The Parson's Place

When people in our society think of anniversaries, whether wedding or hiring or whatever, they typically think of celebrating that somehow. We've probably all seen the list of what each anniversary year represents. Year one is paper, year two is cotton, year three is leather, and so on. We try to match our gift of this particular type on that particular year. When we think about anniversaries, we sometimes fall into thinking our celebration must look like all the anniversary getaways in the movies. We assume that if we do not meet some kind of social standard, that our love must be lost or boring.

One year ago, we re-opened from COVID closure around this time. Two years ago, I had just finished my first week as your new rector!

So what should we think when we think about these kinds of anniversaries? How do we celebrate anniversaries as those rescued by grace and captured by Jesus? Are there ways to honor God with annual traditions in our marriage? Work? Opening? Other Celebrations?

In *Treasuring God in Our Traditions*, Noël Piper names God as the inventor of tradition. In Exodus 12:42, for example, God wants his people to remember all his works, to honor him

for what he's done, and to tell their children and grandchildren what they have witnessed. That particular scene is about the Passover, but how can we apply the same principles to our other anniversaries?

1. Anniversaries are about remembering our vows before God.

I pull out my ordination vows from the BCP and my ordination bulletin and rehearse them again. I look over them one by one. Clergy do this together each Holy Week in the annual diocesan Chrism mass where we also renew our ordination vows. I discuss and read how to remain faithful, and I pray for my colleagues, for you, and for myself. Have you tried that on important anniversaries or days of celebration? Read your wedding vows aloud together again and pray that God will continue to work these in you. Ephesians 5:22-23 speaks so clearly and powerfully about marriage. Read and pray this section together, and ask God to make it true for each of you. Check in with the friends and family who celebrated your event with you. Laugh and reminisce about the day, and look at pictures that highlight the joy of being made one by God, before God, and for God.

2. Anniversaries are about honoring God for what he's done.

As you celebrate, remember the gospel of Jesus Christ that saved you from eternal destruction, and brings you into everlasting life (John 5:24). Look at (and then beyond) those issues we faced: zoom only services, services online and broken internet, red tape separating aisles, or not being able to have fellowship time together.

Meditate on the past year and how God brought us through. Pray that we will love each other as Christ has loved us. Memorize the glorious and grace-filled vision of love in 1 Corinthians 13 this year. Ask God daily for the grace we need to keep on keeping on!

Dishing With The Deacon



The capacity for gratitude is one of the greatest gifts God has ever given us. Gratitude can keep us going even in the worst of times. Even Job, who could be characterized as having lost everything, still refused to condemn God for his losses. He says: "the Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the Name of the Lord. In all this Job did not sin or charge God with wrongdoing" (1:21-22).

Job lost all his children, servants, oxen, donkeys, sheep, and camels; he was inflicted with loathsome sores. His three "friends" Eliphaz, Bildad, and Jophar tried to talk him into cursing God and dying but he would not do that. He says "though he slay me, yet with I trust him" (13:15).

Toward the end of the book of Job he continues to praise God for all of God's wonders. God speaks to Job out of a whirlwind. "Where were you when I, God laid the foundations of the earth?" Where were you when the seas, light, snow, rain, rivers, stars were made and all the animals gave birth? Mountain goats, wild asses, oxen, lions, ostriches, horses? Job's final answer is though you slay me, yet will I trust you!

We will go through times of great trials e.g., the last 18 months, many of us have had illnesses, surgeries, deaths and other losses in our lives. It is a time when we are tempted to blame God or curse God. Don't do it! Instead think of all God has given us. Unlike Job we have friends who will steer us in the right direction – clergy who understand what we are going through and who love us and will stand by our side when we need them. Nothing will separate us from the love of God unless we let it. The God who made us, loves us and always will. AMEN

BLT Potato Salad

INGREDIENTS

2 lb. small new potatoes Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper

2 tbsp. sour cream

2 tbsp. mayonnaise

1 1/2 tbsp. white wine vinegar

12 oz. assorted-colored cherry or grape tomatoes

4 slices bacon, cooked and broken into pieces

1 1/2 baby arugula

Chopped chives, for serving



DIRECTIONS

Place potatoes in a large pot of salted water; bring to a boil. Reduce to a simmer and cook until just tender, 10 to 15 minutes. Drain and run under cold water to cool. Once cool, halve (or quarter, if large). Whisk together sour cream, mayonnaise, and vinegar in a bowl. Season with salt and pepper. Add potatoes and toss to coat. Fold in tomatoes, bacon, and arugula. Top with chives.
