In lieu of a Parishioner Spotlight this month, we felt it was appropriate to share Barbara's life story written by her daughter Susan Bishop Mangino.

#### Barbara Peterson Bishop ~ 1939 - 2023

Barbara P. Bishop, wife, mother, sister, grandmother, friend, activist, businesswoman, volunteer and force of nature, passed away on May 18, 2023, at age 83 after a brief but valiant battle with an aggressive illness. She was constantly on the go, making her death a shock. She wasn't done here. True to her nature, she left surrounded by her family and supported by her many friends, having led an incredibly full life and buoyed by her faith and a happy heart.

The things that kept her busy allowed her to perfect her greatest skills: expert friend-maker and caretaker. Everyone knew Barbara, and Barbara knew everyone. she was rarely a passing acquaintance; she nurtured every relationship. She loved hearing stories, sharing adventures and laughing together. She would often lend a hand, offer a ride, make a donation or attend a fundraiser. She would always lend

an ear, have an opinion, offer advice and give a hug.

Barbara, affectionately known as BB to some, was born in Camden, N.J. to Florence and Charles Peterson and raised in Merchantville, N.J. She began spending summers on Long Beach Island (LBI) in 1955. It was on LBI where she met her husband, James F. Bishop (Jim), while working at the A&P in Beach Haven Crest. Family legend claims she would walk four miles on the beach to catch a glimpse of him lifeguarding in Ship Bottom. It paid off. After their marriage in 1962, they lived in lived in Philadelphia and spent summers on the island before moving there fulltime in the early 2010s.

Her family was her first priority and filled her heart with pride. She and Jim have two children, David P. Bishop and Susan Bishop Mangino, as well as four grandsons, Marin and Cameron Bishop, and Sam and Zach Mangino. She would always make time to help take care of them, see them play in the band or compete in sports. She especially loved when she could share her love of the Island with them. They all would say she wasn't the type of grandmother who baked you cookies – instead, she took you places and taught you things, and probably snuck in an ice cream too.



The first in her family to earn a bachelor's degree, Barbara graduated from Ursinus College. Her math degree helped her land a job as a computer

programmer for RCA in the early 1960s when they coded with 1s and 0s on the bare metal. She then took time to raise her children and volunteer. She returned to full-time work in the 1980s, again as a programmer and later as a project manager for a variety of companies, including many years at CIGNA. She loved the challenge of simplifying and managing complex projects and was proud to earn her Project Management Professional Certification.

After retiring, she created and managed a community redevelopment project in Philadelphia for several years, working to revitalize the business district in the neighborhood of Olney where she and Jim lived and ran a family business.

Throughout her life, she volunteered and worked as an activist and organizer. While she was raising her children, she joined with friends and began the advocacy group Parents Union for Public Schools. She was involved deeply in the First Presbyterian Church of Olney -- singing in the choir, serving as an elder and teaching Sunday School. Living in an increasingly diverse city, she taught English as a Second Language (ESL) for more than a decade in a center where more than 50 countries were represented. She loved learning about new cultures and traditions from her students, who also became friends.

After moving to LBI year-round, she immersed herself in the community. She again taught ESL at Southern Regional High School, volunteered for the Lighthouse International Film Festival, got involved with the arts community and supported a variety of environmental causes. In 2021, she along with other local residents, founded the Ship Bottom

Taxpayers Association. Barbara and her family were members of the Surf City Yacht Club (SCYC), where she made lifelong friendships over nearly 50 years. It was here she learned the love of sailing with the Ladies Fun Sailing group (who often fortified themselves with Bloody Marys during their trips on the bay). She was elected as SCYC's first female Commodore in 1997, an honor she treasured.

She loved music and sang in choirs most of her life--from her childhood in South Jersey, to college, to Philadelphia and most recently at the Holy Innocents' Episcopal Church, where she also helped manage the Memorial Garden. She was an avid reader, book club and Bible study participant, Mah Jongg player, frustrated gardener, parade lover, boater, and student of the weather and wind. She never stopped learning and always wanted to share what she just read or discovered. During the pandemic, she used her extra time to take a course in environmental science to understand more how she could protect her beloved LBI from the effects of climate change. She and Jim loved attending Science Saturday at the LBI Foundation of the Arts and Sciences.

She will be dearly missed by so many, most especially by her husband, her children, their spouses Jane Boies and Mark Mangino, her grandsons, her sisters Jeanette Peterson and Arlene (Peterson) Claffee, her sister-in-law Linda (Bishop) Ray and her husband Walter Ray, as well as cousins, nephews, nieces and other family members.
