Tips for Staying Rooted in Christ During the Holiday Season

The holidays can be a joyful time, but they can also bring stress, loneliness, and pressure. As Christians, we can approach this season with faith, prayer, and a perspective rooted in God's love to help maintain our mental health. Here are some tips:

Embrace the Peace of Christ; The holiday season can often bring feelings of anxiety or stress. Remember, Jesus came to bring peace, not just to the world, but to our hearts as well. In John 14:27, Jesus says, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." Take time to reflect on the peace He offers and intentionally invite that peace into your life through prayer and quiet moments of rest.

Simplify Your Expectations; The pressure to create a perfect holiday season can be overwhelming. While traditions are beautiful, remember that your worth is not defined by how perfectly you decorate your home or whether every gift is perfect. Focus on the joy of Christ's birth rather than on the perfection of everything around you. Consider what truly matters and let go of unnecessary pressure.

Set Healthy Boundaries; It's okay to say no to events, commitments, or even certain conversations that might drain your emotional energy. Jesus modeled boundaries, as He often took time to rest and pray (Mark 6:31). Respect your own limits, and take time to rest and recharge.

Focus on Gratitude; Amidst all the festivities, take time each day to reflect on the blessings in your life. Philippians 4:6-7 reminds us to "do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Gratitude helps shift our focus away from what we lack and reminds us of the abundant love and provision God gives us daily.

Practice Self-Care with a Christ-Centered Focus; Caring for your mental health is not selfish—it's a way of honoring God with the body and mind He has given you. Take time for activities that refresh your spirit, whether that's spending time in nature, practicing a hobby, or engaging in spiritual disciplines like reading the Bible and prayer. When we nurture ourselves, we are better equipped to serve others.

Remember the True Reason for the Season; Amid the busyness of holiday shopping, cooking, and celebrations, it's easy to lose sight of the most important thing—Jesus. Take time to meditate on His birth, His love for you, and the hope He brings. Remember that "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:5). Let His light fill your heart and guide you through the season.

In all things, remember that God is with you. Trust in His presence, His provision, and His peace as you navigate the challenges and joys of the holiday season. May your heart be filled with His comfort, love, and joy!

Doing what is right

What can we do to make others happy? We can be kind, listen and be respectful.

Students can study, practice, get good grades, and do what is right.

Adults do what is right following Jesus by trusting, obeying, and serving him.

This leads to a life transformed from the inside out. It is a daily commitment to emulate Jesus's life and teachings, not merely a one-time decision. This involves intentional actions in various aspects of life, including how one handles relationships, priorities, and internal struggles

Even though it can be hard we must learn to forgive if someone or ourselves did something wrong or not right. We must learn to forgive actions and learn from experience. Do what is right and follow Jesus.

Key actions for following Jesus

Loving and serving others

Jesus emphasized love for God and for one's neighbor as the greatest commandments. For an adult, this translates into everyday actions:

Loving your neighbor (including enemies): This means showing kindness and compassion to everyone you encounter.

Serving others: Like Jesus, who came to serve, not to be served, adults can serve their family, community, and those in need. This includes helping the homeless, serving in a local church, or caring for family.

Showing patience and forgiveness: Actively choosing to forgive others, even when it is difficult, reflects the grace Jesus showed us.

Exhibiting humility and integrity

Putting aside pride and selfish desires is central to following Jesus.

Practicing humility: Adults demonstrate humility by valuing others above themselves and putting their needs first.

Living with integrity: This involves being consistently honest and demonstrating moral courage in all areas of life, including at work.

Rejecting worldly values: Followers of Jesus strive to prioritize God's kingdom over worldly pursuits like ambition and material gain.

Committing to a daily spiritual life

A consistent and intentional relationship with God is foundational to following Jesus as an adult.

Praying consistently: Following Jesus involves regular prayer, both in times of crisis and in daily life.

Reading and applying scripture: Studying the Bible and applying its truths to everyday decisions is essential for spiritual growth and maturity.

Embracing community: Committing to a local church community and building deep, authentic relationships counters individualism and provides support and accountability.

Sharing faith

An essential part of discipleship is sharing the message of Jesus with others.

Making disciples: Following Jesus includes the mission of helping others become his disciples, teaching them to obey his commands.

Witnessing through actions: Adults can share their faith not only through words but also by living a life that reflects Jesus's character and attracts others to him.
