# A Letter from Pastor Bo February 2024 – A God Who's Bigger

Grace and Peace! Is this newsletter catching you in a moment of winter hibernation? All good! But Easter's coming early, and before you know it! Which means Lent is also starting early – Valentine's Day! Looking at the texts for February, it seems we ought to be reflecting just on how big and mysterious and magnanimous God is. We can't fit God in a box! God seems to

do whatever God wants to do, and it's always surprising, especially in the area of grace and mercy and how much God is working in people we least expect.

February 4<sup>th</sup> – "Have you not known? Have you not heard?" Thus begins the famous passage from Isaiah 40, a monologue meant to blow us away with just how God is so much bigger than our understanding. We may encounter situations where it's difficult to know where God is, but we can count on the fact that God is strengthening us, and giving us 'wings like eagles.' Not sure what our favorite team is going to be doing this week before the Super Bowl, but in the big scheme of things, we can be sure of God's presence and empowerment for us!

February 11<sup>th</sup>, Transfiguration – Apparently, Jesus can shine. And apparently, Elijah is going to leave this world in a fiery chariot and fiery horses taking him up to heaven. Let's take up his prophetic mantle, and not limit God by our own imaginations, but expect even greater things from God.

February 14<sup>th</sup>, Valentine's Ash Wednesday – God is holy. Let us heed the call to contrition and repentance, specifically of acting as though our own agenda is more important than God's. Let's surrender ourselves to God's bigger story, that of reconciliation and grace.

February 18<sup>th</sup> – While God is big, and there is an unpredictability to God, we see God, after the flood, promising limits on God we can count on. God is going to have forbearance with humanity and creation always, and is not going to destroy the creation. God's commitment to and patience with all of us is bigger than we can imagine.

February 25th – God invites Abraham's family to participate in God's vastness. Abraham's family is going to be a blessing to all the families of the earth. We are recipients of that promise, and we get to continue to work in trust to see its ultimate fulfillment.

During this shortest month of the year, let's 'leap' into a much bigger world with a much bigger God.

Also, we need help on Monday nights. This is a set up night so lifting may be involved. It too starts at 5:30PM and we try to end by 7:30PM. Clients do not come on Mondays. Please use the above contact information if you can help.

Do you get Nutrisystem or other products in really large styrofoam containers? We need these for putting out our meat selections. Generally, these are 8" or more in depth and have a lid. If you or your neighbor have any, please drop them off anytime the Cupboard is open (see above nights; Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday from 10:00AM until 12:45PM)

We are extremely grateful for all the regular donors and holiday donors that have contributed this past December. We received monetary donations to restock our shelves. We received product donations as well for the same purpose. And, we got holiday meal items so that we were able to provide 86 turkeys and fixings. Any client who wished a holiday meal was able to receive one.

We served 367 families in December of 2023, the highest since 2021 for the month. Additionally, 140 bags were provided to families claiming 5 members or more. That totals 507 bags of basic food items in addition to personal care items, pet food, snack items, bread, desserts, produce, meat, milk and eggs.

We are working on our end of year summary report now. As always, we are very thankful for your prayers and support.

#### **Fastnacht Afternoon**




