- 4. Act upon all applications on which he is authorized to act by the provisions of this Ordinance within thirty (30) days after these are filed in compliance with all the applicable requirements, he shall either issue a Zoning Permit or a Zoning Certificate within said thirty (30) days or shall notify the applicant in writing of his refusal of such permit and the reasons therefore. Failure to notify the applicant in case of such refusal within said thirty (30) days shall entitle the applicant to submit his request to the Board of Zoning Appeals.
- 5. Conduct inspections of buildings, and uses of land to determine compliance with the Village Zoning Ordinance, and, in the case of any violation to notify in writing the person(s) responsible, specifying the nature of the violation and ordering corrective action.
- 6. Maintain in current status the Official Zoning District Map which shall be kept on permanent display in the Village Meeting House.
- 7. Maintain permanent and current records required by the Village Zoning Ordinance, including but not limited to Zoning Permits, Zoning Certificates, inspection and all official actions on administrative appeals, variances, amendments, and special uses.
- 8. Make such records available for the use of the Village Council on the administration of the Village Zoning Ordinance, setting forth such information as may be of interest and value in advance and furthering the purpose of the Village Zoning Ordinance.
- 9. Prepare and submit an annual report to the Village Council on the administration of the Village Zoning Ordinance, setting forth such information as may be of interest and value in advancing and furthering the purpose of the Village Zoning Ordinance.

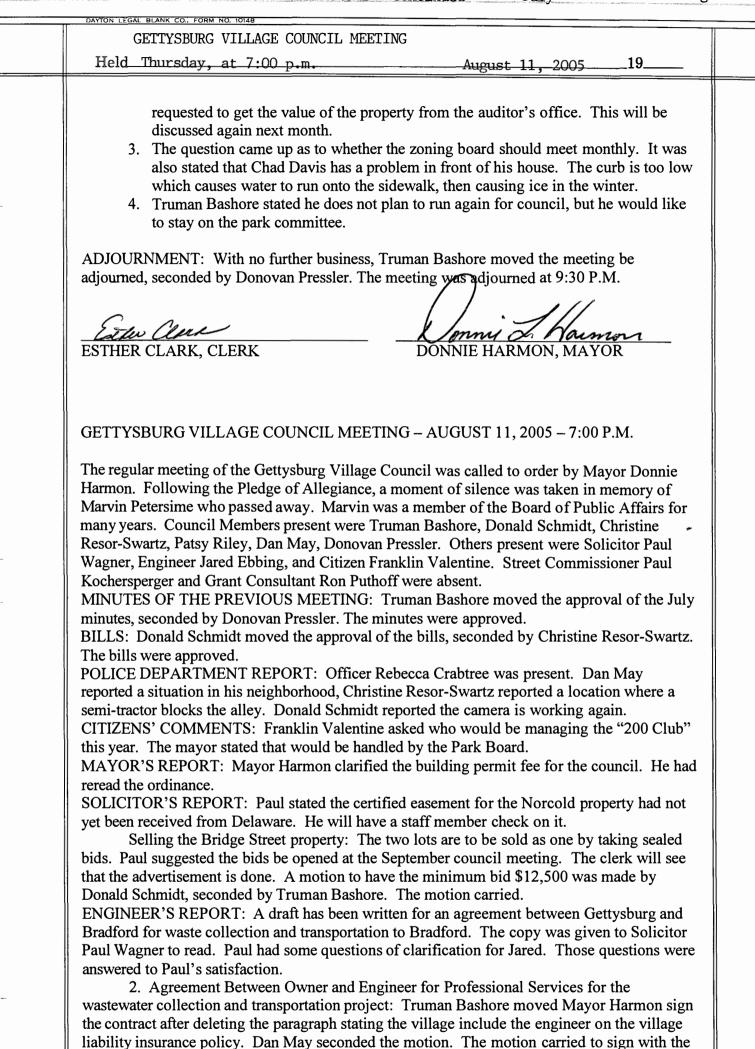

Esther explained the chart Norman Warner, village commissioner, completed with daily meter readings at the sanitary sewer lift station. Discussion was held for ideas as to where this extra water is coming from. When we receive rain, the amount of water immediately spikes, then when it stops raining, it is like someone turns off the faucet. In the first quarter of 2009, we had an extra 67,000 gallons of water—most of which was in April, which had the largest quantity of rain. Dr. Holman explained the procedure for pressure testing. If the pressure test wasn't passed, the inspector would not have signed the permit. There was a question about the way to monitor the amount coming from the trunks—is a flow meter available to measure this? Esther will ask our engineers about this. The people talked about what buildings might be draining into the sanitary sewers. They then made the decision to meet on Wednesday, June 3, at 9:00 a.m. to go around looking at downspouts and where they drain to. Persons to be in this group are: Dr. Holman, Lance Begoon, Norman Warner, Paul Kochersperger, Chris Hall, and John Dillon. Friday, June 5 will be the alternate date.

Norman stated Deputy Mikesell has all the information about what happened at his home. CITIZENS: Melinda Oliver was present with the complaint that the water had not been turned off at her former home. The home is in foreclosure. She was assured the water would be turned off the next morning but she will still be billed the minimum utility charges until the house is sold at sheriff's sale. Donovan Pressler talked about the motorized vehicles in his area and that the patrolmen need to roll down the windows of their cars, and not talk on their cell phones when they are patrolling. One person rode out in from of an officer and the officer did nothing. The noise ordinance needs to be reviewed. MAYOR'S REPORT: With reference to the properties we have for sale, Mayor Harmon stated the
village is not responsible for any permits or testing of properties. We are to call Craig Knapke of Fanning/Howey Engineering if we have questions concerning tests. Darke County requires no tests unless there has been a gas station on the lot. Council members and the clerk are not to answer questions. He stated, "You are the eyes and ears of the village, not the voice." He stated he is the voice. If he is not home, he is to be called on his cell phone.
