

Every now and then, I head out of town to meet with some friends: drive over to Rossville for lunch or over to Ridgeway, Decorah, or Cresco for Friday night fish fries. And there are a lot of good things to see on the way.

There's a lot of first crop hay that's been chopped or baled up. You can see a few fields of no-till soybeans peaking up through their rye cover crop. And the corn? At the time of my writing, it's still kind of short. It's not taken off like it has in previous years. But by the first week of July, it will have passed the old saying: "knee-high by the Fourth of July."

And yes, it is already July.

For some with deep rural roots a bit further down south, this month has always meant coming together for work in the heat. Neighbors, young and old, men and women, would band together in threshing crews for harvesting oats.

Where a driver and combine can now cut and separate oats in one swoop, leaving a trail of straw in their wake, it took a whole crew to first cut it, then bind it in shocks, haul the shocks to a grain separator—a threshing machine—work the oats with a shovel coming out into wagons, and then hauling and unloading the wagons into your granary.

From a child small enough to crawl in the separator to oil

the internals to the older and stronger who could shovel all day and throw and haul shocks, it took lots of people working together—out in the field and inside the kitchen. All that work couldn't get done without heaping servings of meat and potatoes and pie, and plenty of food ferried out to the field every few hours.

Men and women, the old and the young in this month of July, all got together, being good neighbors, each with a job, pulling in the same direction to the good of each other.

With our modern combines and grain handling, it doesn't take a whole crew, a community to all come together to get this job done. We don't see it happening out in our farms and our fields like we used to. But we see something like it happening here every day: where men and women and children of all races, and classes and creeds are called together by Jesus to be a part of His family and to work together as part of His church.

On these Sundays following Pentecost, Jesus will pull us together and teach us and show us the work that he'd like us to do as His brothers and sisters. He will show us his care. He will show us his love. He will show us and call us to love like He does.

May God bless you and the work that we're doing together.

This was the first in person Assembly since 2019. It was the perfect time to make introductions since the majority of the Synod staff was new. In his presentation, the Bishop emphasized the support of clergy, small congregations, and diversity. The workshop sessions offered opportunities for new information and sharing among the delegates.


#### Book Nook
