## A Letter from Pastor Bo November – The Work Continues

'Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us' (Hebrews 12.1). At the end of October, Moses dies before getting to the Promised Land. But God is faithful to promises made, and the people get there, and continue to have challenges along the way. Through Joshua, Deborah, and multiple shepherds good and bad, God continues to fulfill eternal purposes through God's people. The saints who have gone before us continue to inspire us.

November 5<sup>th</sup>— The departure from Egypt was marked by the crossing of the Red Sea. The entrance into Canaan is now marked by crossing the Jordan River in the same fashion. This day we remember those who have crossed that river into glory, which is prefigured by our baptism.

November 12<sup>th</sup> – Now Joshua's work is done. Will the people continue to be faithful to God, as God is faithful to them. This is a great and rousing speech to close off Joshua's life, and the people respond that each of their households will continue to follow God. (Hint: They aren't so great at keeping that promise.

November 19<sup>th</sup> – Deborah to the rescue. When little Israel becomes swamped by hordes of powerful foreign oppressors, women save the day with courage and guile.

November 26<sup>th</sup> – Christ the King. No other leader like him. Ezekiel promises that God will come to personally shepherd Israel, with strength and tenderness. Jesus embodies this *par excellence*. Come and worship him to close out the liturgical year before Advent.

#### **Food Pantry Report**



Have you ever considered doing something for the benefit of the community? A form of public service, perhaps? If so, the Hatboro Community Cupboard has immediate openings for volunteers on Monday and Thursday nights. Monday night is set up night and starts at 5:30pm until about 7pm. It does involve some lifting but does not involve client contact. Thursday night also starts around 5:30pm for volunteers and involves serving clients from 6pm to 7:50 pm. The month of September was not as busy as September 2022 or August 2023. Still, 342 families were served. 105 of those were families of 5 or more members so they got a 2<sup>nd</sup> bag for basic commodities. That is 447 bags of packaged goods going out in a month's time.

There were 23 new families added to our registrations during the month. That gives us 369 families registered for 2023. Our average number of families served is running around 85 per week.

We were blessed with yet another major donation from the Chamber of Commerce's Cruise Night on September 15. Church of the Advent delivered their August collection of toilet paper as well as a substantial financial donation. We have been able to redirect the extra bread and pastry that previously went to Moreland Towers and Charter Arms. We now deliver twice each week to Jesus Focus Ministries in Southampton as they are open 5 days per week. They in turn have provided an abundance of individual snack items which we have passed along to HATPacks for their use. HATPacks needs 360 units for each of their distributions and we have transported enough product to complete this number 8 times. It is indeed a blessing to see the "community" part of our name being fulfilled.

Our donation stream of meat has slowed to a trickle. Thankfully, Warminster Grocery Outlet made a spontaneous donation of chicken. They followed that up with a second donation of a variety of products and commodities.

HATPacks distributed a flyer to each family that they serve in the Hatboro-Horsham school district that listed the Cupboard days and times. We hope this will increase community awareness of our availability.

We thank you all for your continued donations, support and prayers.
















## Youth News & Events





#### **Holiday Parade**




