## A Letter from Pastor Bo January – Onward in Mission

Reflecting on the texts we will be hearing this coming January, the message I get from them is, "We've got work to do!" It's exciting work, it's fun work, and it's blessed work. We are equipped and empowered to cooperate with God for the benefit of the world! What an exciting privilege! I so look forward to exploring this with you and seeing what God does in our midst!

We begin, as all of God's works begin, from a place of blessedness. January 1<sup>st</sup> is the Feast of the Holy Name, when Jesus was circumcised and given the name Jesus. Our Old Testament passage in Numbers 6 is the great priestly blessing spoken over the people of God unconditionally. It's good to know we have the grace of God's blessedness before we do anything to earn it.

Which leads us to baptism. On January 8<sup>th</sup>, we will remember Jesus' baptism, and our own baptism into him. Before doing anything at all, God said, "This is my Beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." Jesus also wants us to know that God feels the same about each of us. The Isaiah 42 passage we will focus on speaks of the Spirit's empowerment for our service to God.

On January 15<sup>th</sup>, we realize through Isaiah 49 that what God will use us for is so much bigger than our imaginations, and so much bigger than restoring what was done in the past. In John 1, Jesus invites us on a journey to "Come and see" what all he is up to.

On January 22<sup>nd</sup>, Isaiah 9 reminds us of the kind of joy we have as we engage in the mission of God. Matthew 4 describes the joy as being so great, people willingly have their lives interrupted to get closer to Jesus.

And on January 29<sup>th</sup>, Micah sums up the three dimensions of our mission on earth – do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God. This pairs perfectly with the Beatitudes in Matthew 5, where Jesus brings us back to the life that is blessed. This is youth Sunday, and I believe we will get to hear their thoughts on the matter.

Church, it's a new year. Let's get ready to roll up our sleeves and participate in the mission of God to bless this world around us. We have such good news! We can offer the kinds of things people so desperately need! You have gifts that can get us there! You are blessed and equipped! It's going to be a fun year!

### **Food Pantry Report**

Our first Thanksgiving campaign since returning to the client choice model was a huge success. Supported by the four co-sponsoring churches, numerous individuals, businesses and non-profits we were able to distribute 35 more turkeys than were distributed last year for a total of 105. That represents a major accomplishment. We actually were able to share some late arriving frozen turkeys with Hatboro Baptist for their bi-weekly community dinner program.

The final tally for November is 388 families receiving a total of 500 bags of food. This measurement does not include bread, pastry, cold items, frozen meats, eggs, or milk.

We are awaiting word from Philabundance as we have applied to participate in one of their programs that would align us with a grocery chain store.

We are in short supply of both paper and plastic bags and are currently investigating ways to be both environmentally conscious and have a means for our clients to transport their selections.

The plans for the Christmas distribution are very similar to what we did on Thanksgiving. We thank all who have helped make this Thanksgiving season a joyous one for so many of our families. We look forward to being able to repeat this benevolence this Christmas season with your support. Thank you.



Advent Family Night – Back in November we celebrated the beginning of Advent with a potluck, crafts, tree decorating and singing carols together.



**Music Sunday –** On December 11, about 25 musicians, as well as other volunteers and our Minister of Music, Michael Brinkworth, put on a beautiful Music Sunday program for 180 people! It was lovely for our sanctuary to be filled with music as our pews were filled with people!
