The Parson's Place

What God creates, God loves; and what God loves, God loves everlastingly. I hope that you will hold on to those words. They are the beautiful thread that I see running through everything we do here at Holy Innocents'. It is a beautiful tapestry, woven with an abiding and enduring love, filled with strength that gets you through hard times. It's the kind of love from which we can never be separated.

(Romans 8:35-39)

Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? As it is written:

"For your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered."

No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Paul is always about hope and he stirs it up in me. I hope his words instill new hope in you too.

We are still in a time of ongoing pandemic and of communal suffering and sometimes it manifests itself as a lack of hope. It's a time when we need endurance. How do we cultivate those things? For mecontinuing a regular schedule that includes goals/hopes, being creative, setting aside time for myself, getting fresh air and sunshine, keeping in contact with friends and family, and trying to eat right. Hope....that fragile "thing with feathers, that perches in the soul" as Dickenson writes.

It does take practice sometimes. It can take willpower and self-compassion. Don't let anxious thoughts get the better of you. Bit by bit, you can build a foundation of hope by turning your dreams into concrete goals, making the best of every situation, giving to others, helping others, and living in the now. Consider that hope can be a habit, just like gratitude. Focus on gratitude, trusting God and yourself, surround yourself with positivity and reach out when you need.

Try developing coping skills, practicing gratitude, and nurturing hope.

Dishing With The Deacon

Have you ever read a section of Scripture and said to yourself: "I have to make this my guide for the year?" It could be a verse, a chapter or even a whole book from the Old or New Testaments. This year, I keep going back to Psalm 91, with the understanding that this Psalm is my guide for this year. I'm going to print out the first six verses and make some commentary on these verses and I hope they come to mean a lot to you too.

91 Qui habitat

- 1 He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High abides under the shadow of the Almighty.
- 2 He shall say to the Lord,
 - "You are my refuge and my stronghold, my God in whom I put my trust."
- **3** He shall deliver you from the snare of the hunter and from the deadly pestilence.

(Book of Common Prayer p. 719)

- 4 He shall cover you with his pinions and you shall find refuge under his wings; his faithfulness shall be a shield and a buckler
- **5** You shall not be afraid of any terror by night, nor the arrow that flies by day;
- 6 Of the plague that stalks in the darkness nor of the sickness that lays waste at mid-day

I find comfort and reassurance in this Psalm because it tells me in whose house I dwell and whose shadow protects me. Imagine! It is the Most High, the Almighty's house and shadow. That's where we dwell, where else would we want to be? We say: "My God, I trust you, you are my shelter, my shadow, my refuge, my stronghold." This year especially deliver us from the deadly pestilence known as COVID-19. He who holds the world in his hands has a place of protection for us. Alleluia!

He will cover us with the edge of a bird's feathers and God's wings, his eternal care for us is with the softest wings of the bird.

We need not be afraid of night terrors or plagues that come in the night or sickness that harms us in the daylight. May we all take this Psalm to heart and trust the Lord to care for all of us and our loved ones.

UNTIL ALL ARE FREE

Thanks everyone for your support of the International Justice Mission on Freedom Sunday.

In southern India millions of migrant laborers were forced to move back to their home states due to nationwide COVID-19 lockdowns. Factory owners in the booming textiles industries only want to keep production running. A lot of companies have been recruiting children and young people to work in spinning mills by making false promises. This was the case for a group of 38 teen-aged girls who became trapped in forced labor at a spinning mill in Tiruppur District this summer.

When factory owners saw families struggling to make ends meet, they promised young women steady employment until schools reopened. Once there, they were forced to work exhausting 14-hour days without breaks and were trapped inside the factory at all times. They could not contact their parents or, if they got sick, could not see a real doctor. IJM's partners in India (Terre Des Hommes CORE, READ and the Campaign Against Child Labor (CACL)), rescued the girls from the factory on July 29 and brought them to safety. More recently, IJM and its partners have supported rescue operations and surprise sweeps at a spinning mill where minor girls were locked up when police arrived on August 17, freeing 15; on August 18, 6 were freed from a cotton thread factory; and on August 19, at a busy garment factory two women and a teenaged girl were set free.

Your support, through Prayer, Advocacy, and generous Giving, provides invaluable assistance in the struggle against slavery and violence against the poor. Please consider becoming a Freedom Partner.

This event is to raise funds for parishes for their feeding programs or raise for the charity of your choice.



INGREDIENTS

2 c. strawberries

1 1/2 c. white chocolate, melted

1 tsp. coconut oil

1/4 c. mini chocolate chips

1 c. chocolate chips, melted

DIRECTIONS

Line a small baking sheet with parchment paper.

In a large bowl, combine melted white chocolate and coconut oil and stir until combined.

Dip strawberries into white chocolate and place two mini chocolate chips on the top half of the strawberries for eyes.

Place strawberries on prepared baking sheet and place in the refrigerator to harden, about 10 minutes.

Place melted chocolate chips in a Ziploc bag and pipe mouths on the strawberries.

Let cool again in the refrigerator, 5 minutes. Serve.

Both Bob and I were raised as Episcopalians and his mother even went so far as to suggest to Bob to ask what religion his girlfriends were, saying, "a relationship is hard enough without being of different religious beliefs." I can vividly remember the time when he asked me what religion I was. I was taken back thinking what difference does it make. So, this one worked out very well! EP & Firepit - Monday, October 12th at 5:30 PM



Don't just come to church, BECOME the church. The church is not a building where we gather. The church IS the people who gather in Christ's name.

As the people of the church, it is up to us to insure our worship, music and missions continue. It is through your generous stewardship that we make this possible each year. Do you wonder if your pledge really matters? Yes, it most certainly does! To many people, it comes as a big surprise to discover that Holy Innocents' is not a wealthy church. The beautiful building, the glorious music, and many mission and outreach projects we embrace all seem to say we've made it. But the truth is, that Holy Innocents' manages to do all these things principally through the support of members and friends like you—we rely on everybody. Unlike some churches, we do not have a large endowment to fall back on—mostly those precious pledge envelopes! Our parish budget is prepared based on the pledges received from the members.

This year, in particular, when we have not been able to welcome everyone into the building or share communion with our summer friends and visitors, we have found our plate contributions to have fallen significantly short of our expectations. We, respectfully, ask that you take this year's annual campaign seriously and consider your pledge prayerfully. Each of us is important to this effort. If you have never pledged, please consider it. If you have pledged in the past, thank you, and we look forward to your consideration of a step up in your giving.

Stewardship is about being grateful, responsible stewards of the gifts we receive from God. There is no right or wrong way to pledge or to come up with a pledge amount. Most of us may never reach the Biblical tithe of 10% but maybe some percentage of household income works for you. Helpful questions you might ask yourself include, "Does my pledge reflect the importance of Holy Innocents' in my life?" and "Does my pledge reflect my gratitude for God's generosity in my life?". Whatever you decide to give is a gift of faith and will go to the work of God.
