1. Donation

Combat Cancer has generously agreed to make a donation of £80,000 to Newcastle University. This donation is accepted under the terms of the University's Ethical Policy for the Acceptance of Donations, a copy of which can be found on our website.

The University of Newcastle upon Tyne (trading as Newcastle University) is an "Exempt Charity" recognised by the Inland Revenue, IR Claim No: X61406.

2. Purpose

Donations received up to and including 31 July 2022 will fund a PhD studentship into childhood cancer research, with donations received after this date intended to support a second PhD studentship to be awarded in the future.

Should it become unfeasible to support a second PhD studentship, Newcastle University will use the donation to support childhood cancer research and will update the donor on how the funds will be spent.

Both the donor and the University affirm that this donation will complement the vision, values and reputation of the University and will not constrain academic freedom.

3. Acknowledgement and Reporting

The donation will be recognised as Combat Cancer. The studentship will be recognised as the NU Centre for Cancer Studentship in Paediatric Oncology, supported by Combat Cancer and Newcastle University.

Combat Cancer will receive regular annual updates detailing the impact of donation.

Newcastle University will invite Combat Cancer to donor and supporter events in line with University engagement plans.

4. Schedule of Contributions

A donation request will be issued to the donor in advance of each scheduled payment. Combat Cancer will at this time confirm that the charity will be financially able to proceed with the scheduled contribution.

If the scheduled contribution cannot be made in full, Newcastle University will agree a contribution that will be made by Combat Cancer and will negotiate how the funds can best be used.

A receipt will be provided following transfer of funds.
