

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

Per the Governor's speech on April 30, 2020, it does not appear that much has changed except for the stay-at-home order is to end at midnight May 3rd.

For your information, here is the breakdown of phasing in which begin May 4th

Stay safe and healthy.

PHASE ONE

BEGINS MAY 4, 2020 AS DIRECTED BY EXECUTIVE ORDER 20-29



GATHERINGS

- Mass gatherings of no more than **10** individuals allowed.



INDIVIDUALS

- Masks are strongly encouraged in public settings.
- Maintain 6 foot social distance.



EMPLOYERS

- Telework is strongly encouraged when possible.
- Any employee exhibiting symptoms should be required to stay home.



TRAVEL

- Minimize or avoid nonessential travel.
- Follow KDHE travel and quarantine guidelines for travel to high-risk areas.

✗ ACTIVITIES NOT ALLOWED TO OPEN

- Community centers
- Large entertainment venues with capacity of 2,000 +
- Fairs, festivals, parades, & graduations
- Public swimming pools
- Organized sports facilities
- Summer camps

✗ ESTABLISHMENTS NOT ALLOWED TO OPEN

- Bars and nightclubs excluding already operating curbside and carryout services
- Casinos (non-tribal)

✓ EDUCATION, ACTIVITIES, & VENUES ALLOWED TO OPERATE

- Childcare facilities
- Libraries

PHASE TWO

BEGINS NO EARLIER THAN MAY 18, 2020

At a date determined by the Governor based on the overall progress of the State on outlined health metrics. The Governor will issue an Executive Order to move the State into this phase.



GATHERINGS

- Mass gatherings of no more than **30** individuals allowed.



INDIVIDUALS

- Masks are strongly encouraged in public settings.
- Maintain 6 foot social distance.



EMPLOYERS

- Telework is strongly encouraged when possible.
- Any employee exhibiting symptoms should be required to stay home.



TRAVEL

- Minimize or avoid nonessential travel.
- Follow KDHE travel and quarantine guidelines for travel to high-risk areas.

X ACTIVITIES

NOT ALLOWED TO OPEN

- Large entertainment venues with capacity of 2,000+
- Fairs, festivals, parades, and graduations
- Summer camps



ESTABLISHMENTS ALLOWED TO OPEN

- Bars and nightclubs at 50% total occupancy
- Casinos (non-tribal) if compliant with guidelines approved by the KDHE.



EDUCATION, ACTIVITIES, & VENUES ALLOWED TO OPERATE

- Childcare facilities
- Libraries
- Swimming pools
- Community centers
- Organized sports facilities and tournaments with some exceptions

PHASE THREE

BEGINS NO EARLIER THAN JUNE 1, 2020

At a date determined by the Governor based on the overall progress of the State on outlined health metrics. The Governor will issue an Executive Order to move the State into this phase.



GATHERINGS

- Mass gatherings of no more than **90** individuals allowed.



INDIVIDUALS

- Adhere to personal hygiene guidelines.
- Remain home if you feel sick.



EMPLOYERS

- On-site staffing is unrestricted.



TRAVEL

- Nonessential travel may resume.

BUSINESS AND ACTIVITY RESTRICTIONS

All education, activities, venues and establishments may operate pursuant to mass gathering guidelines.

PHASE OUT

BEGINS NO EARLIER THAN JUNE 15, 2020

At a date determined by the Governor based on the overall progress of the State on outlined health metrics. The Governor will issue an Executive Order to move the State into this phase.



GATHERINGS

- Maintain social distance where applicable.



INDIVIDUALS

- Adhere to personal hygiene guidelines.
- Remain home if you feel sick.



EMPLOYERS

- Follow any additional guidance for businesses and employees that is released.



TRAVEL

- Unrestricted.

After weeks of carefully monitoring the ongoing spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19), we have made the difficult decision to cancel Wing Ding 42, scheduled to be held June 30 through July 4, in Springfield, Missouri.

The Gold Wing Road Riders Association has been committed to observing the recommendations put forth by public health officials since the beginning of this unprecedented situation. The most current information released by government and health care officials continue with the recommendations to consider postponing meetings and limiting attendance. Therefore, the current environment makes it impossible for us to hold a safe and enjoyable event for our attendees and exhibitors.

We are all truly disappointed by having to make this decision, but the latest guidance from public officials, and continued uncertainty with the current situation makes it clear that the most responsible decision is to put the safety and well-being of our members, volunteers, exhibitors, sponsors, staff and service providers above anything else. We want to thank our members, exhibitors, sponsors, service providers, and the city of Springfield for their commitment and support during these challenging weeks. We will continue to collaborate with the city of Springfield and our service providers through this situation.

In the coming days we will be reaching out to all those who have registered for the event with further details. Please hold off on requesting refunds as we hope to have information on next year's Wing Ding soon and will give you the option to just transfer your registration to 2021. The CVB will be processing all room cancellations at one time. You should receive an email from them soon. If you do not please contact Carrie Chavez at 417-799-0408. Understand that she is working remote so please be patient. She will get back to each one of you as soon as she possibly can.

We thank all of you for your support and patience through all of these changes and uncertain times.

FROM YOUR DISTRICT RIDER EDUCATORS

These are some strange and trying times that we are living in. In a organization like GWRRA where we are so social and enjoy spending time not only riding our motorcycles but enjoying riding our motorcycles with our closest friends and family. I know that Carolyn and I are missing all the Chapter meetings that we attend and getting to spend time with our GW Family. Hang in there before you know it we will be hitting the roads and the restaurants and going to Chapter Meetings again.

Some things from National about the Levels program and being current.

GWRRA RIDER EDUCATION PROGRAM EXTENDS THE LEVELS PROGRAM GRACE PERIOD

Members participating in the Rider Education Levels Program who have expired or will expire on or after January 1st, 2020 are granted a grace period that has been extended until December 31st, 2020 allowing time for the Member to take part in one or more of the following courses or classes to bring their level up to date:

- ★ GWRRA (or RE Program approved alternative) on-bike course
- ★ The University's Co-Rider seminar
- ★ GWRRA MEDIC FIRST AID® (or MFA Program approved alternative) class.

The grace period will not be decreased and may be extended if deemed necessary. This means that only training that expires in 2020 is included. If you expired prior to Jan. 1, 2020 this does not apply to you and you will have to wait until the courses that you need are able to be offered.

If you took Medic First Aid and CPR from some other provider please contact Bob Brown or me and provide proof of the training and we can get that training entered into the database.

The GWRRA University is offering online training seminars. The link to access the University courses is <https://gwrradot.com/> . There are several seminars being offered. Take advantage of staying at home and take some training.

At this time, we are still planning to conduct the Advanced Rider Course on Saturday June 20. The ARC is GWRRA's version of the MSF 2 wheeled course that we also present. Registration will start at 7:30 am at the Stevens' residence in Wichita. We will have the classroom portion of the course lasting approximately 3 hours, then have a pizza lunch provided by Rider Education right after the classroom. We will ride as a group down to the range. We should be done on the range no later than 4:30 to 5:00pm. This course is to replace the one we had scheduled for April 11, 2020 that was cancelled. If you were signed up for the April course your name will stay on the roster. Please contact Rick Stevens or Bob Brown if you were not previously signed up and would like to attend. The cost is \$25 which also covers your lunch. Please come out and support this training so we can get your Rider Coaches certified to teach this course in the future.

That is about all for this month. With the weather getting warmer remember that you can still take your bike out for a ride and even invite some friends just maintain your distance and even though traffic is lighter still pay attention to the other vehicles on the roads.




June 5 – Baranek Bash... Due to Covid-19 information is yet to be determined.
