## A Moment with Mother Erin

One of the most exciting moments in my ministry was serving on the Episcopal Church's inaugural delegation to the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women in 2015. I served in this role again in 2016, 2017, and in 2020. I have once again been asked to serve in this capacity for 2026.

You may know that the United Nations is made up of delegations from member states, which are national governments. Certain non-governmental organizations, whose experience can help inform the work of the UN, are granted special status to participate in portions of its work. Because of its work in areas such as creation care, issues related to Indigenous people, and ending violence against women and girls, the Episcopal Church is one of these organizations.

The Commission on the Status of Women meets each year for two weeks, during which the member states work to draft suggestions for global standards on gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls. During this time, people and organizations from all around the world also come to present workshops on a variety of issues relating to gender equality.

Each year, CSW's work focuses on a particular priority theme. In 2015, the priority theme happened to be ending violence against women and girls. As you may know, I have served both as a public defender, as well as an advocate at domestic violence and rape crisis agencies. I was honored to be able to use my experience to help advocate for the Episcopal Church's priorities in these areas, as voted on by General Convention, with member states. I was even more honored to have the opportunity to return and help with this work in subsequent years!


The Commission on the Status of Women will be meeting at the UN headquarters in Manhattan March 9 - 20. I will be serving as a delegate, as well as offering support as a priest to the delegation, the Anglican Communion's delegation, and the delegations of our ecumenical advocacy partners. I will have the opportunity to lead worship at the UN Church Center and Episcopal Church Center.

With the permission of Holy Innocents' vestry, I will be traveling to New York City periodically during the session, as well as attending meetings online. While I know serving in this role while attending to the needs of the parish will keep me busy, I am working to make sure I am well-prepared in advance.



## Recent Article in The Sandpaper by Eric Englund

At one time in her life, the Rev. Erin Morey was pursuing a career in the legal profession. But then she became attracted to the ministry and last month, she was installed as the new rector of Holy Innocents' Episcopal Church in Beach Haven. She officiated at her first service Feb. 1.

Morey replaces the Rev. Caroline Carson, who last year left to work in a different role for the Diocese of New Jersey. She is back to parish ministry serving in Canton, N.Y.

"I was born in New Brunswick, and I lived in South River until I enrolled at Rutgers as an undergrad," said Morey. "My dad's family lived in Bayville, and I spent summers there. My uncle was a police officer in Berkeley Township, and both my grandfather, James Morey, and my great-uncle, Harry Morey, served as mayor of Berkeley. After college, I went to the University of Pittsburgh School of Law. After I graduated, I started working in Pittsburgh as a public de-

fender, where I spent about 10 years. I then worked as a domestic violence advocate for Women's Center & Shelter of Greater Pittsburgh for about 10 years." Morey said she was brought up in the Roman Catholic tradition, but in 2007 when she moved to Mt. Lebanon, on the southern outskirts of Pittsburgh, she began to attend an Episcopal church there.

"I really connected with the parish and the Episcopal tradition," she said. "I served on the Episcopal Church's delegation to the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women for a number of years, and eventually decided to work at St. Paul's as their director of communications and community engagement. St. Paul's is the biggest Episcopal parish in the Diocese of Pittsburgh, and I supported their interfaith and community relationships, as well as organized their robust outreach program. Eventually, I decided to explore the possibility of serving as a clergy person. I graduated from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary and was ordained a priest in 2022. I served as associate rector of St. Paul's for 3½ years."



When her cousin asked her to officiate his wedding in South Jersey in 2024, she got to connect with Sally French, the bishop of the Diocese of New Jersey.

"My son, Max, moved to Chicago to attend Loyola University that same year, and I began to think about where I might be called to serve next," said Morey. "Holy Innocents' was looking for their next rector around that time, too, and when I read their parish profile, I was drawn to working with them to serve the community of LBI. I had very fond memories of coming to the Island in the off-season with my Girl Scout troop to help with dune restoration projects. After getting to know each other, Holy Innocents' called me as their rector."

Morey said she was very impressed by the way Holy Innocents' has been looking at ways to connect to the local community and serve its neighbors.

"They have a longstanding connection with different groups, like the Little Egg Harbor Yacht Club, the Jewish Community Center and the Beach Haven Fire Co., and I am excited to grow these connections," she said. "The church also is involved with a number of projects to serve our neighbors, such as our monthly lunch packing program. I am excited to find more ways we can work to care for our neighbors."

She said returning to New Jersey also has some gastronomic benefits, noting that the pizza, subs and bagels in Pittsburgh didn't quite cut it.

"It feels great to come home and be able to enjoy good ones," she said. "I really missed the beach, and now it's just right outside my door. I am an avid hiker and there is so much natural beauty to explore on and around the Island, and my dogs are getting used to the sand and water. I am also a big fan of Skee-ball and on weekends you can probably find me at Fantasy Island."— **Eric Englund**
