#### A Letter from Pastor Bo

July - The Dog Days of Summer Heat

When it gets hot, our character can be tested. Sometimes it's the weather, and sometimes life turns up the heat. I tend not to think of it so much as God arranging scenarios that drive us up the wall, but that nevertheless, we get into stuck in moments that we can't get out of, and our goal is to be faithful to God and love others in the midst of them.

The Old Testament texts in July have a theme of testing. (I almost wrote texting, but that would be weird.) We think of testing as a scary thing, and we are right in that, but the good thing is, we can pass the test and awesome things result. We can also fail the test and God's grace brings about awesome things anyway.

The first week in July (July 2<sup>nd</sup>) is the major one that speaks of testing. The whole deal with Abraham being willing to sacrifice Isaac is a very disturbing story to many, and yet it is referenced many times throughout the Old and New Testament. I may be able to give you a way to look at this story in a way that is more in alignment with the loving Father we come to know through Christ.

On July 9<sup>th</sup> (the day before my 24<sup>th</sup> anniversary), we will see Abraham's trusted servant go and test which local women would be a good wife for Abraham's son Isaac. I still have no idea what I'm going to do with that text, so this one is putting me to the test!

July 16<sup>th</sup> looks at three trials – Rebekah and Isaac unable to conceive, but then the trials that come with the children they do eventually conceive. Esau is the firstborn, and his character is put to the test by his younger brother, and Esau fails the test. How did God meet them in the midst of their trials, all the good times and all the bad times? We'll find out then.

July 23<sup>rd</sup> shows us God's faithfulness to us throughout every test, as God gave unconditional promises to wily Jacob while he was exiled from his family. This week's gospel lesson has Jesus reminding us not to harshly judge people too early!

July 30th – wow, what a mess. I'm just glad I'm not preaching this one. The test that comes when waking up with a different person than the one you thought you married the night before! The Old Testament can be wild. Let's just say Jacob's love for Rachel was tested, and he passed the test! Harry may need to lean into the Gospel this day, which says that God's work starts very small and insignificant, but it eventually takes over everything. The family that comes from Jacob and his wives can also be described this way.

Let's help each other remain faithful over the life's dog days. That's why we have this thing called church, because no one can face life alone!

The month of May has proven the validity of the name change to reflect a wider positioning of the operation to be more than just the food pantry. Interacting with other efforts against food insecurity both in a donor roll as well as a recipient roll have marked this past month.

For a long time we have been able to share sliced bread and pastries with representatives from Moreland Towers and Charter Arms apartment operations. They in turn have given us extra meat products beyond their needs during distributions by Bucks County Opportunity Council. We have been able to weekly share our additional excess bread products such as rolls and unsliced bread. Every Friday a donation has been delivered to Jesus Focus Ministries in Southampton.

We were the recipients of a hugely successful "Stamp Out Hunger" drive by the postal workers of the Hatboro Post Office. It took 9 of our volunteers several hours to secure the donations delivered from 7 different postal routes. Additionally, a trip to the Post Office filled a van with the late donations.

The Chamber of Commerce began their summer Cruise Nights on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday night. Participants are asked to make a donation to the pantry operations in Hatboro. We received another van full of donated items.

We have been able to give a large supply of meat entrée items to both Church of the Advent and Hatboro Baptist for their weekly free meal campaigns held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday night and the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday nights respectively.

On Memorial Day we received a large donation of salads, sandwiches, bread from Willow Grove Baptist. Monday is a normal day of operation for them but they were closed for the holiday and would not open again until Thursday.

It has been a very busy month serving 334 families with 98 of those families being of a size large enough to receive a 2<sup>nd</sup> bag of basic items. That means a total of 422 bags of product were distributed.

We thank you for your continued prayers and support.


#### Men's Breakfast




