A Letter from Pastor Bo February 2025

February 2025 – February looks to be a fun time for worship at St. John's. We have an unusually late Lent this year (Ash Wednesday is March 5th), which means we have an extended season in February of looking at Epiphany-themed texts. Looking at February, it's basically all of life in a nutshell. I'll explain:

February 2nd – **Beginning** – We have something special for this Groundhog Day – the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. 40 days after Christmas, we celebrate the dedication of the infant Jesus to God. The same love and promises overshadowing this event also are present at the beginning of our lives at birth and at baptism. What does that mean for us?

February 9th – **Confirmation/New Beginning** – In these texts, Isaiah, Paul, and Peter all have a 'come to Jesus' moment where they are convicted of sin, forgiven, and commissioned for a special service. This happens when we personally exercise faith and claim the sacramental promises for ourselves.

February 16th – **Growth** – These texts teach us how to grow as learners and disciples. There are ways to not grow and ways of godly growth. This is something to learn throughout our lives.

February 23rd – **Making Peace** – At the end of our days, we need to make peace with the fact that not all has gone well, according to plan, but God still is working out a plan regardless. Joseph and Jesus teach us to forgive our enemies and to see God's mercy at work even in the difficult seasons. This week teaches us something about how to end well.

Food Pantry Report

January 15, 2025

December 2024 proved to be a successful ending for the year. Through the efforts of many individuals and organizations we were able to assure all of our clients who wished a holiday meal that they could have one. A total of 85 clients were given a choice. 56 selected a turkey or turkey breast and 26 selected a ham. All 85 of them were shoppers at the extra area which we called "fixings". That allowed them to supplement their selections to more than just an entrée.

Because of the positioning of Christmas on a Wednesday we closed for that entire week. This was a totally new experience for us and our clients. Signage was posted well in advance so that clients would be able to make plans. The distribution of the holiday meals took place the week prior to Christmas week. That became one of our busiest weeks in recent memory as 114 families were served that week. Normal hours were resumed the following except for being closed on New Year's Day.

Due to the closure the overall attendance was down this year. Numbers of family coming were 60 fewer for the month. The total number of families attending in December 2024 was 306. Of these, 11 were new registrants.

We are very thankful for all those who remembered the folks facing food insecurity and made donations to the Cupboard. Bless you all for your support.

The library will also be open after worship each week. Parents are welcome to sign out books on the clipboard, and bring them back when finished.


