# A Letter from Pastor Bo December 2025 Prepare the Way

Matthew's presentation of the coming of Christ is not as much comfort and joy as we want. More like discomfort and struggle. Yes, that which we need, for which we have been hoping and longing, indeed is coming. But making space for such a gift is something we don't often think about in our holiday rituals. We may have saved up enough for presents, but what is the true cost of accommodating Salvation? We do not purchase God's salvation, but faith also looks like buy-in. Or surrender of destructive ways in order to be free and healthy.

**December 7**<sup>th</sup> – **Baptized By Water, But Not Without Fire.** John the Baptist is on the scene, ready to rebuke sinners and eat locusts, and he's all out of locusts. We are spending the season hoping for the coming of the Lord and of peace on earth, but John tells us that if we're waiting for that to happen when other people change, we're waiting for the wrong things. We are the ones who need to make way for the reign of God.

**December 14**th – I'II... Catch the Next Messiah.
"God, sometimes you just don't come through. Do you need a woman to look after you?" – Tori Amos. Advent is a season of waiting. Yes, so we've heard. We've been waiting for a long time for things. When do we give up? Jesus draws our attention to signs of the kingdom in our midst, and gently encourages us not to stumble over our own disappointments.

November 7, 2025

October brought an unexpected increase in client visits due to the threat of stopping the SNAP benefits on November 1. We registered 63 new families! We served 468 families during the month.

We continue to restock using the MAHN grant in addition to the generous donations received from our partner churches as well as our other corporate donors. Grocery Outlet conducted a food drive for the pantry on October 11 and 12. We filled several SUV's with food as well as cash donations from the Grocery Outlet patrons.

We were blessed with an abundance of pork roasts enabling us to supply Church of the Advent with meat for some of their community meals.

We are currently soliciting donations of turkeys and all of the fixings to hopefully provide a Thanksgiving meal to all of our clients. We have received our first few turkeys with more on the way. Every year we have worried that we would not have enough turkeys but God has always provided. Giant Foods in Horsham saves the turkey certificates that are turned in from their customers and exchanges them for turkeys for our pantry. We are truly blessed to live in such a caring, compassionate community.

We continue to search for a substitute team leader. We are confident that the right person is out there. We just have to be patient.

As always, we are grateful for our volunteers and all of the organizations that support us in our efforts to provide food for those in need.

Due to the two large "Fill a Cop Car" food drives I do not have a current needs list but will provide one as soon as we inventory all of the donations.




#### **Team Spirit Fundraiser**


