Psalm 71:1-6 (Read Responsively)

- ¹ In you, O Lord, have I taken refuge; let me never be put to shame.
- ² In your righteousness, deliver me and set me free; incline your ear to me and save me.
- ³ Be my strong rock, a castle to keep me safe; you are my crag and my stronghold.
- ⁴ Deliver me, my God, from the hand of the wicked, from the clutches of the evildoer and the oppressor.
- ⁵ For you are my hope, O Lord God, my confidence since I was young.
- ⁶ I have been sustained by you ever since I was born; from my mother's womb you have been my strength; my praise shall be always of you.

Hebrews 12:18-29

¹⁸ You have not come to something that can be touched, a blazing fire, and darkness, and gloom, and a tempest, ¹⁹ and the sound of a trumpet, and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that not another word be spoken to them. ²⁰ (For they could not endure the order that was given, "If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned to death." ²¹ Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear.") ²² But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, ²³ and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, ²⁴ and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

²⁵ See that you do not refuse the one who is speaking, for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we

reject the one who warns from heaven! ²⁶ At that time his voice shook the earth, but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heaven." ²⁷ This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of what is shaken—that is, created things—so that what cannot be shaken may remain. ²⁸ Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us show gratitude, by which we may offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe, ²⁹ for indeed our God is a consuming fire.

You are the King of Israel!" 50 Jesus answered, "Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? 

Lift up your hearts.


We lift them to the Lord.

Eucharistic Prayer
