SECURITY

Rick Kistler Barb Brown It is April already and many of us are already getting out to enjoy some of the nicer days and riding. We have already had a District Ride to Pilsen, KS and we had people ride to that. We have had some rain which has helped to move some of the sand off the roads, but there is still quite a bit of sand around that can cause us problems. So be careful if you are out riding. Also be aware that the drivers are not used to seeing motorcycles on the streets so pay attention and be extra careful when riding.

On March 25th and 26th I traveled to Harrison, AR to assist a rider coach with an Advanced Rider course. It was nice to be able to help another rider coach and the riders in Arkansas with this course. We had one rider come from far south Louisiana to take the training. He rode over 8 hours one way just to take a rider course. We had nice cool overcast weather to do the riding portion of the course.

We have some dates for riding courses for this spring. We are planning a Trike Rider Course, Trailering Course (for two wheels) and Trike Trailering Course in Hesston, KS. If you have not already signed up please consider taking one or more of the classes that we are offering.

Here is some information to maybe help with riding in heavier traffic. I hope this helps you with staying safe in traffic.

Tackling Traffic



Riding your motorcycle in traffic is unpredictable. Some people tend to think that rush hour is one of the only times you will run into congestion on the road, but the truth is, traffic can happen anytime and anywhere. While you may try to avoid getting caught up in a slowdown, learning how to safely maneuver through traffic will improve your control, get you to where you need to be without rerouting and help you avoid a potential crash.

Always Assume You're Invisible

The key to getting through traffic is to practice defensive riding. You can be wearing high-visibility gear and riding with your lights on at all times, but the truth is someone still won't see you. Ride with confidence and assertiveness and expect the worst from those around you.

Be Comfortable Riding At Slow Speeds

Riding in traffic means you are going to be moving very slowly. Motorcycle training isn't just for new riders. There are a variety of classes catering to intermediate and advanced riders that will allow you to fine-tune your skills and master slow speed motorcycle riding. Slowly easing on and off of the clutch, brake and throttle will allow you to smoothly ride through traffic without jerking around or having to catch yourself with your feet. Be aware of your center of gravity and shift your weight accordingly – if you feel yourself losing control, adjust your speed and catch yourself if necessary.

Give Yourself Escape Room

When at a dead stop in traffic, give yourself enough space between you and the car in front of you to allow room to escape a possible rear-end collision. Watch your mirrors and if you feel like the car behind you is moving too fast and may not see you, flash your brakes to avoid a motorcycle crash.

Avoid Blind Spots

People get antsy while driving in traffic, which means cars may change lanes quickly without a warning or signal. Never ride in between another vehicle and an exit. Many vehicles change lanes at the last minute to make it to an exit and you don't want to get caught in the middle. Stay out of other vehicle's blind spots by riding in the front line of vision or in open pockets.

Scan For Hazards

You should always be looking around for any potential hazards, but even more so while driving through traffic. Don't make the mistake of thinking your motorcycle braking distance is different than that of other vehicles. You should always be following two to three seconds behind the car in front of you, and scanning the road about seven to 12 seconds ahead. If a car passes you that you didn't notice, you need to keep a closer eye on your mirrors!

REMEMBER THAT PRACTICE MAKES PERMANENT!

Saturday brought a visit to the WW1 monument and museum. It contains many artifacts and pictures from the war. It also contains stories of how the war started and what brought the U.S. into it. It is also the only WW1 monument in the nation.





After that, we went to the Steamship Arabia display. This was a paddle boat that was shipping cargo to Nebraska. It was sunk by a submerged log. All passengers survived, but the cargo was lost. In the 1990's, it was found 45 feet deep in silt. The display is the largest display of pre-civil war artifacts in the nation.



Following this museum was a GWRRA typical visit, we went to eat at a local BBQ place near the KC airport.



I was born in France and wear a size 879 shoe. Who am I? If you guessed the Statue of Liberty, you are correct. Trivia at Chapter B's monthly meeting on March 17^{th} focused on the Statue of Liberty. What fun to learn more about this magnificent statue, a gift from the people of France in 1884.

Also, in 1950 to celebrate their 40th anniversary, the Boy Scouts of America placed approximately two hundred small replicas of the Statue of Liberty in towns across the country. Twenty-five of them remain in the state of Kansas and can be found primarily in front of schools and courthouses, and in local parks. Bogie Bogenrife and Mary Rose Enderle set up a self-guided photo tour of these statues. This is an individual or group activity. Go on your own or plan a group ride that travels to several statues for an enjoyable day trip. The following website gives information about where the statues are located in Kansas.

The idea is to find and take a photo of yourself and/or your motorcycle with as many of the small Statues of Liberty as you can. They are scattered throughout the state and this is a fun way to see Kansas and search out these statues. If you submit back to John English photos of you and/or your motorcycle with at least twelve different statues, you will receive a \$20 credit per person to spend at the Midland Railroad Hotel in Wilson, KS. The gift certificate may be used to purchase food at the restaurant located at the hotel or toward a night's stay. If you submit photos of you and/or your motorcycle with all twenty-five of the statues in Kansas, you will receive a free night's stay at the Midland Railroad Hotel in Wilson.

Wilson markets itself as the "Czech Capital of Kansas" and has an annual Czech Fest the final weekend in July. It's also a great place to visit and explore. The hotel as well as the Wilson State Bank building appeared in the 1973 movie *Paper Moon* starring Ryan and Tatum O'Neal. 

Our 50/50 winners that night were Jan Schroeder who won \$35.00 and Rick Stevens who won \$20.00. Congratulations!


Noel Pollard found his member number in the March newsletter and donated it back to our treasury.





FATHER KAPAUN MUSEUM AND CHURCH TOURS

with dinner by the church ladies, March 26, 2022 - Pilsen, KS

March 26 District Ride started at Curtis C's in Newton for breakfast for the central KS folks. Noel Pollard and friend Joan from Salina, and Bogey and Mary Rose from KC came directly to Pllsen. Chapters A, B, H, and Q were represented.

The museum holds many artifacts and relics related to Father Kapaun. Additional stories of his life and how others have been impacted by his life are presented.

Entering the church was a "stop in your tracks, jaw dropping" experience of beauty and awe. There is <u>no way</u> the pictures can even come close to the magnificence of the stained glass windows, the gold gilded hand carved altars and statues. The influence of this Czech community can be seen in the choice of statues in the sanctuary. Its claim to be one of the most beautiful churches in Kansas is true. You must see this in person to appreciate the beauty and reverence of this church. It was dedicated in Sept. 1915, built in the Gothic style. Father Kapaun's 1st mass was performed there in 1940. He remained a priest there until he went to WWII.

Father Kapaun was born in 1916 on a farm near Pilsen. He grew up in Pilsen and as young as the age of 4, he played "Priest" with boxes and his mothers tablecloth for an altar. Other childhood stories and his life indicated his devotion to the priesthood. He served 1st as the priest in Pilsen and volunteered as a chaplain at the Herington Military Camp. After becoming a full military chaplain he was assigned to India and Burma during WW II, then the 8th Cavalry Regiment of the 1st Cavalry Division in Korean, where he was captured, held as POW and died in 1951. The stories of men in his unit attest to his selfless service to all men of any faith or no faith. The Vatican is considering him for sainthood.

This tour was quite in depth, very well presented and fascinating. Lunch by the church ladies was great and enough to feed an army, you won't go away hungry. Museum is open 1-4 on Tues and Friday, or by appointment. Certainly worth the time to call ahead for a group tour 620-381-1689.
