where their next meal is coming from.



5/4/20- Creating Wildlife Habitat in Your Yard. All creatures need to eat, drink, hide from predators, take cover from harsh weather, and safely raise their young. Whatever the size of your yard, learn how you can transform it into a haven for wildlife. Kathleen Kerwin, Program Associate, Wildlife Conservation and Management Program, Rutgers Cooperative Extension.

5/11/20- Home Vegetable Gardening For Food, Fun, and Stress Management. Growing your own food can be physically and mentally rewarding. There are important tips to consider when starting a home vegetable garden such as location, sunlight, water, soil quality, and wildlife exclusion. This presentation will cover important tips for vegetable gardening including selecting vegetable varieties, starting seeds indoors and outside, planting and spacing, managing pests in the garden, watering, and harvesting the garden. 5/18/20- **Reducing Food Waste**. Thirty to forty percent of all food produced in the US is wasted. This talk will define food waste, its environmental impacts, and will provide tips for reducing food waste at home. 5/26/20- **Reducing Plastic Waste.** Every year, 8 million metric tons of plastic end up in our oceans. Learn about the impact plastic is having on our environment and the steps you can take to reduce plastic waste in your home. Casey Lippincott, NJDEP Watershed Ambassador.

# UNTIL ALL ARE FREE

Please pray for IJM's development teams who have been pivoting plans and quickly innovating to build creative, remote experiences over the past few weeks. Pray that as people are socially distancing and spending more time online looking for things to do, they are drawn to the fight to end slavery, and that IJM is equipped to meet that new, unique interest with resources and content that pull them deeper into the mission.

#### The Sound of Good News

In Bolivia IJM's team protects children from sexual violence. In spite of the seriousness of the work, each staff member has a *matraca*, a noise maker, perched on their desks. When the "crackcrackcrack!" rings out, everyone immediately stops their work and spins their *matracas* in response as they come together to rejoice in good news.

Last year, the good news they were celebrating was the 150th sentence they'd won over the past the 14 years. But they were celebrating more than the milestone – it's what the milestone means.

The 150th conviction means that there are two young girls whose aggressor can't harm them anymore. It means that there are hundreds of children who are safe, and hundreds more who will never be harmed in the first place. What 150 convictions means is that a justice system that was once not working to protect its own people is now coming alive to be a force for good within Bolivia, for generations to come.

150 convictions is an amazing milestone, but it's just the beginning. In Bolivia, and all around the world, there are people who are not safe, there are children who are exploited, and there are vulnerable individuals who need the justice system to work for them. With your help, we won't stop. We will continue to show up every day because there are so many more celebrations ahead.

An update on our ministry to Family Promise of Southern Ocean County

In these difficult times, **Family Promise** has made arrangements for the families in the program to stay at one church, Lighthouse Alliance in Little Egg Harbor, from early March through last week. Now the families have moved to Ocean Community Church on Rt. 72 for another extended and generous stay. It is comforting to hear the families are

able to establish one place as a temporary home. The Family Promise Day Center has closed and the two staff are working from home. With consideration of these circumstances, everyone seems to be doing well. The new baby and her mom are well. The families are still receiving counseling and job training, and are completing housing applications. *Family Promise staff is still advising and counseling others in need though phone and online services.* 

Considering the upbeat message I recently received from Family Promise, no doubt, this is challenging for everyone. As soon as I hear of any specific need for meals, food, and supplies, I will let you know. Family Promise can always use our monetary support.
