### **Reasons to Check for Pregnancy**

 ${f F}$  or cow-calf producers, knowing the pregnancy status of the cows is important information to have as they decide which animals they are going to keep and which ones they are going to sell, according to the experts at Kansas State University's Beef Cattle Institute. This was the topic for a recent discussion on the Cattle Chat podcast.

"As forage availability becomes more limited, pregnancy checking in the first 60 to 90 days of gestation allows producers to make the culling decision sooner rather than later, and that helps keep the feed costs down," A. J. Tarpoff, K-State Research and Extension beef cattle veterinarian, said in a news release.

Along with knowing if they are pregnant or open, K-State veterinarian Bob Larson also stresses the importance of knowing when the cows are conceived.

"I want as many cows as possible to get pregnant in the first 21 days of the breeding season because they will raise the biggest calves to sell at weaning," Larson said. The cows that calve early are more likely to resume their heat cycles on time for the next breeding season.

An additional benefit of bringing the cows off the pasture for pregnancy checking is that producers can evaluate body condition, said K-State beef cattle nutritionist Phillip Lancaster.

> "Body condition scoring the cows at weaning allows producers to make decisions about how to manage the cows nutritionally ahead of the calving season," Lancaster said.

> If the cows are thin at weaning, there is still time for them to add weight ahead of calving, Lancaster said.

> "It is a lot cheaper and easier to put weight on the thin cows going through the fall than in the winter when bad weather can make it a challenge," he said.

Growing up in the South, biscuits have always been a staple (bonus points if they are served with gravy). However, it is a common misconception that homemade biscuits are difficult or time consuming. If you keep the recipe simple, you will have a Sunday morning go-to just like your granny or mama made and will not want to bust open a biscuit can again. *Ashley Wiser* 

#### **HOMEADE BISCUITS**

#### **Ingredients:**

2 cups of self-rising flour (plus extra for the counter) ¾ cup of milk 1 stick of butter

I stick of butter

#### Instructions:

- \* Preheat oven to 425°F and grease or spray a baking sheet.
- 1. Pour the flour into a large mixing bowl.
- 2. Cut in  $\frac{3}{4}$  stick of butter a little bit at a time in very small portions with
- a fork until it is thoroughly mixed in (the flour will look flaky).

3. Slowly add in the milk, stirring as you go and mix until the dough comes together.

4. Pour the dough out onto a lightly floured surface, kneading until it is mixed and has the right texture (shaggy and not too sticky or watery). You can add a little more flour if it is not coming together as it should.

5. Using a floured rolling pin, roll lightly (just enough to smooth out the dough and get the correct thickness, about ¾ of an inch).

6. Next, you will cut out your biscuits. You can use a biscuit cutter, cup or anything with the appropriate shape/size. I use a Mason jar. Be sure to flour the edges of your cutter before using so the dough doesn't stick.

Cut out the biscuits. Depending on the size, this recipe should make 6-8.
 Place the biscuits on the baking sheet and bake 15-20 minutes, or until golden brown.

9. Once I pull them from the oven, I like to use the remaining butter to brush the tops of them while they are still hot. Then, serve and enjoy!
