August has proven to be a busy month for many reasons. We had 5 full weeks of being open which produced the largest number of clients served in the month of August since we have been keeping records. There were 420 families served of which 139 were large families of 5 or more so they received an extra bag of basic items. We came close to setting new daily records with 45 clients on August 8 and 42 clients on August 22. We signed up 37 new families in the month.

We still have need for volunteers. We are especially in need of help on Monday night in restocking (no client contact) from 5:30pm to 7:00ish (this does involve lifting) as well as our Thursday night team serving clients from about 5:30pm to 7:50pm.

We have been blessed with a myriad of donations this month. On the 3rd Friday night, the Chamber of Commerce held their monthly cruise night from which we received a car load of donations. Caliber Collision of Hatboro conducted a packaged goods drive during the month. We were delighted that PECO Gas Operations and Union Local 614 presented us with a check for \$3,250 generated from employee donations during July. Church of the Advent had a matching challenge to their congregation for toilet paper (an expensive monthly purchase for us otherwise).

Two volunteers that kept us connected to Moreland Towers and Charter Arms (high-rise, lowincome housing in Hatboro and Warminster, respectively) decided to retire at the end of the month. We will miss them greatly. At the present time we are moving the excess bread and pastry that they delivered to increasing the donation that we share with Jesus Focus Pantry in Southampton.

As always, we are grateful for your continued prayers and support.




Haunted House & Spooky Dinner

Soup & Sandwich Book Spotlight An Imperfection in the Kitchen Floor A novel about family, food, and fortitude





An Imperfection in the Kitchen Floor tells the story of two women who, despite living one hundred years apart, face similar sacrifices, difficult decisions, and self-imposed perfection that many women will recognize in their own lives.

Molly moves to an old house that only her husband loves, giving up her job, apartment and, when the baby is born, her autonomy. Her husband's busy work schedule leaves her as the sole caregiver of their colicky baby, and Molly must reconcile her own self-doubt and find happiness in a life she didn't expect.

Tish lives in the same house a century earlier and yearns to leave behind the family delicatessen to travel west and paint the country's landscape. When a commuter train crashes, killing the riders on board, the tragedy hits close to home and Tish must choose between the family who needs her and the life she originally envisioned.

Heather has a degree in Art History from the George Washington University and a degree in Culinary Arts from Walnut Hill College. She lives in a historic home in Willow Grove, with her husband and two children.


