




Middle States Team Visit

Our Middle States Team visited Harrisburg Catholic virtually March 15-18. The team had a full experience of our school through the Middle States Document "Excellence by Design" prepared by our faculty and staff; Zoom sessions with our pastors, the administration, faculty, parents and students; and video clips of each of the spaces within our school.

Following the visit the team presented a report of their observations, commendations and recommendations. We have received this report and are pleased to inform you that Harrisburg Catholic met all 12 Standards set by the Middle States Commission; that there is a system of continuous planning for school improvement in place and that there is a strong commitment to follow the Action Plan of Growth and Improvement. Therefore, the team will be recommending that Harrisburg Catholic is reaccredited to the Middle States Commission for the next seven years. Fifth Grade Participates in Mars Stem Lab with NASA



For several months, the fifth graders participated in a STEM lab with NASA. NASA is working very hard to discover ways to grow plants in space and especially now on Mars, as they hope to send humans to Mars in the next several years. Food is essential for human survival and with limited resources on Mars, NASA is studying ways we can grow food fast with limited water, sources of fertilizer and will grow within a chamber that produces light. With this experiment, our class had to write a proposal to NASA using the scientific method, which included our hypothesis and research about growing plants using fertilizer. This lab lasted eight weeks, that included planting, observation, measurement, and harvesting our radishes. In this lab, we participated in two different trials. The first trial lasted four weeks, which consisted of growing radishes with limited fertilizer. They grew in a chamber that consisted of a different color

spectrum of light, in Mars-like soil. In the first trial, there was limited growth in our radishes. In the second part of our experiment, we decided as

a class on what kind of fertilizer would benefit the growth of our radishes. In the second trial that lasted another four weeks, we decided to use leaves, corn starch and the use of old vegetation, which was our old radishes that we grew in the first experiment. In the second trial our radishes grew faster and taller within the four weeks that were given; unfortunately, there was not much growth in the soil of our radishes. Unfortunately, we discovered that our plants did not grow fast enough within the four weeks that we were allotted. In the end, we discussed the different factors on why this happened



and came up with ideas on how we could possibly change the experiment if we were to do this project again. We are very grateful for the opportunity for our class to participate in this special lab with NASA.



HCES Development and Advancement Update

Thanks to the generous support of many, the 2021-22 school year annual appeal was able to raise \$13,845. We appreciate all who contributed to the appeal this year, which helps the school tremendously!

Many businesses also helped fund scholarships for our students, through the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program. This year for the first time, a soft roll-out of the EITC Special Purpose Entity (SPE) program was made in the fall. The Pennsylvania EITC/OSTC Special Purpose Entity (SPE) Program allows individuals with a PA state



income tax liability in excess of \$3,500 to donate to Harrisburg Catholic Elementary School and receive a PA state tax credit for 90% of their donation each year. The remaining 10% of their donation is a deductible charitable contribution for federal tax purposes. These tax credit contributions will allow Harrisburg Catholic Elementary School to provide scholarships for those students and families most in need. A more comprehensive marketing campaign to promote this to potential donors will be made in the future.

HCES also held its first online silent auction in February 2022. The auction was a success and \$3,500 was raised! Many thanks to 5th grade teacher Sara Wrightstone for organizing the auction. Look for this to continue in the future!

HCES is pursuing various grant opportunities through PA, Dauphin County, the city of Harrisburg and private foundations and businesses in order to provide needed financial assistance for the operations of the school. We thank all those businesses that have supported the school in so many different ways! In addition, HCES offers many thanks to the support and efforts of state Senator John DiSanto (R-Dauphin, Perry)), state Representative Patty Kim (D-Dauphin, Cumberland) and Congressman Scott Perry (R-Cumberland, York)!
