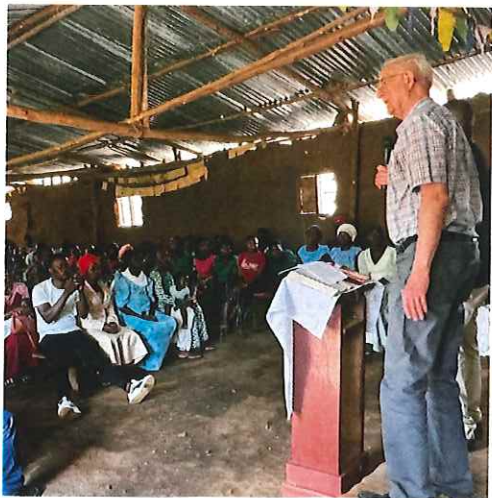

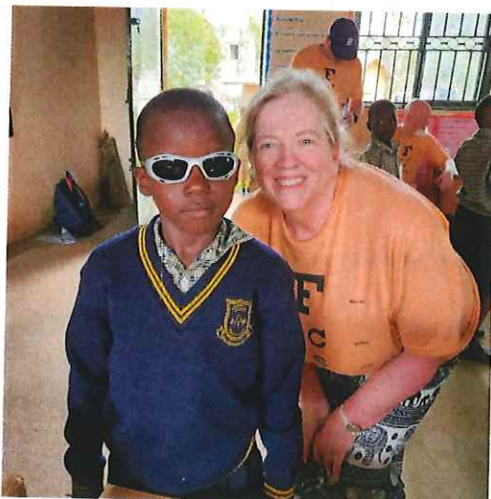
The FARA team, led by Julie and Ken Weibe, had specific agendas during their visit. They connected with sponsor children, assessed their well-being, and strengthened the relationship between the organization and the supported children. The team conducted virtual interviews with sponsor children in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and students in the South Sudanese refugee camp in Moyo. They also reviewed program changes, updated sponsorship forms, and identified areas for improvement. The team participated in a seminar in Kibale, Kibooga, in Central Uganda, and engaged with the church and school, resulting in a radio interview about the program's impact on strengthening families and promoting positive change within the community. Additionally, two team members visited a grandmother's house sponsored by a family member in the western part of the country. We are grateful for the teams that witness the growth and needs of the church.

The New York team held eye clinics in three locations in April: two urban areas and one rural site. They provided a range of eye care services, including surgical solutions for diagnosed eye conditions, prescription glasses, protective sunglasses, and reading glasses. Bringing clarity and vision to people's lives has a transformative effect on their overall well-being, improving their quality of life. Testimonials from individuals who previously had limited vision but could now see clearly and students who could now read their assignments showed the positive impact on their lives and educational performance. The experience was remarkable and touching. The team is already planning their next mission trip for 2025. Wonderful!

The German team, led by Pastor Froese, brought enthusiasm and readiness to work during their visit. A significant 25-year celebration took place at the Bukasa church site, highlighting Germany's strong influence in the area, particularly through the Naomi Froese N/P School and Siegfried High School. The celebration included testimonies, messages, choirs, dances, food, and fellowship, with special recognition given to the long-serving headteachers who dedicated 25 years to their roles. Their commitment is commendable.

The team divided into two groups for their work. One group visited the Palorinya refugee camp in Moyo, where they witnessed the Nile High CHOG School project supported by Kinderhilfswerk Global Care

(KHW/GC). They also visited other projects, such as a pineapple farm and Ongengo Primary School, which provide valuable support to the local communities. The remaining members stayed in Kampala, working on four building projects and conducting interviews with over 100 sponsor children. They also participated in the Kampala 25 music festival, offering a range of valuable experiences for the youth program.

The German team actively engaged with local communities, fostering connections between Germany and Uganda. A big shout-out goes to Kinderhilfswerk with the ongoing food relief efforts that began in October last year and many people are extremely grateful for this support.

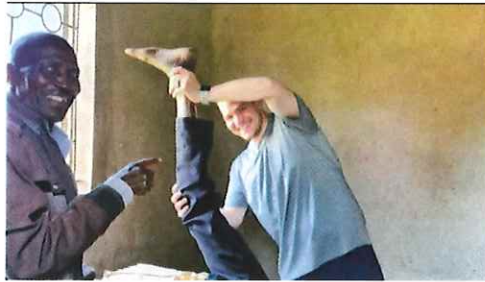

Led by Dr. Bill Johanson from the USA, the medical team's work was busy and impactful. Despite logistical challenges, they quickly assessed available supplies, purchased what was needed, and started their work at the Mutungo church site. The diverse team, consisting of seven doctors, one eye-glass consultant, one physical therapist, and one teacher for triage, addressed various health issues in urban and rural areas. They provided services like lab testing, ultrasound scanning, biopsies, HIV and pregnancy testing, and life-saving treatments. In spite of limited resources, the team treated over 1,000 patients in three areas, showcasing their dedication and making a significant impact on the communities served. These services are desperately needed and we are grateful that these medical professionals take time to come and serve others in need.
