## Manage Mud

As increasing temperatures melt the snow, what often follows are areas of mud. Just as it is difficult for people to walk through a muddy path, it is also a challenge for livestock, say experts in the Kansas State University Beef Cattle Institute, speaking on a recent Cattle Chat podcast.

"Mud management is important because it can negatively impact the health and performance of cattle -particularly young cattle," Kansas State University veterinarian Bob Larson said.

Kansas State University beef cattle nutritionist Phillip Lancaster said

when cattle walk through mud, there is a decrease in their performance and an increase in their maintenance requirements overall.

He said, "When cattle have mud caked on their haircoat and it is damp and cold, cattle lose a lot of body heat, and so cattle have to burn a lot more energy to maintain their body temperature."

Along with changes in performance, cattle standing in mud can also have hoof issues, Kansas State University veterinarian Brian Lubbers said, adding that those issues can develop even if

cattle are standing in mud as shallow as their pasterns.

Lubbers said, "Hairy heel wart and foot rot are two of the conditions that cattle maintained in a muddy environment can develop. If cattle stand in a wet spot for extended periods, the hoof wall can lose its integrity and become soft and that can lead to other hoof issues such as sole abscesses."

Mud isn't always the result of too much rain or snow melt, Lubbers said.

"If cattle are densely stocked in a pasture, the urine can also create a muddy environment," he said.

To manage the mud, the experts suggest that producers fill the muddy areas with rocks or gravel to provide more solid footing. In some cases, it might make sense to pour concrete, Larson said.

Kansas State University veterinarian Brad White suggests producers look at moving hay to different areas of the pasture to keep mud from accumulating around the feeder.

"It is also important to feed hay in a place where there is good drainage to reduce the amount of mud that the cattle have to deal with," White said.

#### PIMENTO CHEESE SQUARES

#### Ingredients:

- 4 ounce jar of diced pimentos
- 2 tablespoons diced jalapeños
- 1 teaspoon red chili flakes (or less depending on preference)
- 1 teaspoon ground mustard
- 1.5 cups self rising flour
- 2.5 cups of sharp cheddar cheese
- 1/2 cup of olive oil

#### **Instructions:**

Preheat oven to 350 degrees and line baking sheets with parchment paper. Drain and dry canned pimentos, ensuring they are finely diced. Shred the cheddar cheese (I prefer blocks, but you can use pre-shredded if you prefer). Combine the flour, chili flakes, and ground mustard then mix in the pimentos and diced jalapeños.

In a separate bowl, mix the oil and cheese, then add to the flour mixture, stirring so that it is fully combined. Roll out onto baking sheet at about a thickness of 1/8 to 1/4 inch. Bake 15-20 minutes then cool before cutting into squares and serving. Refrigerate after cooling.

He then attended Lake Area Technical College, where he earned a degree in Ag Business. Charlie worked as a seed salesman at Miller Hybrids in Kalona, Iowa, as well as a sale and show representative for the Heartland Limousin Association.

Growing up, Charlie enjoyed spending his summers on the family farm near Estelline, SD. Through his grandpa, Kenny, and family, he was introduced to the registered Angus breed. This is where his passion for cattle began at a young age. With the influence of his grandpa, Kenny, and grandpa, Terry, Charlie learned about every aspect of the industry. He joined in on the Tesch family tradition of showing cattle and, with his drive and competitive spirit, took it to the next level. Charlie was an active member of 4-H, FFA and the South Dakota Junior Angus Association where he competed at cattle shows from county to national levels.

With his brother, Nick, he lived his dream and achieved many goals including multiple Supreme Champion wins at the Watertown Winter Farm Show, the 2012 National Champion Chi-Angus Bull in Louisville, Kentucky, the 2014 Reserve Pen of Three Chi-Angus Bulls and the 2015 Grand Champion Pen of Three Chi-Angus Bulls at the National Western Stock Show. Through the livestock industry, Charlie was blessed to travel to many new places and make many lifelong friends. He had a strong desire to share his knowledge with others, often helping the next generation of livestock enthusiasts get their start in the industry.

Charlie shared a special brotherly bond with Nick, who was his best friend and the two always knew how to make each other laugh the most. Nick is even credited with giving him the beloved nickname 'Pork' when they were kids, and it stuck with him for the rest of his life
