

It has been unusually quiet in our hallways at St. John's. The familiar sounds of choir practices and children running down the halls are absent. Likewise, the familiar smells of coffee cooking and meal preparations have disappeared and given way to those of cleaning products.

While the season of Lent is meant to be a quiet and subdued time in our worship life together, this is because we are preparing to celebrate loudly our Lord's resurrection on Easter. The quiet we are experiencing now, however, has less to do with our life together as a church, and more to do with our lives together as neighbors and citizens of this community and our country.

Following the health emergency proclamation of our governor, we have cancelled all in-person meetings and gatherings of 10 or more people. This includes all worship services, choir practices, Sunday School and Confirmation gatherings. We have also postponed our Meatball Supper until a later date.

We will continue to broadcast our worship services each Sunday morning at 8:30 A.M. on KNEI, 103.5 FM. We will also continue to use our liturgy and hymns from our book of worship. We will have a small group of musicians to assist us and I will continue preaching on the Bible readings scheduled for the day.

If this health emergency continues, we are prepared to cancel in-person worship and activities throughout

the month of April, including Palm Sunday and Easter. We will rely on social media, radio, and television to communicate continued cancellations or resumptions of normal worship, study, and service activities.

We are not locking our doors throughout the week, but we recommend that we follow the health emergency protocols currently in effect. Our office will be open to receive your phone calls and emails, but we ask that you continue to stay at home and limit your physical contact with others, including our staff. Likewise, I will not be visiting our hospitals, care facilities and homes until it is deemed safe for residents, patients, staff and our members.

Together, we are doing these things, not out of fear, but to protect our neighbors from illness. Fear is a powerful emotion, but our Lord Jesus does have a good word for us when we're afraid.

The Bible says that when his disciples were cowering in fear after he was crucified, he walked in among them through locked doors. And his first words to them were "Peace be with you." And these words came from a man who had been crucified, had died, and had just risen from the dead.

This is the same Jesus who is with us now, just as he was with his disciples on Easter morning, and his words to us are still the same: "Peace be with you."

This sickness is going to run out of steam, eventually. We don't know what these days ahead will bring, but Jesus is with you and with us together in the family of God. And he is working in each of us as we do our parts to protect and care for our neighbors.

I hope we can be together again, soon.

Primary, Kindergarten and 1st Grade

The Primary, Kindergarten, and 1st Grade Sunday School Students started a Lenten project called "Lent in a Dish". Each week, students will hear a Bible story that teaches about Jesus's life and ministry. After the story, they will add items in the dish that symbolize the story they heard. On March 1, students heard the story of Jesus in the wilderness for 40 days, and being tempted and tormented. To symbolize this, students put sand in a dish to represent the desert, and drew a symbol in the sand to represent Jesus.

The Sunday School has put a sample dish in the Narthex. Please take a moment to look at the "Lent in a Dish" display each week and discuss the symbols with your child as they are added.

March 1: Sand (Luke 4:1 - 13) Jesus wandering in the desert

March 8: Rock (Mark 6: 30 – 44) Jesus Feeds 5000 March 15: Pipe cleaner Figure (John 13: 1 – 15) Jesus washes disciples' feet

March 22: Candle (Matthew 5: 14 - 16) Jesus tells his disciples to be a light in the world

March 29: Shell (Matthew 3: 13 – 17) Jesus is baptized

April 5: Grass (Matthew 27: 27 – 61) The death of Jesus
