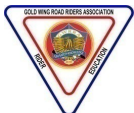

Hello all,

As everyone else is saying in their news articles, WOW! It is hot out there. Rides were cancelled by some chapters, but others had theirs.

I might as well throw in my two cents worth of advice when you plan to ride in the heat of the day.

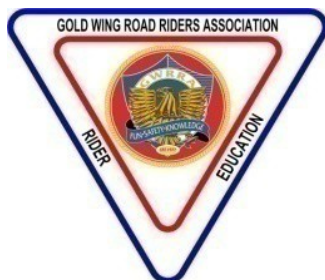
Remember to protect yourself not only by wearing garments that cover your skin but remember, your inside needs help as well.

Let's look at the outside of your bodies first. It is simple. Cover your skin. Exposed skin (usually our arms if we ATGATT) gets dried out from the sun and wind. When this occurs your body sends you a message that you need to attention to. For instance, if you become very thirsty -the first sign- you are already heading toward the dehydration path. You might feel nauseated or light-headed, maybe both. STOP! Drink a lot of water or sport drink and replace those electrolytes. Rest in the shade would be a good idea as well. Avoid ice tea (my favorite drink) as it is diuretic and will cause you to have to make pits stops more frequently. The more you go the better your chances are to become dehydrated. Alcohol drinks are out of the question.

What about the gear? Obviously, short sleeves are not what to wear. I recall when I was in the military and was assigned overseas, in the lovely desert; our orders were to NEVER roll up our sleeves. When I saw the natives there, everyone, no matter what they were doing work or play wise, were covered head to toe. That should tell us something. RIGHT???

It goes without saying (but I will anyway) that long sleeves are the thing to wear. Not long ago I read an article that said that mesh gear isn't good either, offering little protection from the wind, which as I said above, dries your skin.

If we choose to wear the correct gear it will help you retain the moister from your sweat. Obviously when we get hot we sweat and this is a step to staying cool. Wear a jacket that has vents that way you can effectively use your sweat to help cool you.



Of course there are many garments and devices to aid you in maintaining a cool body. Forget the fingerless gloves.

I'll end this discussion with a reminder: "If you aren't urinating on a regular basis, you need to drink more water or sports drink".

Your rider Ed Team will be meeting very soon to schedule our 2018 riding courses (Trike TRC-Two wheels BRC2-Two Wheeled Trailering TC and Trike Trailering TTRC).

We are offering the Trike Course R next year. That means if you have taken the Trike Course that has the class-room portion, you are eligible to enroll in the TRC-R which has no class room time.

We are still looking at having an Educational weekend before the end of the year. We are joining forces with Leadership Training to put on a fun one or one and half day for you. Some districts have their Safety weekend; we are having an Educational Retreat.

KSQ and KSP sponsored the life saving program Medic First Aid (MFA) this past month. If you would like to sponsor a class for your chapter, please contact me, not any of the instructors. I'll get it scheduled for you. Please remember that this program, MFA, is not just for people in the level program. IT IS FOR ANYONE THAT CARES ENOUGH ABOUT THEIR FAMILY AND FRIENDS TO LEARN OR REFRESH THEIR SKILL TO SAVE LIVES OR REDUCE INJURY.

I'll close now with my same old saying!

Hello everyone...

Is it just me or do some of you agree that parts of July were just way to hot...let's hope that August is a cooler month.

At our monthly chapter meeting on the 13th and we had a pretty good turn out



Do you notice the table decorations? Each month Michelle & Debbie work hard on those and they are different each time and they give them away at the end of the meeting. It's always fun to see what they come up with. (And sometimes they are filled with chocolate J)

Our chapter educator Bob wasn't able to be there for the meeting on the 13th so our fearless leader Joe handled the teaching moment. He talked about how much weight you can/should pack onto your bike. How many of you know what the capacities are of each storage pocket on your bike without looking in your owner's manual?

Here's the information for an 1800 Gold Wing...maximum weight = 417 lbs. This will include rider, passenger (if any), all cargo & accessories. Do you know the cargo capacity of your trunk, saddlebags...etc.? Here's that information. Total of all cargo: 71 lbs

- Travel Trunk: 20 lbs
- Each saddlebag: 20 lbs
- Each fairing pocket: 4.5 lbs
- Each tank side pocket: 1.0 lbs

For those of you that ride a trike here's a little information I've found.

Besides the cargo limits shown above since trikes don't have saddle bags and a large trunk has been added the cargo capacity is a little different and will depend on the make/model of trike conversion that you have.

- Max driver weight: 375 lbs
- Max combined with passenger: 500.00 lb
- Upper cargo bin: 20 lbs
- Lower cargo bin: 40 lbs
- Luggage rack: 10 lbs

I couldn't find a whole lot about pulling a trailer because the Goldwing owner's manual says that a Goldwing is not designed for pulling a trailer and their use can seriously impair your motorcycles' handling but I did find the following information

- Do not exceed 30 lbs. tongue weight (TW).
- Do not exceed 200 lbs. trailer weight (GTW).
- Load the trailer with 60 percent of the weight in front of the axle and evenly from side to side.

So on the 22nd those of you that were lucky enough to have gotten tickets to the NBC Tournament I understand it was very hot...like 107! Want to thank Ms Debbie for sending me a little bit of information and pictures

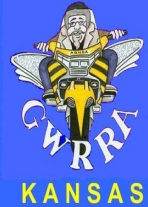

CHAPTER "B"

Whiteman Air Force Base initially had 150 Minuteman I Missiles. The first stop on the tour was a O-1 Missile Launch Silo that was no longer in service. The group traveled underground to the missile control center, a small room for two servicemen. The next stop was at the 442nd Mission Support Fighter Wing. A tour of the hanger found the group confronting an A-10 fighter jet. The "Warhog" is a single seated aircraft with 1200 pounds of titanium armor called the bathtub. The "Hog" was mainly used for low flying combat and to support ground troops. This fighter had the ability for short take-offs and landings on any type of landing strip. It was interesting to learn about all of its abilities.



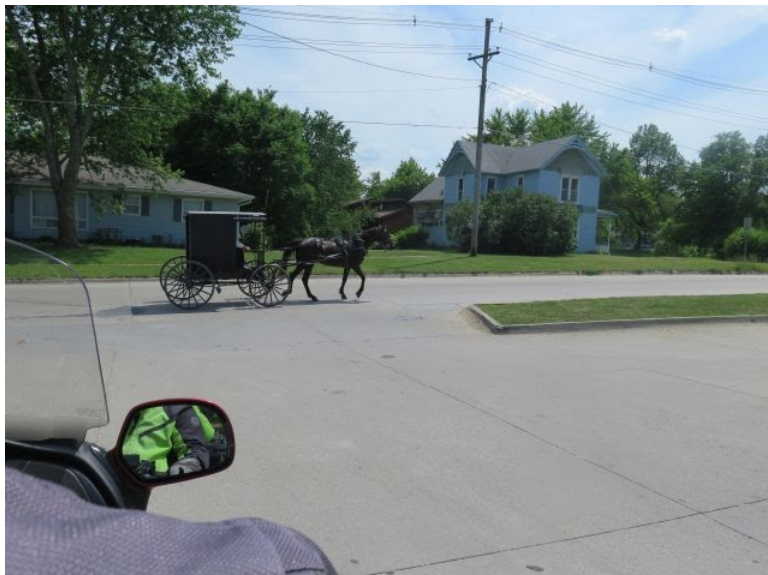

Members of Chapter B who attended were representatives of several armed services groups, including the Army, Air Force, Marines, and Navy. It was a hot, humid ride home, but nothing compared to what our servicemen and women deal with protecting our freedoms.

The July dinner ride was led by Bill Groh on July 6. Fourteen Chapter B members enjoyed dinner at Johnny's Barbecue in Olathe. It was a fun time with lots of good food.

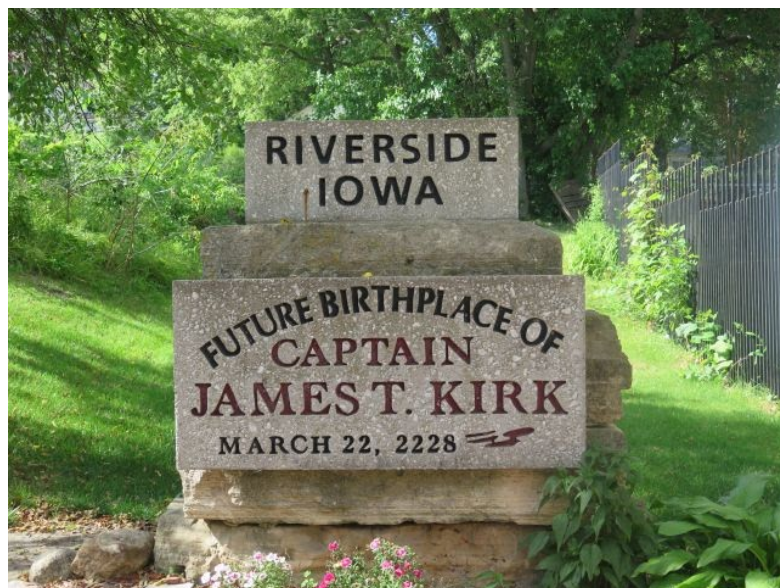
Steve Milam sent out word that the Vietnam Traveling Memorial Wall was in Paola during the middle of July. Several Chapter B members went to view it, look for names, and remember. It, like the one in Washington, D.C., lists the names of those lost in the war. It is a very moving experience to view it.

Allen and Lee Ann Robertson led an impromptu ride to Wayne and Larry's in Lawrence on July 19. Burgers and conversations were enjoyed and then the group headed off to the park for the final summer band concert. Unfortunately, due to the extreme heat, the concert was moved inside and the group headed off instead to Dairy Queen to cool off.

This year it was "Ride Around Iowa" for the sixth ride around journey. Iowa is the only state in the union that has rivers for its entire east and west borders, thus the group was "exploring the state between rivers". With twenty bikes and twenty six people it was a great trip around the state. The first day's mission was to ride to the southwest corner of Iowa near Hamburg and then east along the Honey War border to the Honey Creek Resort on Rathbun Lake, one of the largest lakes in Iowa. Sharing the road with some Amish buggies proved to be interesting and there was a beautiful sunset over the lake.



Day two found the group continuing along the border of the Des Moines River and heading southeast to the confluence of the Des Moines and the Mississippi Rivers. There was a stop along the way at the Dutchman's Store, a large Amish store in Cantril, Iowa. This store has just about anything you could possibly want including a place to sit, relax, and eat ice cream. It was then a turn to the north along the Great River Road toward Muscatine. It was a great scenic road on which to travel. A short side trip to Riverside, Iowa to locate the future birthplace of Cpt. James T. Kirk and then back on the road to Muscatine, the Pearl Button Capital of the World.



Continuing north along the Great River Road the group began day three. A stop at Antique Archaeology for a look around in Le Claire, Iowa and then more riding on the scenic Great River Road. In the afternoon, the group rode inland from Sabula to Anamosa to the National Motorcycle Museum. Many interesting barns with quilt block paintings were seen along the route. The museum had a great display of the history of motorcycling.



It was day four and the group was still traveling north on the Great River Road toward the northeast corner of the state. The first stop after lunch was at the Effigy Mounds National Monument. There were many hiking trails which some members of the group enjoyed. Then it was on to the northeast corner where two markers were found. A turn to the west took the group along the Minnesota border and more farmland.



The group continued west along the Minnesota border on the fifth day, heading toward the northwest corner of the state. There were miles and miles of cornfields, beautiful wildflowers, many red winged blackbirds, and even a sign warning of "Suicidal Deer". Fortunately, the deer were all feeling good that day and none crossed in front of the group. The tri-state marker was located in the northwest corner. It marks the boundaries of Iowa, Minnesota, and South Dakota. Then it was a turn to head south along the Big Sioux River. A trip inland to Le Mars to enjoy Blue Bunny Ice Cream for dessert rounded out the day.



Day six found the group headed toward home. The group traveled west to the Big Sioux River and then south to Sioux City where they left the border for a ride south along the Loess Hills Scenic Byway. The journey was completed when the group arrived back in Hamburg. I-29 brought the group back into Kansas and home. It was a wonderful journey of new and old friends, learning, and exploring. Rumor has it next year might be Wisconsin.




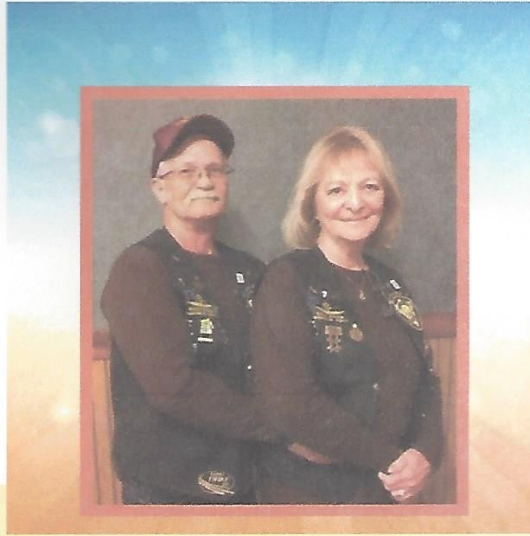

Hello Chapter H Family!

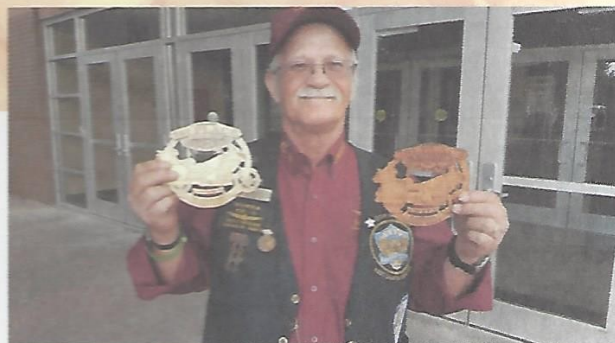

No matter how tough you think you are, no matter how experienced a rider, no matter how good your physical condition is, if you don't respect this summer heat, it will take you out before you know what hit you. Here are some tips for surviving a ride in extreme heat:

➤ **Pay attention to signs of Heat Exhaustion and Heat Stroke.**

Your body will start sending signals when it's having trouble with the heat, such as cramps, nausea, headaches, extreme fatigue, flushed or pale skin, dizziness, and heavy sweating. Ignore these signs and you can develop heat exhaustion, which is a form of mild shock. If you feel any of these symptoms, **PULL OVER, REHYDRATE, REST AND RECOVER FOR AS LONG AS IT TAKES!** Don't be in a rush to get back on the bike – I know you don't want to inconvenience their friends by holding things up, but how long do you think a trip to the hospital will hold up the ride?

If Heat Exhaustion symptoms are ignored, my friend you are headed into a Heat Stroke. Your cooling system will shut down and body temperature can rise to as high as 105°. Brain damage is possible and, at the very least, you will experience an erratic pulse and trouble breathing. Also, people having a Heat Stroke can often pass out – not something you want to happen when you're riding.

➤ **Bring more water than you think you'll need**

➤ **Dress properly and keep your skin covered.** Any areas of skin that are exposed will be much harder to cool as the sweat will evaporate from the air rushing over it at speed. This means you dehydrate faster. The people affected most by the heat are those who don't cover themselves properly.

➤ **Wear a cooling vest.** When temperatures rise over 90 degrees, a cooling vest is well worth the price. This is a much better solution than soaking a t-shirt, as cotton doesn't retain the water and it evaporates quickly. A cooling vest is soaked in water and worn under your riding jacket. The moisture forms a cooling layer next to your skin, and you feel much more comfortable.

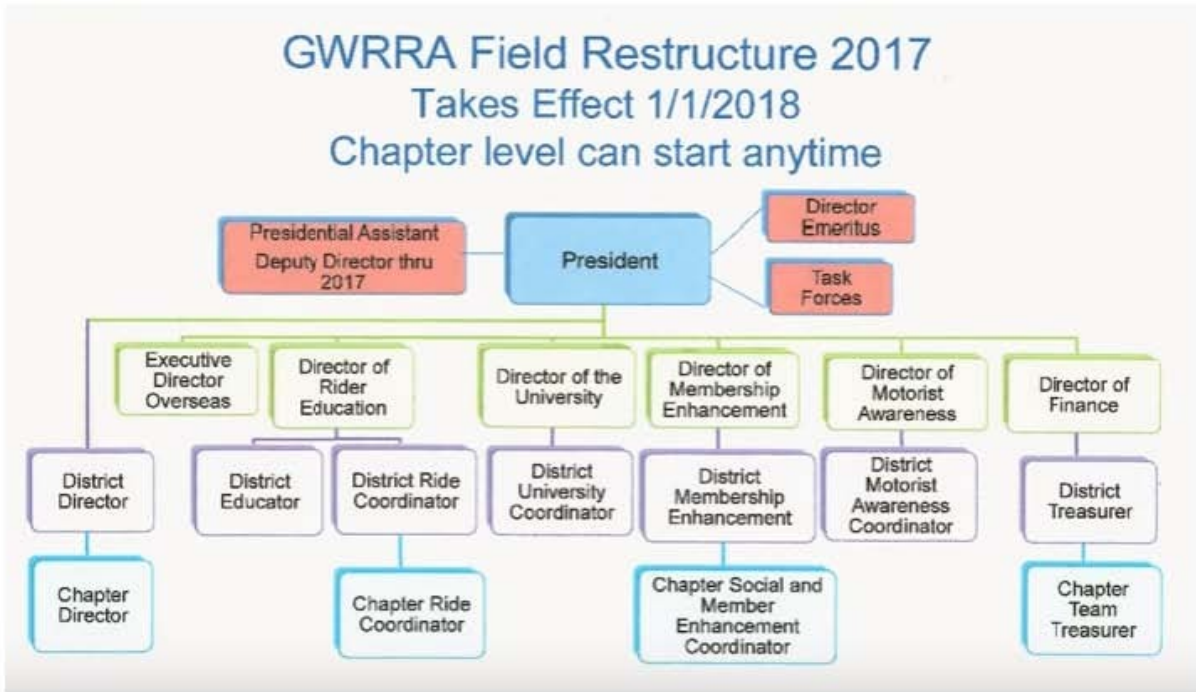
