The last time I mowed around the house, I scared up some rabbits. And they weren't full grown bunnies from the previous year. When I took a pass past the rhubarb, two little rabbits suddenly bolted, looking for new cover. It was a wonderful sign that Spring had arrived.

And this was just one of the signs of new life in the neighborhood: the peonies and tulips are all showing their leaves and their stems; the trees have been blooming; and I think that there's some sort of bird building a nest in one of my eave spouts.

And my neighbors next door: they marked out a patch on their property, started tilling the ground, and now it's all ready to plant.

As we have all seen these wonderful signs of Spring outside the doors of our houses and churches, we have heard in our worship how new and wonderful life suddenly sprang up early on Easter. And during the days Jesus remained on this earth after he rose, we saw him prepare his disciples for the day when the Holy Spirit would come and for his church of believers to take off and grow.

And the season of growth of the church which began on Pentecost Sunday is the very same growth that is happening now.

The good news of Jesus is not as brand new as it was. And God's Holy Spirit has been with us for ages, and much of the work of the church isn't new. We continue to proclaim the forgiveness of sins and the resurrection of the body. God's Word and God's Spirit continue to bring us together, feeding the

hungry, nursing the sick and loving people that nobody loves.

In this upcoming season following Pentecost, we find ourselves in the same boat as the earliest disciples: God's Holy Spirit is showing us how to share Jesus with people who are suffering from sin and suffering from death and the devil.

These old foes of God's love haven't changed over the years, while new strides in technology make the lives lived by our grandparents seem ancient. Our forefathers understood the words "work, raising a family, and school." But the ways we now do them are stunningly different from past generations.

The church and how we do church is now serving parents who both work, while raising their families and paying their bills. Believers are now called to serve people living alone with no children to help them or love them nearby. We are being called to share Jesus love with children endangered by internet bullying and internet content that's dangerous if lived out in real life. We are called to be a family of God, where sin and the devil are doing their all to keep us judging each other, rejecting each other and forgetting the love of Jesus that we see on his cross.

The season we're entering following Pentecost is the time where the disciples first began to work out how to share Jesus' love as a church. Two thousand years later, we're still doing the same in new times for new people who are living new lives.

That's what we're doing at St. John's. We ask for God's Spirit to open our eyes and our hearts and our minds as we move forward in faith to love others now as Jesus loves us.
