A Letter from Pastor Bo August – Striving with God, Striving with Human Beings

The Genesis texts continue the story of Jacob and his family line, and all the texts spring out of the name 'Israel,' which is given to Jacob in our text on August 6th. This name means 'strives with God,' because God says to Jacob 'You have striven with God and with humans and have prevailed' (Gen 32.28). A chief family characteristic is that we struggle – with God, with ourselves, with each other, and with the world.

On August 6th, we will see how Jacob wrestles with God – literally – at a key moment in the arc of Jacob's storyline. Do you know what you're often doing when you are wrestling with God? You are wrestling with yourself. That's deeeeeep. Carl Jung thinks stories about conflict between twins also represent one's struggle with oneself. Hmmm. We might have a lot of reflecting to do as we ponder this story.

On August 13th, we see Jacob's children severely mistreat their own brother Joseph. They almost kill him but then decide to sell him. Being a part of God's beloved people doesn't mean we reflect this belovedness to each other. We need to tell the truth. We are sinners even while we are saints.

On August 20th, we see the end of that story as we see Joseph, exalted in Egypt and extending grace and forgiveness to his brothers. We struggle on this earth, but the goal of the struggle is not to win as much as it is to reconcile and make peace with. Not a fuzzy overlooking of wrong, but truth, repentance, forgiveness, and reconciliation. Hence the need to struggle within ourselves and with God as well.

On August 27th, the text at the beginning of Exodus unmasks the struggle we constantly have, 'not with flesh and blood, but with the powers and authorities of this dark age' (Ephesians 6). The opening to Exodus reveals to us what insecurities lie behind every misused and oppressive power wielded in this world, and the strategies those who are secure in their God use to subvert and resist.

Now that I just laid August out like that, I'm really looking forward to covering these messages. That sounds like a powerful sermon series! And it will help us as we move into the grind of the fall, where there will be much striving with God, ourselves, and people, as there always is. But the word of God can help us live into the ultimate purpose and sustaining promises in the midst of the struggle.

June is a month filled with observances, graduations, Father's Day, weddings just to identify the traditional ones. We sadly said "good bye" to our Abington High School students. That means we have immediate openings for volunteers. Our greatest need is Monday nights from 5:30 to 7:00ish for set up (no clients) and Thursday night from 5:30 to 8:00 to serve clients. We joyfully accepted major donations from the June Hatboro Cruise Night on June 16. That day also saw the Hatboro Horsham School District Food Services donate items as the school year ended. We ending up sharing some that bounty with Moreland Towers and Charter Arms. See our Facebook page for pictures.

We thank Grocery Outlet for donations. Though it was still June the "Independence from Hunger" campaign that lasts the entire month of July actually began in late June. Donate \$5, a bag gets filled with product, you get a \$5 coupon for your next shopping trip. There are pictures on Facebook of this as well.

June 2023 saw 26 more clients served than we had in 2022. 90 of these clients were families of 5 or more and so they received 2 bags of basic products. That is a total of 423 basic bags. That doesn't include the bread, pastries, and the cold items such as meat and milk.

We had 31 new families register in June That gives us 289 families on our registration books.

We thank you for your continued support of this growing community ministry combating food insecurity.





Vacation Bible School Day 1

Day 1 of VBS was all about fish! We made fishing rods in snack, made fish in craft, and learned about the time the disciple Peter realized that Jesus is God's son when Peter was fishing all night and caught nothing, but when Jesus told him to go try again, he caught so many fish the nets broke, and they needed another boat to



help pull in all the fish!











The theme of our second day was walking on water. Our teddy grahams walked on icing in snack, we made boats in craft, and our lesson taught us that while we know a lot about Jesus walking on water, Peter was there above the waves, too! But when he got scared, he started to sink, and Jesus was right there to help him back up. We learned that Jesus cares about us, even when we're scared.











On Wednesday, we learned that Jesus loves us. Our lesson showed us that Jesus forgave Peter for denying him 3 times the night he was arrested, and after Jesus' resurrection, Jesus cooked fish for breakfast for the disciples and asked Peter 3 times if he loved him, and Peter said yes all 3 times. In snack we had some breakfast foods (not fish!), and in craft we painted our shirts for the parent program!














Thursday's message was that Jesus wants us to tell people about him. Our bible story told us that Peter and John once healed a man who couldn't walk, and they were arrested for sharing the good news about Jesus in the temple (see the photos of the temples we built!). Even though they were arrested, they knew Jesus wanted them to tell others about him, so they didn't stop. In snack we made a tic-tac-toe game out of pretzels and cookies, and in craft we made a game. And in music, we made sure we were ready for the parent program!!

Friday was our last day, but we still had a lot to do and learn! Our last lesson of the week taught us that Jesus loves everyone! Our story was about the Roman soldier Cornelius, and how he broke rules to invite Peter into his home to learn about Jesus. After we heard the story, we went fishing for the words to spell out our verse of the week: "Show me your ways, God; teach me to follow you." (Psalm 25:4). In snack we ate leftovers from Thursday's parent program, and in games we did an even bigger obstacle course! At the end of the day, we all got together to play pew battleship. Even Pastor Bo played along!














Youth News & Events
