

As we look forward to the weeks ahead, I'm looking ahead to Christmas in Church. And I'm imagining what Christmas would be like if only a couple people could celebrate it together. Instead of a large meal and a table surrounded by family and close friends, I'm trying to imagine a Christmas with perhaps a simple meal of bread and drink, minus the holiday napkins and good china.

As we plan our Christmas worship for the end of the month, what if we were to find ourselves on that holy night in an empty hall: a truly silent night, absent hundreds of candles burning brightly as we sing. Instead, I'm picturing a Christmas where there's only a simple candle or two, lighting the faces of a young mother, having delivered her firstborn, and a little newborn baby, wrapped tightly in swaddling clothes.

As we plan for this Christmas to come, I'm imagining the very real birth of our Lord Jesus in a stable. That little baby was not surrounded by family and friends and music. If he woke up, it was not by the rustlings of Saint Nicholas delivering his gifts, but by some poor shepherds stumbling into his barn.

The first Christmas was an unusual Christmas, to say the least.

As the following weeks unfold, we may find our houses unusually lacking in holiday company. We may not find ourselves shoulder to shoulder in church, joining a full house

singing "Silent Night." Instead of washing our holiday dishes quickly so we can get to church on time, we may find ourselves gathered around our computer, pulling up our Facebook page to hear our pipe organ belt out "Joy to the World".

This may be a very unusual Christmas, by all familiar standards. Already, our masking and distancing have changed the ways our families get together and how we worship together in church. And if conditions warrant, we may find our Christmas celebrations almost as quiet as that first one in Bethlehem.

But however unusual or familiar our Christmas celebration will be, the truly unusual and unexpected gift of that first holy night is as real today as it was then: Our Lord Jesus, the Son of God, has been born among us.

He didn't come to us for wonderful music and food and candles and the festive sights and sounds that grace our usual Christmas festivities.

He came, instead, for the love of us: to give his very real life for us on the cross and set us free from sin and death.

Dying on the cross, he was born to show us the true heart of God.

We don't know how we'll gather for worship in the weeks to come, or how we'll celebrate Christmas together. But we do know the one who came to us on that holy night. And for that Christmas gift we say, "Thanks be to God."
