


A Message from your District Directors

June 8th is the Two Wheel Trailering Course (TC)



The other day someone asked me what I was saying with my "PRACTICE MAKES PERMENANT! YOU ARE WHAT YOU PRACTICE!" Simply this. When you keep doing the same thing every time it will probably be permanent. Example: If you practice and ride using only your rear brake (which is NOT a good idea) then in an emergency you will use only the rear brake. Using only one brake increases your stopping distance. BAM! You hit the object. Using both breaks, WOW, you stopped in time. So you are what you practice, good or bad. Another saying I've used that I got from a PGA Professional Martin Hall: "If you keep on doing what you are doing, you will keep on getting what you are getting." It means the same thing.

Hope to see you on a ride , chapter event and an educational training opportunity soon.




After lunch we then rode about ½ hours to Aline, Oklahoma. There is an original sod house there. They have built a morton building over it and included a museum inside.

Chapter B members didn't enjoy the hot July temperatures in northeast Kansas. But, that didn't stop them from getting out to ride. Allen Robertson led a group to Paola on July 5 for the monthly dinner ride. Twenty-five enjoyed dinner at Beethoven's #9. This restaurant serves great German food and extremely large pieces of delicious desserts. It was a fun night for all.

Fifteen Chapter B members had a wonderful day on July 21 at the Porches and Peaches Festival in Lexington, Missouri. Joe Magnant contributed the following information about the trip.

The day started with food at Rae's Café in Blue Springs. No one left hungry as the food was very good and plentiful. Everyone was given a complimentary cinnamon roll as a first-time visitor.

Upon arrival in Lexington, tickets were purchased, and maps received. Five houses were featured on the tour where the current owners greeted everyone with hospitality and a story about their house. Three of the homes were pre-civil war era. The history shared and the civic pride for the community was shown through the stories and sharing. After three houses it was time for ice cream at Big Muddy Ice Cream Parlor. Peach was the flavor of the day and a great cone was available for only one dollar.





The final two houses had a lot of history associated with them. The Nitcher House, built in 1850, was the former residence of Ike Skelton and the Anderson House, located in a state park was involved heavily in the Battle of Lexington in 1861.

The day wrapped up with a trip to a local vendor for peaches. Even though Mother Nature wasn't kind to the peach orchards, some fruit was available. It was a great day of history and friendships. As promised last month, information about the Ride Around Wisconsin follows. Thank you to John English for providing the following.

In mid-June about a dozen Chapter B members joined with another two dozen plus riders, including former Chapter B members now residing in Iowa and Virginia, for an eight-day trip around Wisconsin. We left the Saturday morning before Father's Day from the northeast edge of Kansas City rolling about four hundred miles to Dubuque, Iowa on the Wisconsin border. The following day we crossed the Mississippi and started north along the west side of Wisconsin. On the way we passed several tractors headed into a little town. In town there were tractors everywhere, including several getting fuel at the station where we stopped. We discovered that in this town, dads bring



their tractors to town on Father's Day, sometimes with the whole family along. Lunch was also interesting as the restaurant was located downtown next to the river. That would seem nice, except for the fact that a carnival was also set up in the same area and almost all the streets were blocked. Eventually, all twenty-seven bikes found their way through the alleys to get to the restaurant. We continued up the river, stopping for the fantastic view from the highest bluff along the way.

Monday came with its own challenges. There had been significant rain in northern Wisconsin that impacted much of the route. One of the roads was so bad, one rider thought he had gotten off the route and was following dirt bike tracks. The group split up at lunch time due to the closed roads. Some of the group ended up at the planned restaurant and were able to see the SS Meteor Whaleback Ship Museum. A new route was planned to the hotel after everyone got back together. Tuesday was a nice ride on back roads through the woods of northeastern Wisconsin to Green Bay where some of the group toured the Packers Hall of Fame and everyone dined at Lambeau Field. Green Bay is starting its 100^{th} year of pro football.

Wednesday we headed up the east side of Green Bay to Door County. We filled a ferry with motorcycles and went through "Death's Door" to Washington Island for lunch at a restaurant that opened just for us. Two more Chapter B members joined us on the island. We filled the ferry again after a short ride around the island and returned along the coast of Lake Michigan to Sturgeon Bay where we enjoyed a local dining tradition known as a fish boil.





Thursday we traveled south along the coast to Milwaukee, parked the bikes in front of the art museum, and walked across a pedestrian bridge for a great view of an animated art work atop the museum. Some went to the Harley Museum and met Willie G. Davidson, some went to the River Walk, and some spent the day researching little known cheese facts while at a cheese factory. Dubuque and southwest to the Amana Colonies where some stocked their wine cellars and others bought yard art. Saturday, we left the Colonies in several groups and headed home.

A little heat and a little rain, but overall a great ride with nice scenery, outstanding meals and lodging, friendly people, and interesting sites. Mostly though it was a great week riding and spending time with old and new friends. As Bob Beck said, "This is why we own a touring motorcycle."


