April 2024 - Better Together

Food Pantry Report

This has been a month of surprises, most of which have been good ones. A lot of people were surprised to see snow fall for the first time in two years and that forced the Cupboard to close on a Tuesday which is our busiest day of the week.

The first full week of February saw us hit a new record for numbers of families served in a week's time. Serving 120 families easily surpassed the previous record of 111 families served in a week's time.

We added 24 new families to list of registered families during the month.

We were able to receive unexpected donations from Garden of Health in North Wales. This included much needed cereal and allowed us to restock the shelves following setting the attendance record.

Redeemer Lutheran participated in The Outreach Program where they packed fortified pasta with tomato basil sauce dinners. Each package was meant to serve 6 and 36 packages were in a case. They were well received by our clients and by the end of the month we had received 10 cases (360 meals) from them. A huge effort and a generous gift.

VBS Volunteer Information

We can't have VBS without our volunteers! We need a lot of help to run each session.

Group Leaders are responsible for taking their group of kids (broken down by age group) from station to station. Group Leaders are with the same group of kids all day. The different age groups are Pre-K & Kindergarten, 1st-3rd Grade, and 4th-6th Grade. We need two adults with each group.

Station Leaders are responsible for running their stations: Games, Snack, Lesson, Music, Craft, and Science. Station Leaders are provided with a book with the lessons, crafts, etc. explained. Most even have a script, so it's easy to teach! Only one adult is needed to teach each station, though the more, the merrier!

Youth Volunteers entering 7th grade and up are welcome to join us as a helping hand! They can help with groups or stations.


Ladies' Lunch Bunch

Last Month's Answers:

- The Reverend Charles Brobst of St. Paul's Church in Telford conceived the idea of establishing St. John's Lutheran Church in 1948
- The Reverend Orval Hartman was the first pastor called to St. John's. He was called as a Mission Developer in January 1949 and with 68 Charter Members, St. John's was organized by the Norristown Conference of the Ministerium of PA on April 24, 1949.
- 3. When was our church building built? The first building program was started in 1950 with the completion and dedication on December 21, 1952. At that time there were 225 confirmed members and 260 enrolled in the Sunday Church school. The second building program was begin in 1954 to construct and Educational Building with the completion and dedication in November 1956.


