, paper towels and plastic utensils
- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children
- Pet supplies, litter, food, water, carrier, medicine.
- Cash

It's a lot to consider, so copy this list, add your own necessities, and designate a suitcase or box to start assembling your emergency kit—remember to include this list. ~ Mary Jane Mannherz

"Jesus then took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted. He did the same with the fish."

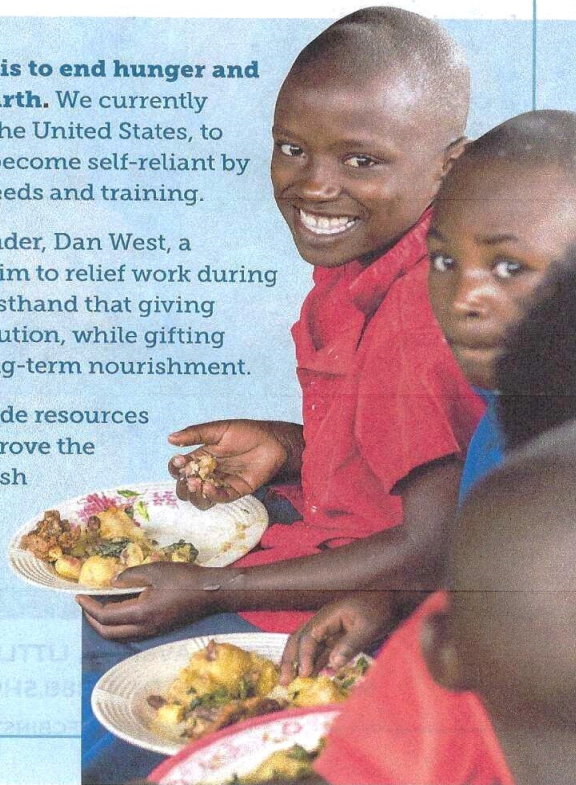

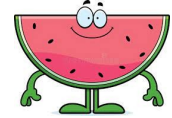
