## NEW JERSEY ENTERS DROUGHT WATCH

As of August 9<sup>th</sup>, there is a statewide drought watch. The Murphy Administration is urging residents and businesses to conserve water. The watch is intended to sow public awareness and appreciation of the stress upon water supply sources and encourage voluntary water conservation measures. Voluntary conservation measures at the watch stage can help to avoid more serious and restrictive drought conditions.

### 10 SIMPLE STEPS TO SAVE WATER THIS SUMMER

-  Water flowers and landscaping with water harvested in a rain barrel connected to a downspout. **1**
-  Use 30-50% less water with drip irrigation and micro-sprays compared to sprinklers. **2**
-  Only water when needed; in NJ most landscapes need only 1 inch of water per week. This often comes from dew and rainfall. **3**
-  If you have a pool purchase a water saving filter. **4**
-  Cover your pool when not in use to reduce evaporation rates. **5**
-  Avoid recreational toys that require a constant stream of water. **6**
-  Raise your lawnmower blade to at least 3 inches to promote deeper grass roots which hold water better. **7**
-  Use water from dehumidifiers and air conditioners to water your plants. **8**
-  Use native plants that need less water. **9**
-  Group plants together based on water needs. **10**

Summertime, means swimming pools, sprinkler jumping, and barbecues surrounding by manicured landscape. During the summer months, while water supplies are typically declining, water usage is increasing. In fact, water usage from winter to summer increases by approximately 30%. However, we can all do our part to reduce water usage by following these 10 simple tips.

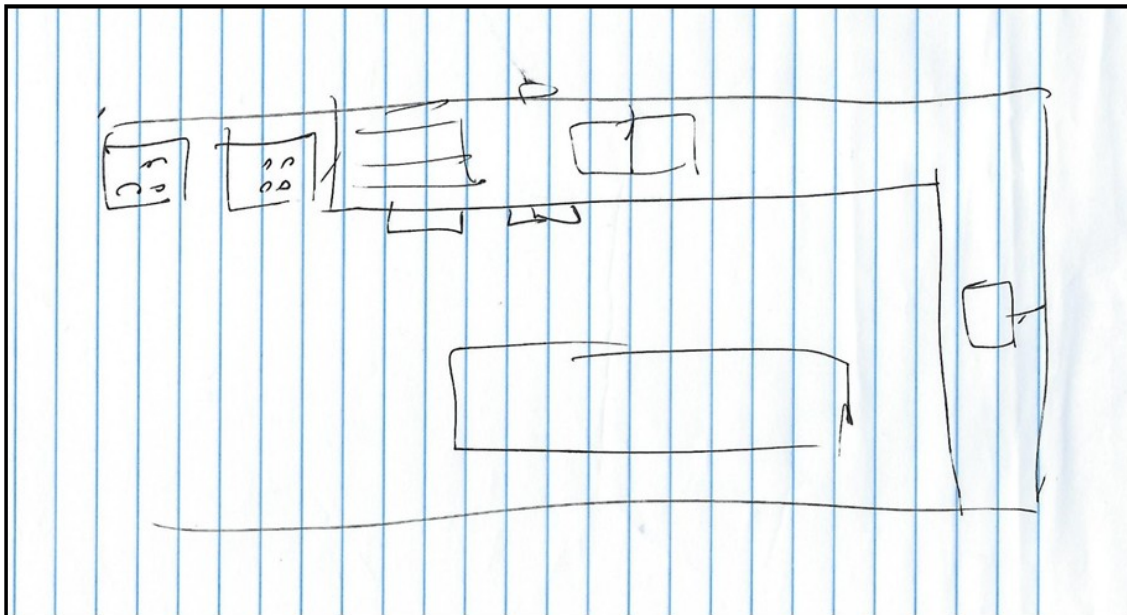


## Kitchen Renovation!!

We have estimates from two flooring companies. Estimates were within \$500 of each other for the kitchen and a \$5000 difference for Martin Hall and adjoining rooms. We are looking at a 3<sup>rd</sup> bid at this time. It is pretty much a foregone conclusion, based primarily on durability, that we will be going with a 12" Luxury Vinyl Tile.

We feel our lay-out for the kitchen is pretty well set and can now start looking for contractors to demo and install cabinets, counter-tops, etc. We're still looking at early spring for installation.

I thought I would share with you the original concept drawing by Rich Vaughan from my first meeting, early April of this year, with our Wardens, Rich V. and Leila Sullivan and Treasurer, Larry Peacock. It's definitely a rough concept...we really have come a long way since that first meeting and still have a long way to go!

## YOUR DONATIONS NEEDED!!

I hope you've had a chance to see our Kitchen Renovation poster in the Narthex with smaller versions in the Ambulatory and Martin Hall. ## September Parishioner Spotlight ~ Jackie Sparks



I was born in 1942 in Ridley Park, PA, and was baptized at the Episcopal cathedral in Wilmington, DE, along with my twin sister. I lived in Ridley Park for 6 1/2 years before moving to Beach Haven.

In Beach Haven, we lived on 2nd Street in a side-by-side house. Father Clapp (second vicar of Holy Innocents') and his family lived next door. My sister and I were friends with their children. The last time I saw Father Clapp was when he stopped in to see us in June of 1960, after they had moved to Alaska.

My hair dressing plans were short-lived when King and I were married. We were married in the original Episcopal church in 1966 by the Reverend Josselyn Reed. The rest is history! Our wedding picture hangs on the wall in Howard's Restaurant and is now also on the Howard's menu.



I have been a member of the Episcopal Church women for many, many years and also on the Altar Guild, which I currently co-chair. I have cooked meals for various functions. I worked at the Rummage Sale for many years and was in charge of the quiches for the Fall Card Parties. I went to Israel in 2011 with Father Frank and others from Holy Innocents'.

I have volunteered with Family Promise. I also volunteer at the Old and New Thrift Shop that benefits SOCH Meridian Hospital.



We have gone to Long Boat Key near Sarasota, Florida, for more than 50 years. We also spend time in Aruba in the winters. We have traveled to many overseas countries, especially in Europe, and to various islands. Many of our earlier trips were for skiing. I enjoy collecting sea shells and looking for sea glass, especially when I am in Florida.

We moved to Ocean Breeze, Paramount Escapes, 3 years ago. We miss living on LBI (and it is more difficult to get to church), but it was time to change our living situation.

Kimberly is a special education teacher in Pleasantville, Kevin is the third-generation owner of Howard's, and Kelly Fusco is the school librarian/technology teacher at Cranberry Grade School. I have four grandchildren: Zoe, Benjamin, Francesca, and Melina. I love to play Mahjong and attend Surfflight Theatre matinees. My favorite color is blue. ## **About The Daily Office - DID YOU KNOW?**

Use of daily prayers to mark the times of the day and to express the traditions of the praying community is traditional in Judaism and in Christianity. The third, sixth, and ninth hours (9 a.m., 12 noon, and 3 p.m.) were times of private prayer in Judaism. The congregational or cathedral form of office developed in Christianity under Constantine (274 or 288-337) with the principal morning and evening services of lauds and vespers. The people participated in the cathedral form of office. The monastic form of office also developed at this time. In addition to lauds and vespers, the monastic form included matins (at midnight or cockcrow), prime (the first hour), terce (the third hour), sext (the sixth hour), none (the ninth hour), and compline (at bedtime). By the late middle ages, the Daily Office was seen as the responsibility of the monks and clergy rather than an occasion for participation by all in the prayers of the community throughout the day.

After the Anglican Reformation, Archbishop Thomas Cranmer (1489-1556) reduced the eight monastic offices to the two services of Morning and Evening Prayer. These services were printed in vernacular English and intended for use by all members of the church. Participation in the Daily Office is at the heart of Anglican spirituality. It is the proper form of daily public worship in the church. In addition to forms for Daily Morning Prayer and Daily Evening Prayer in contemporary and traditional language, the BCP section for the Daily Office includes forms for Noonday Prayer, Order of Worship for the Evening, Compline, and Daily Devotions for Individuals and Families. These offices include prayers, a selection from the Psalter, readings from the Holy Scriptures, one or more canticles, and the Lord's Prayer. Forms for Morning and Evening Prayer include an optional confession of sin. The BCP provides a Daily Office Lectionary that identifies readings and psalm choices for Morning and Evening Prayer (pp. 936-1001), and a Table of Canticles with suggested canticles for use at Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer (pp. 144-145). The officiant in the Daily Office may be a member of the clergy or a lay person. Here at Holy Innocents' we offer Morning Prayer on Mondays at 9:00 AM with Bill Kehr, live on our Facebook page. Tuesday at 6:00 PM, Mtr. C offers Evening Prayer at 6:00 PM via FB Live, and Rob Meyer offers Compline every Thursday night at 9:00 PM via FB Live. Give them a try!
