A Letter from Pastor Bo

May 2024 - As Above, So Below

Leading up to Trinity Sunday (May 26th) we have a chance to explore each of the persons of the Trinity. So May can be Trinity month. Why this is important: In April, we talked about community, and what kind of community results from the resurrection of Christ. In May, we learn about the community that always exists in God, in whose image we are made, and this is the community we are called to mirror as we bear God's image in the world. As God is essentially a loving community of Three and One, we also form community in which we are unity, but not all the same.

May 5th – The person whom Jesus calls 'Father' is pure love. We know the Father's love through Jesus. We abide in God's love through a relationship with Jesus and doing what love requires in day-to-day situations.

May 12th— The Son of God was with the Father from the beginning, and has taken up flesh to live among us. He is different from the world, and sets apart believers to be separate from the world (in values and practices) and yet in union with one another, according to the character traits and teachings of Christ.

May 19th – Pentecost. The Spirit is given to the disciples, and the Spirit is sent out, representing the Father and the Son, guiding a community of people from diverse backgrounds into unity, reminding the community of who we are and whose we are.

May 26th – Trinity Sunday. Father, Son, and Spirit work together to send us forth on mission to make all humanity and all the world reflect the glory of God.

You don't want to miss a week of May.

Food Pantry Report

The month of March has been something of a whirlwind. Our average number of families served per week was 95. Consider that the 2023 weekly average was 81. Numbers of clients has been increasing since last fall.

Despite this increase in demand, we have been blessed with the ability to offer a special holiday meal to any family that was interested. While we had hams, we also had turkey breasts for those who might not want ham. Plus, we had lasagna dinners for those who might not wish to have meat. Engineering all of this took a lot of time and refrigeration space. We thank those of you donated your grocery store gift receipt to collect a ham or a lasagna dinner.

We were called upon once again to offer immediate help to family from a Hatboro-Horsham Elementary school community. We are working to establish a relationship within the district and particularly to connect with the counselors at the schools where need may be the greatest.

Simmons Elementary School in the Hatboro-Horsham District conducted a food drive. Directed by assistant principal, Dr. Robert Campman, the 5th grade classes a few years ago started an annual tradition of conducting a collection which is then shared with the pantry at Lehman Methodist and with us at Hatboro Community Cupboard. This campaign has been deliberately timed for when our needs are great but the donation stream may be slowing in the post-holiday period. Thank you to the students and families of Simmons Elementary.

Also, we are looking for a driver on alternate Tuesdays to share driving to Bensalem to pick up produce at 11:30. This will be during the growing season, most likely June to September. Please contact Alan at 205-675-1298 if you are interested or have questions.

VBS Volunteer Information

We can't have VBS without our volunteers! We need a lot of help to run each session.

Group Leaders are responsible for taking their group of kids (broken down by age group) from station to station. Group Leaders are with the same group of kids all day. The different age groups are Pre-K & Kindergarten, 1st-3rd Grade, and 4th-6th Grade. We need two adults with each group.

Station Leaders are responsible for running their stations: Games, Snack, Lesson, Music, Craft, and Science. Station Leaders are provided with a book with the lessons, crafts, etc. explained. Most even have a script, so it's easy to teach! Only one adult is needed to teach each station, though the more, the merrier!

Youth Volunteers entering 7th grade and up are welcome to join us as a helping hand! They can help with groups or stations.


Music Sunday

- 1. The new church school building was dedicated on Sunday, November 4, 1956. St. John's was the first church in ministerium history to complete a second building in less than 10 years from its original date.
- St. John's celebrated its 31st anniversary and burned the mortgage for \$500,000 started in 1964 on April 27, 1980. The church membership was 925 adults and 150 children enrolled in Sunday School.

Last Month's Trivia Answers:

- The third building program was started in January 1963 and completed in September 1964. This provided extended educational facilities and a new church sanctuary.
- A weekly Contemporary Service was added on Saturday nights beginning January 1, 1969.

Finance Corner

March Financial Update

We have closed out the first quarter of 2024 and are still tracking for a \$47,000 deficit this year. Attendance was up slightly in March largely due to Easter occurring in March instead of April as it did last year. General income was down \$3500 due to the Easter holiday collections being posted in April. Our year to date deficit increased to \$17,716 which was less than budgeted only because we have not paid the \$8500 due for the audit. Had that charge been paid we would have been at budget for the deficit for the first quarter. The minor adjustments we have made to reduce expenses were offset by an additional \$2000 in roof repairs. We will continue to review all of our contracts and look for opportunities to reduce expenses but additional income is the primary avenue to reduce the deficit.

Roof Update

Earlier this year we replaced the roof over the church office and library, and we are working to raise the \$53,000 needed. An anonymous donor is matching \$6,000 from funds raised in the month of March. Our final count for the month of March was \$9,334.42. With the match from our anonymous donor, that adds over \$15,000 to our Roof Fund. We appreciate everyone who donated in March, and everyone who will continue to donate to get us to our goal. 
