Romans 3:20 (TS 2009) "Therefore by works of Torah no flesh shall be declared right before Him, for by the Torah is the knowledge of sin." Torah is our "mirror." It reveals to us the perfect Law of Elohim and reflects back to us ourselves in stark comparison. It exposes the blights of sin and unrighteousness and reveals the deficiencies and flaws in our characters and attitudes. This can be referred to as the "leaven" in our lives.
