If you open your copy of the Farmer's Almanac, you'll find some fun facts: sunset on our shortest day of the year, December 21, should happen at 4:33. As our new year begins, we'll find ourselves with a bit more light, with our New Year's sunset clocking in later at 4:41.

It's not much of an improvement. But if you're thirsting for more light in the sky, we can say that we're headed in the right direction. An extra minute here and an extra minute there, and sooner or later it's going to be Spring.

But as we begin the season of Epiphany, we'll see another kind of light in the sky that doesn't come on slowly, but has suddenly switched on. And this light is showing us Jesus.

Matthew 2:1In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, 2asking, 'Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.'

This literal light in the sky is showing the world that God is now with us. And as the weeks of Epiphany go by, we'll see Jesus, even more clearly.

On the day that he's baptized, our Father in heaven, who put his star in the sky, will say this:

Matthew 3:16And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. 17And a voice from heaven said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved,* with whom I am well pleased.'

And finally, if a star in the sky and the voice of His Father booming from heaven aren't enough to show us he's God, there'll be one more light that will make it all clear before he walks toward his cross:

Matthew 17:1Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. 2And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. 3Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him.

This last light before Easter shows us clearly he's God. But in the gathering darkness of Lent and his death on a cross, you'll clearly see love beyond measure for you.

Have a blessed Epiphany!
