

Take a Medic First Aid Class and learn more life saving methods.

I'm proud to announce that your Rider Education Team (Seminar Presenters) have been invited to attend the CMA (Christian Motorcycle Association) State Rally in Hutchinson, KS August 6th to present two seminars to the attendees. Marv Ayers, Rick Stevens and I will be presenting "Team Riding" and "Distracted Drivers" seminars. Rick Stevens told them the seminars we have to offer and they selected those two. This speaks well for the award winning GWRRA Rider Education Safety Program. None better!!!

I'm excited again by KSH. They have two more new Level IV's. I and Marv Ayers CE-KSH will be presenting Level IV patches to Don & Jan Schroeder. CONGRATULATIONS TO THEM. I'm not done. I have received paperwork for another couple, Jeff & Ann Whithorn, KSH. They have qualified for advancement to Level IV. Their paperwork will be forwarded soon.

Our Levels program is growing leaps and bounds from what it was. That is due to the work the Kansas Rider Ed Team of Chapter Educators, members and support from the Chapter Directors that makes this all happen. Of course without the volunteers that pay to get certified to teach riding courses, we would not have a solid safety program. That includes the six Medic First Aid Instructors.

Hello Everyone It's August and it's still hot.

Next up was our monthly meeting on the 14th and let me tell you the room was crowed which was great (although it does make it hard on the little lady that waits on us). Bob Brown our fearless Riders Educator gave a great lesson on some group riding etiquette such as...

Helmet time (or kickstands up), which means this is the time that the group is going to leave on the ride so don't be late or you will be left behind.

Riders need to keep the chatter on the CB to a minimal so your Road Captain & Tail Gunner can communicate with each other. Try not to have special requests or complaints.

Riders need to keep an equally spaced gap between you and the bike in front/behind you. Try not to "yo -yo" when riding as this can make it hard on the other riders in your group.

Road Captain should call for a rest break every 100-120 miles for fuel, restroom, drinks and to just stretch & walk around because riding on the bike for long periods of time can be tedious.

All riders should be on the lookout for debris in the street and when you see it don't only tell the other riders but point to it also...Co-riders this is something you can assist with too.

On the 16th Chris Roberts was in charge of a great ride that we took to Medicine Lodge Kansas. We started out @ 9:00 that morning with 10 bikes so we split into 2 groups. Took about $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours to get there where we visited the museum and Carry Nation's home.

(For those of you who don't know Carry Nation was a little lady that didn't like alcohol very much so she became famous for taking her little hatchet into saloons/bars and smashing things up) here are just a few pictures that I took. (Next Page)

July is off to a rip roaring start with heat. We had our monthly ride to Marilyn's in Osage City with 13 people in attendance. We only had 4 bikes but with the heat in triple digits it sent some of us into our enclosed vehicles with Brenda and I being one couple. Brenda flat said she wasn't riding and with 20/20 hindsight it was a good decision since the additional 120 miles we would have had to ride wouldn't have been a lot of fun in that much heat. The food was excellent with the exception of Rita Thompson having to eat with an individual eating liver and onions on both sides of her. She did manage to survive but it appeared to me to take a lot of willpower on her part. We were joined by two "strangers", Don & Deb McCullough made the trip down from Harveyville. It was the first time they have been able to join us in quite a while. It's always good when old friends can make it. The wait staff did a great job especially since they also had another large group when we arrived. Teresa Gull decided she wanted to try liver so she conned Rick Thompson out of a taste of his but he got the last laugh. Teresa looked like a little baby with its first taste of lemon. She shivered and shook while making all kinds of faces in addition to drinking about half a glass of water chasing the liver. I don't think the piece was a big as a dime. We switched our extended ride up a bit this month with "starting" it in Manhattan. Actually Brenda and I were leading the ride and were going to the Boyer Museum in Belleville so we decided to meet in Manhattan, which was on the way. Everything is handmade and without plans or pictures. He says if he can see it in his head he can make it.

It actually happened to be right across the road from the Casey's where we fueled. The Dairy Queen was a big shock to us. With the temperatures in the 90's it was busy but that didn't stop us. Bill's "subject" this month was a discussion about two of his friends that were riding some other brand of bike were caught in a heavy rain on the interstate near Emporia and decided to pull under an overpass to wait it out and as they were slowing down on the shoulder of the road they were crossing the rumble strips there and both bikes went down at a very slow speed. Nobody was hurt so all was well in that area. Neither rider had a clue why they went down they said they were right side up and then down. After a good discussion it was determined or at least guessed it could have been caused by either hydroplaning over the rumble strips or oil from the road that hadn't washed away. Nobody is sure exactly what happened but it is food for thought to be extremely careful under those conditions.

There will be two MSF courses in Wichita in September. There will be a trike course on the 18th and a two wheel course on the 25th. In addition to the range course there is a classroom portion. As it stands now the classroom portion will be on Saturday evening probably at Rick & Carolyn Stevens' home. The reason for the split sessions is to keep from having to do the range portion in the heat of the day. Because it is hard to fill a trailering course both courses can be accomplished with or without a trailer. The choice is up to the rider. Co-riders are encouraged and welcome to participate. The cost of the course is \$25 with a \$5 discount for every course taken consecutively down to a minimum charge of \$15. Just as a comparison the same course at Wing Ding costs \$50 for the rider and the co-rider is free.



Even if they are doing it the cost is still higher and the money doesn't go to the district it goes elsewhere. The course is limited to 12 bikes or 24 people.



Come on man, I thought last month was hot! When you ride in hot weather it is easy to become distracted. Being distracted on two or three wheels is not ideal riding. At the same instance you are riding distracted you are riding with and around other vehicles that are much larger, which can cause you a lot of hurt, that are texting, reading, putting on make-up, eating, and may not care about you and the space you occupy. Quoting GWRRA's Dealing with Distracted Drivers, driver distraction is --- **ANY** non-riding activity engaged in that has the potential to distract from the primary task of riding and increase the risk of a crash. The average delayed reaction time because of a distraction is the equivalent of a blood alcohol level that has reached the legal limit of .08%.

Afterthoughts

HAVE YOU VISITED ANYONE LATELY?

In keeping with our last few Insight articles relating to Chapter issues, we'd like to address another and important Chapter activity. That activity is VISITATION. By visitation, we mean one or more Chapters visiting another's gathering or other social event.

When the GWRRA Chapter system was devised back at its founding, it was envisioned that the various Chapters would support and intermingle with each other. The Chapters were not designed to be autonomous "clubs" that functioned on their own or elected their officers, etc. The idea was that the Chapters would be pretty much structured alike, the officers (volunteer leaders) would be appointed and that they would support each other to at least some extent. By "support" each other, I mean that the Chapters would interact with each other by occasionally attending each other's gatherings (business meetings) and attending each other's social events and importantly, their fund raising events.

This is not to say that the sole function of any Chapter is to do nothing but visit other Chapters. Far from it, the principle function of a GWRRA Chapter is to provide a fun, safe and enjoyable experience for the members. The Chapter is supposed to be the place that members go to get the full GWRRA experience. To learn safe group riding, participate in GWRRA activities at all levels, up to and including Wing Ding. But in addition to all this, interacting in a fun and enjoyable way with other GWRRA Chapters is an important part of that total experience. This is where Chapter leadership, leadership by example, really comes into play. The typical member (particularly new members) may be unaware of the concept of Chapter visitation and mutual support as a fun activity. It's up to the Chapter Director and the staff to promote the idea and leading by example, put it into practice where appropriate. We're all aware that if the Chapter Director and the staff don't enthusiastically participate and support any activity, then the members will follow suit. If you don't attend, then they likely won't.

When you and your Team are assembling your activities calendar for the upcoming month, take a look at what other events the Chapters within reasonable distance from you are having. Are there any poker runs or other social activities that you could put on your ride schedule? What about a monthly gathering? The Chapters that you support by your visitation will be glad you came, you'll have a lots of FUN and the next time you want your Chapter members to visit again, they will be more inclined to go along. We have found that very nearly all of these Chapter social events are lots of fun and the folks who put them on have gone to a real effort to make them enjoy-able. And incidentally, it was a good excuse for a ride.

One more thing to consider; at some point your Chapter may feel the need to host a social event designed to raise funds for Chapter operations. The only way it will be successful as a source of revenue is for other Chapters to attend, in sufficient numbers and spend their money with you. This is where the visitation concept becomes a twoway street. If your Chapter doesn't support other Chapters events, then they likely won't support yours when the time comes. When you and your staff have worked hard to put an event together, you'll want other Chapters to join in the fun. It (fund raising) isn't the primary reason to visit and support your fellow Chapters; the primary motivation is to show your members a great time have fun and keep the concept of the GWRRA "family" alive. Please give it some consideration when planning your future rides and events. (Insight March 2016)


