EP & Beach Circle – Tuesday, August 18 at 6:30 PM


Meet at the top of the Marine Street dune with your beach chair and enjoy Evening Prayer and conversation on the sand! BYO beverage and/or dinner.

DISHING WITH THE DEACON

George Council, our former bishop, gave me a book of Celtic prayers at one of the clergy meetings we had during his term with us. I had admired a prayer he read from the book and asked to see the book. In his usual gracious way, he gave me the book. When I looked into the book, I found a small printed card with the following words on it: "In his will is our peace."

Bishop Council could never know how deeply those words have affected my life and I have a deep-felt gratitude for his gift. This has been especially been true in 2020. These words mean acceptance of what is happening e.g. COVID-19, racial unrest, and hip surgery. I have wanted to fight against these matters in my heart and fight against acceptance of where the Lord has me at this moment.

They have also meant a deepening of my commitment to the role of deacon in helping others to find their acceptance and peace, too. I don't mean a passive acceptance of all things but a thoughtful acceptance that comes with the questions of why is this happening, what do you have for me to learn from this year that I can use in my life and in my ministry?

"In his will is our peace" can lead us to understand that part of God's will for us it to love and care for one another. Even more broadly, to love and care for others, different from us though they might be. It require us to analyze what it means to love one another and how we do this. We are all children of God, every one of us.

I have neighbors who whenever I need a favor like packages that are to heavy for me to carry, especially now when I can't lift anything heavier than 15 pounds, answer my call for help and bring the packages inside. That's love in action. They are devout Catholics and their lives reflect their faith commitment. I call them the best neighbors I have ever had. I also know a congregation at a special church where people have taken care of their deacon with cards, food, help, phone calls and prayers. She is more grateful for this care than she can say!

I pray to know God's will and thus find my peace. How about you?

The 2020 TIP Report Is Here

The 2020 Trafficking in Persons (TIP) Report will be released this week. It's a day we at IJM have eagerly awaited.

The TIP Report serves as an essential diplomatic tool in the fight against global slavery. The report ranks close to 200 countries based on their efforts to combat human trafficking.

Those rankings can have real consequences in terms of how U.S. foreign assistance is allocated. For us as advocates fighting for the end of slavery around the world, the release of the TIP Report is also an important moment to educate our lawmakers about the crime and what can be done to stop it.

There are three easy ways you can bring attention to the TIP Report:

1. Tweet at your legislative officials.

A quick message can urge your elected leaders in Congress to protect the integrity of the TIP Report and fund the U.S. response to human trafficking. Click here to find out who your legislators are.

2. Send a Letter to the Editor

Your voice matters, and the release of this Report serves as an excellent opportunity to raise this issue to the attention of elected leaders by writing and submitting a Letter to the Editor to one of your local publications.

Policy makers pay attention to these letters, and they are among the most read sections of the newspaper—making them a critical advocacy tool.

Download and edit a copy of the draft text from the **2020 TIP Report Resources files** and follow the simple instructions to submit your own Letter to the Editor to your local newspaper when the report is released! Let us know if you submit one (and if it's published!) by emailing advocacy@ijm.org or commenting on this post.

QUINOA SALAD

Quinoa Salad ~ Submitted by Pat Peacock

3 cups cooked quinoa, cooled (cooked according to package directions)

1 (14.5oz) can black beans, drained and rinsed

1 red bell pepper, diced

1 mango, diced

1 avocado, diced

2 green onions, sliced

1/4 c cilantro, chopped (optional-parsley will work!)

3 tablespoons lime juice

1 tablespoon apple cider vinegar

1 tablespoon avocado oil or extra virgin olive oil

1 teaspoon honey (optional)

1/4 teaspoon pepper, or to taste

1/4 teaspoon sea salt, or to taste

2 tablespoons hemp or chia seeds, for garnish (optional)



In a large bowl, combine quinoa, beans, bell pepper, mango, avocado, green onion, and cilantro. Mix lime juice, olive oil, vinegar, (honey, if using), salt, and pepper to make dressing and drizzle over salad. Gently toss to coat. Garnish with Hemp Seeds for an extra dose of good fats and protein! Chill until ready to serve.

CLASSIC LOBSTER ROLLS

INGREDIENTS

1/4 c. mayonnaise

1/4 c. fresh lemon juice

2 tbsp. fresh chives, chopped

1 tbsp. Dijon mustard

Kosher salt and black pepper

1 1/4 lb. lobster meat, cooked

8 split-top hot dog buns

Lettuce leaves



DIRECTIONS

Combine mayonnaise, fresh lemon juice, fresh chives, Dijon mustard, and kosher salt and black pepper in a bowl. Add cooked lobster meat (cut into large pieces) and gently toss to coat. Butter sides of split-top hot dog buns and cook in a *nonstick skillet* until golden and crisp on each side. Line toasted rolls with lettuce leaves and fill with lobster salad. Layer on lettuce first to prevent soggy bread.

For an extra kick of regional flavor, try one of these variations.

GULF COAST: Stir in chopped mango and mint leaves.

SOUTHWEST: Mix in chopped chipotles in adobo, crushed tortilla chips, and cilantro.

NORTHWEST: Add diced apple and celery.

PINEAPPLE SALSA GRILLED CHICKEN

INGREDIENTS

Juice of 4 limes, divided

1/4 c. plus 1 tbsp. freshly chopped cilantro

1/4 c. extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for grill

2 tsp. honey

Kosher salt

1 lb. boneless skinless chicken breasts

2 c. chopped pineapple

1 avocado, diced

1/4red onion, diced

Freshly ground black pepper



DIRECTIONS

Make marinade: In a large bowl, whisk together juice of 3 limes, 1/4 cup cilantro, oil, and honey and season with salt.

Add chicken to a large resealable plastic bag and pour in marinade. Let marinate in the refrigerator at least 2 hours, or up to overnight.

When ready to grill, heat grill to high. Oil grates and grill chicken until charred and cooked through, 8 minutes per side.

Meanwhile, in a medium bowl, stir together pineapple, avocado, red onion, remaining lime juice, and remaining tablespoon cilantro. Season with salt and pepper.

Spoon salsa over chicken before serving.
