### A Letter from Pastor Bo

April – Christ, the Victor

Reflecting on the texts we will be hearing this coming April, what stands out is how Jesus Christ overcomes all odds to be the champion of the world, the victor over sin, death and the devil.

Throughout Holy Week, we will see Jesus Christ get pummeled.

Everything is thrown at him that can be thrown at him. And he takes it. He loves his enemies. Faithfulness to God and love for humanity keeps him going. But will that final knockout blow he takes be the end of the bout?

Palm Sunday/Passion Sunday (April 2<sup>nd</sup>), the kids will lead us to acclaiming Christ as King with palms. But he's a different kind of King, coming in on a donkey. On Maundy Thursday (April 6<sup>th</sup> at 7) we will discover that the King is a sacrificial Lamb. On Good Friday (April 7<sup>th</sup> at 7), we will see the ultimate battle between love and death – both seem to win; your worldview determines what you believe. At Easter Vigil (April 8<sup>th</sup> at 5), we begin to crack open the first sign of a verdict as to who the last man standing will be.

On Easter (April 9<sup>th</sup> at 7 and 10), don't miss it. We will see another dramatic presentation (oh, boy, putting the pressure on myself to come up with something new) about how Christ is the Victor over our divisions. I can't wait to see what I have to say about that! But it's not just something that I say – it's something that we get to live out together!

On April 16<sup>th</sup>, Christ is Victor over despair. We will not just die and decay and that's it, any more than that was the end for Jesus.

The next two weeks, Jesus will personally invite us into his victory, in mirror image from the previous two weeks.

On April 23<sup>rd</sup>, Jesus invites us into his victory over death and despair through repentance, baptism, and receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit. We can live a new life of freedom and victory.

And on April 30th, Jesus invites us to share in his victory over division by taking part in the life of this community called Church. I believe one of our young folks will be telling us all about that.

Don't you think you and those you know need to hear something about victorious living? Don't miss a service in April!

# **Food Pantry Report**

February may be known as "the short month" but there was plenty of action at the Cupboard. First of all, you by now have noticed our name change. For years we were the "Pantry at St. John's Lutheran" in an effort to not exclude our co-sponsoring churches, Church of the Advent, Hatboro Baptist, and Redeemer Lutheran, Jamison. Given that we are no longer a stand-alone pantry but are networking with other agencies and churches in the area to combat food insecurity we have changed our name to

more correctly reflect what we do and how we do it. Our focus is still to operate the pantry but we now also work with other nearby pantries such as Lehman Methodist, Willow Grove Baptist, and Jesus Focus Ministries in Southampton. We have had a long history dating back to before the pandemic of working with Moreland Towers and Charter Arms living facilities. Recently we have been able to help Hatboro Baptist with their meal program. Thus, we felt it was time to rename our operation.

February is also known for the Super Bowl and while the Eagles may not have won, the clients at the Cupboard were winners. Thanks to the "Souper Bowl" efforts of both Redeemer Lutheran, Jamison and Hatboro Baptist special collections were held and the Cupboard is now well stocked with soup products.

Use of the Cupboard was up by 48 families in February 2023 for a total of 251. Plus, 96 additional bags of food were provided to families of 5 or more members for a total of 347 bags of basic food items being distributed. The news media has recently made mention of the curtailment of SNAP benefits that were enhanced during the pandemic. In the last two we weeks of the month we saw 12 new client families so that our registered family count is now in excess of 200 families. We will continue to track and note any potential increases in registration and usage.

Registration Forms and information for volunteers are currently available by request through Abbie Metheny or the Church Office, and will soon be available on the website as well.








