





I quote: "In fatal crashes in 2015 motorcylecle rider (killed or survived) involved in fatal crashes had higher percentages of alcohol impairment than any other type of motor vehicle driver, 27% for motorcycle riders, 21% for passenger car drivers, 20% for light truck drivers, and 2% for drivers of large trucks." Unquote.



I did send emails out about this, but several bounced back marked "rejected" by servers.





March 19th, we had 14 members ride over to Hesston for dinner at Water's Edge. It was a beautiful, warm, sunny (but very windy) day.







Spring has sprung folks and we are ready to hop on our bikes and follow wherever the road takes us! Riding a motorcycle can be dangerous but fortunately, they also give you the best tools to avoid crashing - powerful brakes, obstruction-free vision, excellent handling and tires that really grip. Over the next few months I'd like to share with you some information from an article by Wes Siler on how to use those tools, and your very own brain, to avoid common motorcycle accidents.

Motorcycle Safety

Want to reduce your odds of dying in a crash? Get educated. New riders should complete a basic rider course from the MSF or something similar.

Safety gear doesn't just help prevent injury in a crash, it can also make riding more comfortable, put you in better control of your bike, and help you be seen by other drivers. Bright colors on your helmet and jacket/suit will help car drivers see you, potentially avoiding some of the most common accidents. Like this one:

It's Slippery!

It is spring and the weather can be ever changing. If stuff is coming out of the sky you can bet it is cold, wet and, no surprise ... Slippery! Don't panic!

How To Avoid An Accident: Does your bike have decent tires on it or were you silly and decided that running track rubber on the road was a good idea? Hint: it's not. So long as you're running reasonable tires and those tires aren't worn out, you'll be surprised at how well a motorcycle does in wet or even snowy conditions. Just slow down and be as smooth as possible on the controls.

In the wet, things like manhole covers can be extra slippery and you'll need to watch out for oil and diesel on the road as well. Look for patches of rainbow and avoid them. If it hasn't rained for a while, the first hour or so of rainfall is the most treacherous; it lifts all the oils and whatnot out of the pavement, floating it on top. Treat yourself to a hot cup of coffee and wait for a solid downpour to wash all that junk away.






