A Letter from Pastor Bo June 2025

Wow. I did not plan this, but I see it. June has a nice chiasm of readings. A chiasm is where there is a pattern of statements or stories that goes like this:

It could be any number of items, but the important thing is that the beginning and end match, and middle sections according to the pattern, and the heart of the matter is found in the middle. It's called a chiasm because the Greek letter X is called chi, and you can see that the pattern looks like the left half of an X. (You can also diagram it with any half of an X.) Scholars find it all over the Bible.

I look at June and here's what I see.

A. June 1 – Ascension of Jesus

B. June 8 - Wind, Fire, Spirit at Pentecost

C. June 15 – Trinity

B. June 22 - Wind, Fire, Spirit for Elijah

A. June 29 – Ascension of Elijah

This will be fun to explore our relationship to Jesus, the Spirit, and one another in light of our Trinitarian God. The last two weeks have us going back to our Summer and Fall journey through the Old Testament. Two years ago, we journeyed through the time before Israel's kings (Genesis through Ruth). Last year we went over the time of Israel's first kings (Samuel, Kings, and some Wisdom Literature associated with King Solomon.) This year is all about the prophets, starting with guy who is credited with kicking off the major prophetic movement, Elijah. There were prophets in Israel before Elijah and Elisha, but the prophets

who have books named after them come after these two, and Elijah and Elisha set the tone for prophets as bearers of the message of social justice and fidelity to Israel's God. We will journey through a lot of those prophetic books this summer and fall.

Food Pantry Report

May 9, 2025

It is with a heavy heart that I prepare this report for the food pantry. Our beloved Alan has been called home and we all miss him dearly. The pantry was so important to him and I know he would want us to continue on with our mission to serve the families suffering with food insecurity. We can never replace him but we will do our best to make him proud.

We took possession of the new freezer in April. It was a challenge getting it into the pantry and we are extremely grateful to Darren, Jaret and CJ from the property committee as well as Chad from our Thursday night crew who labored for over three hours to get it into the pantry and then into the fridge/freezer room. This is a huge benefit and we cannot forget to thank our generous donor for providing the funds to make the purchase. What a welcome addition it is.

Attendance in April was up. We served 441 families which is an increase over last year. Thanks to Holy Redeemer Lutheran Church for providing more than 20 hams and Giant Foods for contributing 25 hams and 15 lasagnas for our Easter dinner distribution. These were supplemented by numerous donors that stopped by and dropped off hams as well. Due to these efforts we were able to provide 106 Easter dinners to our clients. Everyone who wanted a dinner was given a choice of ham, turkey, lasagna or duck. Yes, duck! It is a Ukrainian favorite.

After our distribution to the clients we were able to provide 14 hams to Church of the Advent for their Easter community dinner.

At the end of April we were blessed to receive Church of the Advent's food donation match consisting of 186 jars of peanut butter, 114 cans of potatoes, and 570 packages of Ramen noodle soup.

As always, we are grateful for all of the support from our pantry partner churches and the community.

First Holy Communion





VBS Volunteer Information

Station Leaders are responsible for running their stations: Games, Snack, Lesson, Music, Craft, and Science. Station Leaders are provided with a book with the lessons, crafts, etc. explained. Most even have a script, so it's easy to teach! Only one adult is needed to teach each station, though the more, the merrier!

Youth Volunteers entering 7th grade and up are welcome to join us as a helping hand! They can help with groups or stations.


