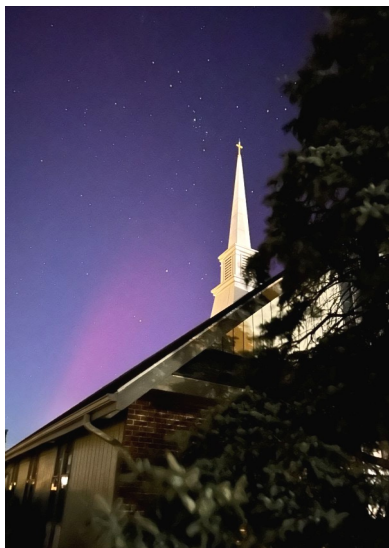

Dear People of Holy Innocents':

I am writing to share the exciting news that I have been called to serve as the next Rector of Holy Innocents' Episcopal Church in Beach Haven, New Jersey. I will begin serving in this role on Sunday, February 1. I admire Holy Innocents' focus on connecting to the communities of Beach Haven, Long Beach Island, and beyond, and I eagerly anticipate participating in this ongoing work. I am very much looking forward to getting to know all of you!

I currently serve as Assistant Rector at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Mt. Lebanon, Pennsylvania. In addition to my liturgical and pastoral duties at St. Paul's, I am the clergy support to St. Paul's Outreach and Pastoral Care commissions. While I have lived in the Pittsburgh area for some time, I grew up in northern New Jersey, with close relatives that lived (and still live) in Ocean County. I am delighted to be returning to a place where I have made fond memories, and have already established roots.

Prior to my ordination, I worked for a local domestic violence shelter. I am also an attorney, and currently serve as a legal volunteer with Neighborhood Legal Services. My son, Max, currently lives in Chicago, where he is attending Loyola University, with the goal of becoming a high school history teacher.

A Word From Fr. Peter

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

One of the challenges of an Interim Priest lies in balancing what new projects to undertake and which ministries and activities to continue. As many of you already know, I have tried to keep as many of the programs, liturgies and activities which are a familiar part of life at Holy Innocents'. I have introduced some additions to the liturgy, so the new Rector would have more liturgical options which were not previously used at Holy Innocents' Church.

There will be another change which I would like to make related to the shoebox gift ministry initiated by Ruth McLaughlin. This ministry comes out of Samaritan's Purse, a ministry of Franklin Graham. If you go to the webpage of Samaritan's Purse and read their statement of faith, you will discover that many of their articles of faith are not in accord with the teaching of the Episcopal Church. While I think it is important to build bridges with other faith communities, I find it problematic to give support to an organization which engages in work which the Episcopal Church would not endorse. After conversations with Ruth, we agreed to identify another group for whom we could prepare similar shoe boxes for Christmas.

Many of you donated material and money to the backpack collection we organized at the start of the school year. Deacon Ted brought those backpacks to Christ Church in Toms River and All Saints in Lakewood. We received most gracious thank you notes from the children at All Saints Church and from Mother Nicole Kurkowski, their Priest-in-Charge. Both churches include large Latino congregations with many children. While most of the children are American citizens, many of their parents are undocumented and work in the underground economy. The Latino communities at both Christ Church and All Saints are experiencing such a great fear of being arrested and deported that many have stopped coming to church. I thought that we could make an impact on the lives of these children by giving the Christmas shoe boxes to them, who are our neighbors and share our Episcopal faith.

I want to assure you that in making this decision I am motivated by fidelity to the teaching of the Episcopal Church and helping geographic neighbors close at hand. While we understand that there is a broader political context for this decision, I think that we can engage in a nonpartisan outreach to people in need who share our Episcopal faith. If anyone would like to speak with me about this change, I gladly welcome those conversations.

Ruth has purchased 30 plastic shoeboxes and we shall provide you with a list of suggested materials to include in these shoeboxes. Since Carl and I live close to All Saints we would deliver the shoeboxes to All Saints Church. I would ask that you return the shoeboxes by December 7th. We can make a real difference in the lives of children who are in need this Christmas season.

November Parishioner Spotlight ~ Jeannette Bond

I grew up in the Episcopal Church, attending the Church of the Good Samaritan in Paoli, PA. My earliest memory is going to church with my grandmother. At age 5, I realized while singing the hymn, All Things Bright and Beautiful, that I could read the words. I was so excited. That launched me into the world of books and music.

I left PA for Douglass College in New Brunswick, NJ, which was at the time the women's college of Rutgers University, in 1971. I ended up with a degree in Studio Art and Math. Cliff and I met at the end of my senior year and got married at the end of my second year of law school. We spent the first couple months of our marriage apart, when I took a summer job with the legal department of the IRS in NYC and he worked for Hershey Foods in Hershey, PA. We subsequently moved to North Jersey when he took a job with AT&T.

We bought our Beach Haven house in 1984, and, with its proximity to Holy Innocents', we regularly attended when we were here, while we lived in North Jersey. Both of our children were baptized at Holy Innocents'. I practiced law full-time until 1998, when we decided to up-end our lives by changing jobs and moving full time to Beach Haven. Cliff had completed his PhD and became a professor at City University of New York. I became Special Counsel for a Newark law firm under what was one of the earliest telecommuter arrangements, pre-email.

My new remote work allowed me to become much more active at Holy Innocents'. I sang in the choir, was a member of the Flower Guild, served as a member of the Vestry, a Warden, and as Treasurer. Early on I volunteered to work at the ECW rummage sale. I came home one day and told Cliff that I thought I had joined Suzette Whiting's army. I was assigned to oversee the toy section of the rummage sale since, with little kids at home, I had plenty of experience straightening up toys all day.

Also in 1998, Cliff gave me a set of watercolor paints for Christmas and I embarked on my return to art with watercolor classes at Jane Law's Studio. I met Jane at Church and she subsequently hired me to teach basic drawing and watercolor at her Studio. For many years, I did art shows at various venues on the Island.



My favorite thing about Holy Innocents' is the choir, both singing in it and, now that my voice is not good, listening to it from the pews. Ellen Dondero is a wonderful director and makes even shy newcomers feel welcome. It was also just a lot of fun.

I enjoy all kinds of music. My favorite thing about Beach Haven is enjoying sea breezes on the porch on a hot summer afternoon and visiting with neighbors as they pass by.

After over 45 years I retired from law practice at the end of 2024. Cliff and I are now snow birds, spending winters in Arizona, where I now do watercolors of rocks and cactus and try to grow things in the high desert. We attend an Episcopal church there, but we still view Holy Innocents' as our home parish.

And for my birthday Cliff gave me a set of water soluble oil paints to use in Beach Haven, something new to try. Here is a Prescott sunrise done with the new paints.
