Bible Study Handout: James 1:9-18 (NKJV)

Opening Prayer:

Heavenly Father, we come before You today with humble hearts, seeking wisdom and understanding from Your Word. Open our eyes to see the truth in James 1:9-18, and help us apply it to our daily lives. May Your Holy Spirit guide our discussion and deepen our faith. In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen.

Scripture Passage: James 1:9-18 (NKJV)

9 Let the lowly brother glory in his exaltation,

10 but the rich in his humiliation, because as a flower of the field he will pass away.

11 For no sooner has the sun risen with a burning heat than it withers the grass; its flower falls, and its beautiful appearance perishes. So the rich man also will fade away in his pursuits.

12 Blessed is the man who endures temptation; for when he has been approved, he will receive the crown of life which the Lord has promised to those who love Him.

13 Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am tempted by God"; for God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does He Himself tempt anyone.

14 But each one is tempted when he is drawn away by his own desires and enticed.

15 Then, when desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, brings forth death.

16 Do not be deceived, my beloved brethren.

17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning.

18 Of His own will He brought us forth by the word of truth, that we might be a kind of firstfruits of His creatures.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What does James mean when he says the lowly brother should "glory in his exaltation" (v. 9)?
- 2. How does James describe the fate of the rich man? What lesson can we learn from this (vv. 10-11)?
- 3. What does it mean to "endure temptation" (v. 12)? How does this lead to the "crown of life"?
- 4. Why is it important to understand that God does not tempt anyone (v. 13)?

- 5. How does temptation lead to sin, and what is the ultimate result of unchecked sin (vv. 14-15)?
- 6. What does verse 17 teach us about God's character?
- 7. In verse 18, James speaks of believers as "firstfruits." What do you think this means in the context of God's plan?
